Why choose postgraduate study?

The benefits to you

An investment in your future

Postgraduate study can bring rewards that last a lifetime. Salaries for postgraduates are nearly £47,000 a year on average compared with around £38,000 for graduates. Over a 40-year working life, master's degree holders can expect to earn £200,000 more than those with a bachelor's degree¹.

Enhanced career prospects

A postgraduate course can help you upskill if you require specific qualifications or retrain if you wish to enter a different sector. In a competitive workplace, it can give you the edge – 86% of UK postgraduates found employment within six months of their studies in 2013/14 compared to 74% of undergraduates and 91% were in professional or managerial jobs in contrast with 65% of graduates².

Personal and professional development

Postgraduate study will expand your skills and knowledge in your chosen subject area, and activities such as presenting or group projects will build your confidence and equip you with transferable skills. Studies have found that positive postgraduate qualities include: excellent communication skills; a high degree of drive and resilience; an ability to work with teams, negotiate, influence and form professional networks; the capacity to solve problems intelligently, analyse and make sense of complex situations³.

Extensive financing options and support

Our postgraduate fees are competitively priced and vary depending on your chosen course and fee status. Coventry as a city ranks 7th in the UK for affordability⁴ and we provide a range of good quality campus accommodation to suit everyone's budget. Extensive financial support includes scholarships and full payment discounts. UK students can now borrow up to £10,000 financial support towards taught master's courses through the Government's new UK postgraduate loan scheme.

There's really never been a better time to start postgraduate study.

The value of postgraduates to employers

Professional qualifications are essential

There are a number of fields and professions where postgraduate qualifications accredited by recognised national bodies are a de facto requirement for senior level employment. Many of our full-time master's students will also be able to gain two additional Chartered Management Institute (CMI) qualifications and CMI membership as part of their course.

Vital for innovation and growth

A 'globalisation of high skills' has intensified commercial competition making companies dependent on intellectual and technological advances to give them competitive advantage in a knowledge-led economy. Postgraduate skills have been described as 'one of the most powerful levers for improving productivity' and 'critical to a high-skills, high-performance economy'¹. Postgraduates are considered 'major drivers of innovation and growth'².

Combat industrial skills shortages

Employers find it difficult to recruit postgraduates with the specific skills they need. Major companies, such as GlaxoSmithKline and Rolls-Royce, have identified skills shortages affecting their own firms and members of their supply chain in a variety of sectors.

Protect against academic skills shortages

Research has revealed skills shortages in a number of academic disciplines, such as engineering, some physical science subjects, agricultural and soil sciences, in-vivo skills, economics, modern languages and quantitative methods within several subjects³.

Why choose Coventry University?

A global, ambitious university

A modern university for a contemporary world

Forward-looking, pioneering and ambitious, Coventry University has been ranked Modern University of the Year an unprecedented three times in a row in 2014, 2015 and 2016 by The Times and Sunday Times Good University Guide. Our performance was judged better than the rest when assessed against criteria including: student satisfaction, teaching excellence, peer assessment, research quality, level of qualifications on entry, destinations of leavers and completion rates.

High-quality teaching

We are officially recognised as one of the UK's leading universities, and were ranked 15th in the Guardian University Guide 2017.

World-class research

The UK's benchmark for research, the Research Excellence Framework 2014, awarded 61% of our research the highest classifications possible -4^* and 3^* – deeming our research to be 'world leading' or 'internationally excellent'. To enhance our research further, we are investing a further £150m to support continued research excellence.

Outstanding student support

As University of the Year for Student Experience¹, student satisfaction is a top priority. In 2015, we became one of a handful of universities to receive the Queen's Award for Enterprise, in recognition of our support for and growth in international students. A strong postgraduate culture includes dedicated study spaces like our Postgraduate Reading Room, our unique extra-curricular Global Leaders Programme and funding opportunities for students who are thinking of starting a business themselves. Many of our students have the opportunity to gain two additional Chartered Management Institute (CMI) qualifications and membership of this internationally recognised professional body.

State-of-the-art facilities

We have invested £150m in our city-centre campus and facilities. Completed projects include a new £55m home for the Faculty of Engineering, Environment and Computing. Our award-winning £19m The**Hub** is home to the Students' Union, Square One 3D cinema/bar and a one-stop for student support, including careers and employability, counselling and a doctors' surgery. In 2017, a new £37m Science and Health building will open for undergraduate and postgraduate study.

