Enrolment is an important process, which confirms your status as a Cardiff Met student. You can complete the online self-enrolment process from any computer through our 'Self-Service System'.

You will receive an email to inform you when you are eligible to enrol. The email will include details on how to complete the enrolment process. You will be able to use the username and password created when making your original application to log in and complete your enrolment.

If you have not received an email two weeks before the start of your programme, please contact Admissions so that your enrolment can be undertaken before you arrive at the University. During the online enrolment process, you will be asked for confirmation of certain details and to choose your modules. If the information detailed is not correct, please inform the Enrolment Team.

The enrolment process is essential, as it will allow you access to Cardiff Met IT systems, pay fees and, importantly, enable you to obtain your Student MetCard.

Tuition Fees & Funding

Fees & Finance

As a postgraduate, research or part-time student, the tuition fees you are charged will depend on the programme you choose to study. Certain programmes will also incur costs in addition to the programme fee.

Postgraduate Loans

From the 2017/18 academic year, the Welsh Government will be offering a Postgraduate Loan (PGL) of up to £10,280 for students who ordinarily reside in Wales and wish to study at Master's level.

Postgraduate Scholarship

The Cardiff Met Postgraduate Scholarship is an award for Home or EU students who have gained a First Class Honours degree and who are progressing on to postgraduate study. The award will provide a contribution of £3,000 towards your tuition fees. There are a limited number of awards available.

Alumni Discount Award

The Cardiff Metropolitan University Alumni Discount is a 20% reduction in tuition fees for Cardiff Met Alumni enrolling on taught postgraduate programmes starting in 2017. Eligibility and exclusions apply.

Cardiff Life

By now, you've probably got an idea of what Cardiff has to offer, but here's a small reminder of why our city is a place you'll be happy to call home for the next few years. Cardiff has all the advantages of a capital city: cultural attractions, a vibrant nightlife. a range of bars and restaurants within a compact and easy to navigate city centre. When it comes to food. Cardiff has made great strides in the last 18 months; luring big names like Five Guys, Wahaca and Shake Shack, but if big name chains aren't your thing, the independent restaurants and takeaways in the student areas of Roath and Canton can cater to anything from a fiendish falafel craving to a deep desire for duck pancakes.

A so called 'street-food revolution' in the city has also seen a variety of independent food traders popping up in quirky venues like The DEPOT; a 24,000 square-foot derelict warehouse that has been transformed in to a mecca for craft beer and casual dining. Cardiff is renowned for hosting sporting events. Get caught up in the crowds at the Principality Stadium - a 73,000 seater stadium located right in the city centre, watch a cricket match at SSE SWALEC or go and see a football match at Cardiff City stadium.

Music lovers will find a venue to suit every taste here, from intimate indie gigs at Clwb Ifor Bach or Gwdihw to big name tours at The Motorpoint Arena or The Principality Stadium. Cardiff is a popular shopping destination and offers a balance between high street chain stores in the recently redeveloped St David's shopping centre and independent boutiques found in the Victorian arcades that criss-cross the city centre.

There is no shortage of places to explore and things to do in Cardiff and we're sure you'll have a fantastic time during the next few years with us in the Welsh capital.