Coventry: at the heart of England

A thriving, modern city

Situated just one hour from London and 20 minutes from Birmingham by train, Coventry is a lively, multicultural city. Voted the second best UK city for young adults¹, multi-million pound investments have transformed the city. Future developments include a £59m central business quarter and £300m city-centre improvement scheme incorporating shops, a cinema, hotel and apartments².

One of the top 40 student cities in the world

Coventry has been voted among the world's top 40 cities for students, ahead of the likes of Chicago, Los Angeles, Stockholm and Lisbon. One of only eight UK cities to feature in the QS Best Student Cities list, Coventry's long history of leadership in manufacturing and design, together with the array of theatres, art galleries, sports and music venues helped secure 39th place overall. The city was ranked 35th in the world in the critical employer activity category³.

History of innovation

Coventry has been driving innovation and product development for centuries, with pioneering discoveries and inventions. From the world's first bicycle production line to the creation of the first British motor car and the development of the modern aircraft engine, Coventry was and still is at the forefront of new product development, research and discovery². The first tank, first traffic indicators for cars and first dumper truck were built in Coventry⁴.

Tourist hotspot

With its magnificent cathedral, internationally acclaimed Transport Museum and award-winning Ricoh Arena, host to the biggest names in music, Coventry attracts tens of thousands of visitors each year. A stone's throw from Shakespeare's Stratford-upon-Avon, historic Warwick Castle and picturesque Royal Learnington Spa, the city is a perfect fusion of old and new. Visitors can enjoy the medieval charm of Spon Street or the architectural innovation of Millennium Place.

Study options

Postgraduate study

Postgraduate qualifications can be achieved through teaching or research with varying entry requirements, methods and length of study; some are specifically designed to suit busy lifestyles with flexible learning through distance, blended or work-based learning. We offer over 130 taught courses across our Coventry and London campuses, as well as two types of postgraduate research degree (master's by research and PhD). We also offer extensive financing options, as well as a number of bursaries, scholarships and fully-funded PhD studentships. Our wide range of courses is continually developing in response to the needs of society, government or business.

Certificate (PgCert) and Diploma (PgDip)

You can choose to complete a postgraduate certificate or diploma as a standalone award. Often vocational courses of study, these courses are structured in a similar way to master's courses and are typically six to nine months in length. Usually assessed by exams and coursework, a dissertation is not required.

Master's degree

Master's degrees are usually intensive taught courses with a dissertation or project. Full-time study is typically run over one full year, for example, from September through to September, whereas part-time study is typically two years. In most cases, you can exit at postgraduate certificate or diploma level without carrying on to the full master's qualification. We offer: Master of Arts (MA), Master of Business Administration (MBA), Master of Laws (LLM) and Master of Science (MSc).

Master's by research

Studying for a master's degree by research (MAR/MScR) offers the opportunity to pursue an independent research project while benefiting from the support of expert supervision. Typically taking one year full-time or two to three years part-time, you will develop an understanding of research study, linking your research project directly to your current or future career interests, obtaining a taste of what it might be like to go on to do a full PhD.

PhD (Doctor of Philosophy)

Doctoral awards involve conducting original research independently that makes a significant contribution to the knowledge of a specific subject. This intensive study requires a substantial time commitment, usually three to four years full-time or five to six years part-time.

You will attend research training sessions, receive guidance from a designated academic team and produce a supervised thesis (80,000-100,000 words), suitable for publication. On successful completion, you will be awarded the title of PhD (Doctor of Philosophy), validating you as an expert in your chosen topic.

Chartered Management Institute (CMI) - Global Professional Development module

Coventry University is the only university to offer a postgraduate module developed in conjunction with the Chartered Management Institute (CMI). The Global Professional Development module is a unique opportunity available to Coventry University students on a number of our full-time master's courses.

We've partnered with the CMI to develop a module that uses a variety of techniques to give students practical leadership skills to develop solutions to the complex issues that they will experience in organisations. Students who successfully complete the module will gain two additional qualifications: a CMI Postgraduate Certificate in Strategic Leadership and Management and a CMI Award in Professional Consulting.

Students will also gain CMI student membership including access to LeadershipDirect, a dedicated online multimedia knowledge base, with thousands of publications available to support and enrich your studies; Career Development Centre, a comprehensive online portal allowing you to develop your interview skills, polish your CV and start approaching employers; and an online mentoring service where you can connect and learn from other leaders.

High-quality learning

Students from all over the world choose Coventry University as the place to gain an excellent education and prepare for a successful future as global citizens and enterprising professionals.

Academic staff includes:

John Devane Head of Design and Visual Arts

After studying at the Royal College of Art, John worked as a 'war artist' commissioned by the Imperial War Museum, joining Coventry University in 2005. He has exhibited widely in the UK and abroad, including the National Portrait Gallery. His works feature in a number of public and private collections, including the Unilever Collection, Ocean Transport and Trade PLC, The Imperial War Museum, and British Council collections in Oviedo and Las Palmas. John was shortlisted for the Garrick Milne Prize for Theatrical Portraiture in 2005 and the BP Portrait Award in 2013.

Professor Gary Hall Professor of Media and Performing Arts

Gary is author of Culture in Bits (Continuum, 2002) and Digitize This Book!: The Politics of New Media, or Why We Need Open Access Now (Minnesota UP, 2008), and co-editor of New Cultural Studies: Adventures in Theory (Edinburgh UP, 2006), and Experimenting: Essays with Samuel Weber (Fordham UP, 2007). He has over 30 peer-reviewed publications in edited books and academic journals, including American Literature, Angelaki, Cultural Studies, The Oxford Literary Review, Parallax and Radical Philosophy. He has recently completed a new monograph, Pirate Philosophy: For a Digital Posthumanities, for MIT Press. In 1999 he co-founded the open access journal Culture Machine, which was an early champion of open access in the humanities. In 2006 he co-founded Open Humanities Press, the first open access press dedicated to contemporary critical and cultural theory, which currently has 17 journals in its collective.

Professor Sheena Gardner Professor of Applied Linguistics

Sheena's research investigates the nature and use of English in educational contexts, with specific focus on classroom interaction and academic writing, from a broadly systemic functional perspective. Her research on the discourse of classroom-based assessment in multilingual primary schools with Pauline Rea-Dickins is evident in papers since 1999. Her research with Hilary Nesi since 2004 has involved the development of the BAWE corpus of student writing and a new classification of genres of student writing in higher education. Findings from this work have informed the development of online writing materials. She is co-author of Genres Across the Disciplines: Student Writing in Higher Education with Nesi (Cambridge 2012) and co-editor of Multilingualism, Discourse and Ethnography with M. Martin-Jones (Routledge 2012).



Faculty of Business and Law

The Faculty of Business and Law provides a dynamic, innovative and enterprising educational experience for students focused on subjects in business, economics, finance, accounting, marketing, management and law. It has excellent links to major national and international organisations and close partnerships with universities around the world.

The Faculty comprises four specialist Schools:

- School of Economics, Finance and Accounting
- School of Law
- School of Marketing and Management
- School of Strategy and Leadership

As a member of the Association for Events Management Education (AEME), all of our courses provide the opportunity to undertake overseas field trips and we have a dedicated Faculty Employment support team to provide help and advice about employment and opportunities for internships. In 2014, we won a Small Business Charter Award for our part in a Government initiative which helped 4,700 students to find work placements in the UK's micro-business and start-up sector.

We are proud of our modern, newly refurbished facilities, which include a Moot Room, where law students practise advocacy skills in a realistic setting, and a state-of-the-art Trading Floor – the largest facility of its kind in Europe – equipped with the best analytical news and data platforms, including Bloomberg, Reuters, Datastream and Bankscope.

Coventry Law School has built strong relationships with local firms, who support us by offering placements, sponsoring our mooting and negotiation competitions.

Coventry Business School, which incorporates the other three Schools, is one of the largest Business Schools in Europe and one of the largest centres for Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development (CIPD) training in the UK. Rated as 'excellent' by Eduniversal, we are dedicated to providing a top class education. The Business School is an active member of the European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD) and Chartered Association of Business Schools (CABS), as well as being a signatory to the United Nations Principles for Responsible Management Education (UN PRME) initiative. Coventry University has joined forces with the Chartered Institute of Marketing (CIM) to give students the opportunity to gain professional qualifications through CIM Graduate Gateway.

Professor Marylyn Carrigan Professor of Marketing in the Centre for Business in Society (CBiS)

Marylyn's research interests are consumer ethics, corporate social responsibility (CSR), social marketing, and the relationships between businesses and their key stakeholders. Having published over 100 journal articles and conference papers, she serves on the Editorial Advisory Boards for The International Marketing Review, Journal of Marketing Management, Journal of Social Marketing, and the Journal of Marketing Communications. She is a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy.

Professor Lyndon Simkin Professor of Strategic Marketing and Executive Director of the Centre for Business in Society

Lyndon is an acknowledged expert in strategy creation, planning processes and implementation management. In a career spanning over 20 years, with Warwick Business School, Oxford Brookes, Henley Business School and now Coventry, he has provided guidance and mentoring to CEOs and leadership teams. A member of the Academy of Marketing's Research Committee, Associate Editor of the Journal of Marketing Management and co-chair of the Academy's special interest groups in CRM and Market Segmentation and Strategy, Lyndon is author of 11 books (many market leaders) and has just published 'The Dark Side of CRM'.

Professor Stuart Weinstein Professor of Practice Informed Legal Education

An expert on international business law with an emphasis on legal risk management, governance and compliance, Stuart advises financial institutions and related entities on compliance in a banking operations environment that is increasingly characterised by complex multi-jurisdictional regulatory scrutiny. He undertakes research in Internet and cyber-security law and serves as vice-chair of the Bar Standards Board, Education and Training Committee. In addition to being a lawyer admitted to practice in California, District of Columbia and New York, Stuart is a solicitor in England and Wales.



Faculty of Engineering, Environment and Computing

The Faculty of Engineering, Environment and Computing is internationally recognised for its portfolio of first-class education and research in the areas of mathematics, engineering, geography, computing, building, aerospace and automotive. Situated in the birthplace of the British motor industry and the historical heart of UK manufacturing, we have a strong tradition of business-focused education and research, working with some of the biggest names in industry, including Jaguar Land Rover, GE Aviation, Cummins and Intel.

The Faculty comprises three specialist Schools:

- School of Computing, Electronics and Maths
- School of Energy, Construction and Environment
- School of Mechanical, Aerospace and Automotive Engineering

Excellent, innovative teaching is underpinned by one of the UK's best student to staff ratios, currently about 15:1, and valuable contact time with students. Tutorial groups are kept small so that you benefit from personalised and directed teaching. Our students engage in activity-led learning, where they apply theory practically through problem scenarios, case studies and projects tackling real-world challenges, which wherever possible are sourced from industry. We encourage work experience and our award-winning Employability and Placement team, EC Futures, supports postgraduate students in securing placement opportunities, as well as organising employer careers fairs and mock assessment centres. The EC Futures team won Best University Placement Service in the 2015 and 2016 National Undergraduate Employability Awards.

Our landmark £55m Engineering and Computing building is home to state-of-the-art facilities, from a wind tunnel designed and supplied by the Mercedes AMG Petronas Formula One team to flight simulators, an environmental chamber and a Harrier T4 V/STOL aircraft. The building is highly sustainable, using a range of technologies, including rainwater harvesting, solar thermal energy and biomass boilers.

As part of a £32m collaboration with Unipart Group and part-funded by the Government, we have recently launched the Institute for Advanced Manufacturing and Engineering (AME), an international centre of engineering and manufacturing excellence. The new 1,700 square metre building creates the UK's first 'faculty on the factory floor' where students apply theory working with engineers on live projects on the Unipart shop floor. The Institute is intended to provide a pipeline of skilled engineering graduates and accelerate next generation powertrain-related technologies for automotive, aerospace, oil and gas, rail, and renewables.

While we excel in finding technologically innovative solutions to commercial problems, we also aim to solve problems for communities that need help. Our latest area of focus is humanitarian engineering. In partnership with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), we encourage students to undertake projects using their leadership skills and expertise in engineering to improve the circumstances of people in the UK and around the world.

Academic staff includes:

Professor Michael Fitzpatrick Pro Vice-Chancellor (Executive Dean) and Lloyd's Register Foundation Chair in Structural Integrity and Systems Performance

Michael's research centres around the application of advanced experimental methods to materials engineering applications, particularly in the nuclear power and aerospace industries. His research group assesses materials performance and structural integrity issues in collaboration with partners in industry and government-led research laboratories around the world, including Airbus, Alcoa, and the US Air Force Research Laboratories. A partner in the International Joint Research Centre on Nuclear Safety funded by the Lloyd's Register Foundation, he has published over 190 research papers and has successfully supervised 30 PhD students to completion. He was the recipient of the Lidstone Medal of The Welding Institute in 2009.

Professor Elena Gaura Professor of Pervasive Computing

Elena received her PhD in Intelligent Sensor Systems in 2000 from Coventry University and was awarded a Professorship in Pervasive Computing in 2009. Considered an innovator in the area of Wireless Sensor Networks and the Internet of Things, she is actively involved with the European Commission and regional government organisations to promote knowledge transfer, particularly focusing on the use of sensing technologies for improving people's lives and towards the adoption of wireless technologies for fulfilling the UK's carbon footprint reduction targets in transportation and the built environment. Her work has a strong industrial pull and is sponsored by the British Council, the EPSRC, European Commission, Innovate UK and directly by industry.



Faculty of Health and Life Sciences

Coventry University is proud to be one of the largest providers of health and life sciences courses in the UK, with over 6,000 students and 400 staff dedicated to advancing the health and resilience of local, national and international communities.

Our academic postgraduate taught and research courses and doctoral routes are complemented by our strong post-qualifying Continuing Professional Development portfolio and vast range of professional accreditations and partnerships with professional bodies and employers.

The Faculty comprises three specialist Schools:

- School of Life Sciences
- School of Nursing, Midwifery and Health
- School of Psychological, Social and Behavioural Sciences

Innovative approaches

Our approach to teaching, learning and assessment is focused on encouraging our students to explore, challenge and investigate the world around them, using innovative approaches such as podcasting, interactive online discussion, lecture video capture and the use of mobile technologies. In many cases we involve service users, patients and industry professionals so that the student experience is fully immersive and inspiring.

Outstanding facilities and equipment

We have recently invested in a new £62m Science and Health building, a world-class health and life sciences environment that delivers an exceptional student experience. Facilities include scientific and clinical laboratories; sport, exercise and rehabilitation equipment; a mock operating theatre and hospital wards; and a crime scene room for the forensic investigation of criminal evidence, complete with fingerprinting equipment.

Research with impact

The Faculty of Health and Life Sciences is nationally and internationally recognised for its research and teaching is heavily informed and influenced by our research across life, behavioural, social and health sciences. Our aim is to provide high-quality applied research and training that informs real-world issues, and influences policy, industry and individuals. Three dedicated research centres support over 100 PhD students to investigate a wide range of fields including:

- Psychological and behaviour interventions
- Biological systems
- Sports and exercise
- Management of health

Academic staff includes:

Professor Jane Coad Professor in Children and Family Nursing

With a strong background in both art and nursing, Jane's research is focused on children and families that have long-term, complex and palliative care needs within acute, community and public health settings, both in the UK and abroad in countries including Ireland, USA and Sri Lanka. She undertakes a number of innovative e-technology surveys, evaluations and qualitative art-based participatory research, including handling large data sets, with children, young people and families. She was awarded a Royal College of Nursing Fellowship in 2013 for lifetime research and is leading the Health Education England/National Institute of Health Research Master's by Research (MReS) course within the Faculty. Coventry was one of only 10 UK universities and the only major provider in the West Midlands to receive funding for the MReS studentships.

Professor Helen Maddock Principal Lecturer in Cardiovascular Physiology and Pharmacology

Building on research and development experience originally gained within the pharmaceutical industry (AstraZeneca and GlaxoSmithKline), Helen and her team, including taught master's students, work on projects involving the development of physiologically relevant non-clinical heart assays and the investigation and/or detection of drug-induced cardiac injury including current and novel oncology therapies. Through InoCardia Ltd, a University spin-out company she founded, Helen is implementing a groundbreaking and potentially lifesaving technique – using real human heart tissue – to test the effect of drugs on the heart without using human or animal trials.



High-impact research

Excellence with impact

Developing our portfolio of world-leading research is central to our ambition to break into the world's top 100 universities under 50 years old.

Research at Coventry University is grouped into five key themes: Safety and Security, Sustainability and Resilience, Health and Wellbeing, Intelligent Products and Processes and Creative Cultures.

The basis of our strategy is 'Research Excellence with Impact' where excellence is defined as a combination of originality, significance and rigour and impact is the natural development of our foundation work of applied research conducted with and for external beneficiaries.

Currently we have more than 750 researchers working in our 11 challenge-led interdisciplinary research centres representing niches where Coventry University can be dominant. In addition, we have a dedicated Enterprise and Innovation team which engages with our key partners to ensure that we maximise the impact of all our research.

Research students are central to the research mission at Coventry University. We have created a doctoral college to provide centralised research training and to deliver comprehensive (PhD to Professor) training for our research students and staff.

We are a globally connected university, with staff, students and collaborators from across the globe. We have cotutelle arrangements with a number of our partners which enable our research students to study in two countries.

In addition to external research funding, the University is committed to an investment into research of over £120m between 2014 and 2021 and we give as much priority to high-quality research as we give to high-quality teaching.

Our leading academics are known for delivering high-impact research, which makes a real difference to lives, tackling global challenges such as sustainability, disease prevention and innovative engineering. Viewed as one of the handful of 'business-facing' or 'business-engaged' modern universities, we were chosen to receive Government funding to create our £32m Institute for Advanced Manufacturing and Engineering. This international centre of engineering and manufacturing excellence, run in collaboration with Unipart Group, combines novel manufacturing engineering courses with an ambitious research and development course based on Unipart's technology roadmaps. Almost two-thirds (61%) of our research was judged to be 4* world-leading or 3* internationally excellent – the highest classifications possible – in the Research Excellence Framework 2014, which is the system for assessing the quality of research in UK higher education institutions. In fact, 92% of our research was rated as 4*, 3* or 2* and all nine subject areas submitted, referred to as units of assessment, incorporated elements of world-leading research.

World-class researchers

At Coventry University, we take pride in being at the forefront of emerging knowledge and are fortunate to have dozens of world-leading experts. We attract opinion setters and thought leaders from all over the world. This provides our postgraduate students with an exciting opportunity to study alongside them and participate in groundbreaking research projects. Here are the stories of four of our leading academics.

Professor Damian Lawler Professor of Hydrology, Centre for Agroecology, Water and Resilience

Damian has worked on complex and important fluvial and hydrological research questions in the UK, Ireland, France, Iceland, Azerbaijan, Georgia, USA and Australia. He developed the first automatic erosion monitoring system, the Photo-Electronic Erosion Pin (PEEP) system, He also devised the principle of Thermal Consonance Timing for improved erosion event definition in 2008, which is now built into the PEEP3T instrument, and used by over 30 research groups worldwide, including the US Geological Survey to address sedimentation problems in San Francisco Bay. He developed the DOCPROBE downstream change model for river bank erosion processes and the Combined Automated Flood, Elevation and Stream power (CAFES) model in 2009. Research, including 15 PhD completions, has been funded by the Environment Agency, the Centre for Ecology and Hydrology, research funding councils and international governments and organisations. This work has led to over 150 published papers.

Professor Andree Woodcock Professor of Educational Ergonomics and Design, Centre for Mobility and Transport

Andree has a background in psychology, social biology and ergonomics. Most of her research has involved applying user-centred design to problems in the areas of health, education, regeneration and transportation. Since joining Coventry University in 1999, she has been awarded grants in excess of £10m. These have included research on the design of polysensory school environments for children with autism spectrum disorder, and an analysis of the involvement of children in the redesign of schools (Building Schools for the Future course). Her transport-related research has included looking at the in-car safety and security of female car occupants, a stakeholder analysis of an electric bus, and leading a European Commission project to develop a tool to measure the quality of the passenger experience. She collaborated with City University London to develop the life-saving MyCare card, which stores personal medical data and plugs into a laptop's USB port, enabling the data to be accessed in just a few moments.

Professor Alpaslan Özerdem Professor of Peacebuilding, Centre for Trust, Peace and Social Relations

Alpaslan specialises in the politics of humanitarian interventions, reintegration of former combatants and post-conflict state building. He has 20 years, field research experience in conflict-affected environments, such as Afghanistan, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Kosovo, Lebanon, Liberia, Nigeria, Philippines, Sierra Leone, Sri Lanka and Turkey. He has also taken an active role in the initiation and management of several advisory and applied interdisciplinary research projects for a wide range of national and international organisations. In 2015, he was nominated by over 89,000 members of the Peace Corps of Nigeria to receive its International Peace Medal, one of Nigeria's foremost peace awards, in recognition of his lifetime achievements and outstanding leadership in the field of peacebuilding.

Professor Hazel Barrett Professor of Development Geography, Centre for Trust, Peace and Social Relations

Hazel is a human geographer; her main areas of research are the socioeconomic aspects of development, in particular gender, health and rural development, in Sub-Saharan Africa. Over the last decade her research has been directed at the social and economic aspects of the HIV/AIDS epidemic in Sub-Saharan Africa, as well as amongst migrant groups in the UK. More recently her research has focused on the traditional harmful practice of Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) in Africa and amongst the African diaspora in the EU. An internationally recognised expert on FGM, she was named as one of 1,000 most influential Londoners for her research in 2014. She has received research funding from the Department for International Development, ESRC and the European Commission's Daphne Programme, publishing books and chapters on health and development issues with over 40 refereed articles to her name. A former President of the Geographical Association (2013-14), she won the Association's 2008 Award for Excellence for her work on AIDS.

This is an exciting time to join the research community at Coventry University. We have a research vision which is focused on developing world-leading research centres and we are investing heavily to develop a research environment in which these centres can flourish. Our postgraduate researchers form an essential element of our research community. They contribute to society through innovative discoveries and new understandings, setting the research agenda of the future.

Our facilities

We are investing £430m in our facilities between 2016 and 2021 to ensure our students benefit from cutting-edge learning using state-of-the-art facilities within an innovative environment.

Coventry: a single-site campus

Our main campus in Coventry is located right in the city centre and students benefit from the convenience of having all of the University's facilities in one compact, single site. The**Hub** is also home to:

- The Health and Wellbeing Centre

This is where the Medical Centre is located if you need to see a doctor or if you have any health issues. You will also find welfare, disabilities, counselling and mental health services here too.

- The Spirituality and Faith Centre

The Spirituality and Faith Centre provides quiet spaces for reflection and meditation; a non-denominational chapel, Muslim prayer rooms with ablutions, and a spiritually focused social space for students and groups to meet. You can also arrange to talk to any of the University's multi-faith chaplains.

- The Tank Studio

A live HD audio/video production studio utilised by the School of Media and Performing Arts, within the Faculty of Arts and Humanities. The studio houses high-end broadcasting technology enabling the learning of industrial practices in a large open-plan environment. Students can learn about a variety of equipment including cameras, vision mixer, audio mixer and a realtime 3D graphics machine.

- Coventry University Postgraduates' Guild

The Postgraduates' Guild is part of CUSU (Coventry University Students' Union) which is a democratic organisation run by students for students. This was established to foster a vibrant and active postgraduate community at the University. All of our postgraduates are automatically a member of the Postgraduates' Guild and can benefit from everything it has to offer. The Students' Union understands that postgraduates' needs and interests are different to those of undergraduate students. As a postgraduate you can get involved in any of the opportunities CUSU has to offer but it also has events and activities just for postgraduates. For example there is a welcome event at each postgraduate intake to enable new students to meet and get to know other postgraduates. CUSU has over 1,000 course reps, 200 sports clubs and societies, and offers volunteering opportunities. It also has a free, confidential and independent advice centre which can advise you on a range of issues from finance, plagiarism, disciplinary and complaints to consumer law. The **Disruptive Media Learning Lab** is a new experimental unit that provides an open study space for staff and students. It is designed to promote open dialogue, collaborative work, exploration and experimentation, and will develop radically new approaches to teaching and learning.

City life in Coventry

Coventry has everything you would expect from a modern city and, because of the University's city-centre location, everything is within walking distance. From cinemas, theatres and art galleries, to an ice rink and tenpin bowling, you will never find yourself short of things to do. There's a bustling shopping centre and a traditional indoor market, and restaurants, cafés and bars to suit all tastes and cultures. The city's glorious 20th century cathedral, with stunning 1950s art and architecture, provides a unique backdrop to the University campus.

Entertainment and culture

Coventry's Ricoh Arena has played host to some of the biggest names in music, including Coldplay, Take That, Pink, Bon Jovi and Rihanna. Smaller music venues such as Kasbah and The Empire schedule regular gigs and club nights. The free Godiva Festival is the Midlands' biggest family music festival, while Coventry Jazz Festival has featured many international jazz stars.

In the city centre, the Belgrade Theatre and Herbert Art Gallery and Museum are leading venues for art, drama, dance and music. The Coventry Transport Museum has the world's largest collection of British road transport located in its birthplace, offering everything from 'bone shaking' cycles to land speed record cars.

Sporting life

The Ricoh Arena has played host to a range of major sporting events, including Rugby Union's Heineken Cup, the Champions of Champions snooker tournament and the Women's FA Cup Final. The Arena is home to Wasps, an Aviva Premiership Rugby Union team and Coventry City Football Club. It was also an official Olympic venue, hosting the London 2012 men's and women's football events.

The Butts Park Arena is home to Coventry Rugby Club who play in the National League, while at the nearby Brandon Stadium you can watch the world's top speedway riders and also regular greyhound racing. Coventry also has a successful ice hockey team, the Coventry Blaze. The city's open spaces make it good for running and the city's main running club, the Godiva Harriers, is one of the oldest in the world. Coventry is also one of the few cities in the UK that can boast an Olympic-size swimming pool, which is in the city centre, close to the campus.

The **Centre for Academic Writing** (CAW) offers master's and doctoral students individualised advice on all types of postgraduate-level writing, including essays, reports, master's dissertations, doctoral theses, and writing for publication. Its new Academic Writing Studio provides dedicated space and time for postgraduate writing sessions.

Throughout the year, the Centre offers workshop, sessions and one-to-one writing tutorials, which are offered face-to-face, by email or via Skype. Topics covered include how to organise academic arguments, how to improve your writing style, and how to use sources for a critique or literature review. Doctoral and MRes (Master of Research) students can enrol in CAW's postgraduate module 'Writing for Scholarly Publication', which features a four-day on-campus writing retreat.

Our nationally recognised, award-winning team for mathematics and statistics support, **sigma**, provides free, individual tuition to all Coventry students in the Maths and Stats Support Centre in the library on a drop-in basis, six days a week. Hour-long appointments can be booked online at **sigma.coventry.ac.uk**. These can be particularly valuable to postgraduate students collecting and analysing data for their projects. We recommend making an appointment early on in the project. Statistics tutors also run workshops and mini-courses in a variety of areas valuable to postgraduates.

Meet and greet services

For students flying into Birmingham Airport or London Heathrow, we offer a free Airport Meet and Greet service on selected dates and at set times during enrolment to transport you to Coventry city centre, though you will need to make your own arrangements for onward travel to your accommodation.

English language support

Entering a new study environment can be challenging, not only in terms of language, but also in adjusting to a new academic culture, which may be very different to what you are used to. Our Pre-sessional English courses will help prepare you in both of these areas, so that you can meet the demands of the academic course you wish to progress onto.

You will be taught by highly qualified and experienced tutors who understand the challenges and anxieties faced by international students. The length of your course will be determined by your current level of English and each component score for reading, writing, speaking and listening. To be successful in your degree, you must be able to demonstrate use of all four English language skills. You can use the table opposite to calculate the length of course you will need.

How much will it cost?

What financial support is available?

Postgraduate students have access to a range of financial support, including loans, flexible payment options, discounts and scholarships.

UK/EU postgraduate loan scheme

Government-backed student loans are available to support postgraduate study in England. Loans of up to $\pounds 10,280$ are available to anyone aged under 60.

Professional and career development loan (PCDL)

PCDLs are bank loans that can be used to pay for work-related learning. UK and EU students can borrow between £300 and £10,000 to help support the cost of up to two years of learning (or three years if it includes one year's relevant unpaid practical work).

Flexible payment scheme

The University's flexible payment scheme, which helps discount or spread the cost of course fees, is available to UK and EU students. Part-time students studying at least 25% of the full-time equivalent course per year may also benefit. There are three flexible payment options:

- Full payment scheme: If you are a full-time student and make full payment of your annual tuition fee at enrolment we will either deduct 5% from the amount of tuition fees due to be paid or provide a 5% refund for tuition fees already paid
- Two instalment scheme: Under this scheme you pay 50% of your annual tuition fee at enrolment and the final 50% in December of the same year. We charge no arrangement fee or interest for this facility providing the payments are made on time
- Eight instalment scheme: We take a variable deposit at enrolment. This is then followed by eight equal monthly instalments payable by direct debit or recurring debit card or credit card transactions starting in October and ending in May

Coventry University alumni discount

Students who have previously completed an undergraduate degree with the Coventry University Group and go on to enrol on a postgraduate taught course will automatically be awarded a $\pounds1,000$ discount.

You will also be eligible for the 5% full payment discount if you pay your course fees in full at enrolment.

UK sports scholarships

One of the best programmes of its kind in the country, our sports scholarships scheme awards scholarships competitively to approximately 30 students each year who have the sporting ability to represent the University at a high level. Applications are open to all students participating in a sport recognised by SportEngland. Sports scholarships are for one year and are worth either \pounds 3,000 (consisting of up to \pounds 1,500 cash and up to \pounds 1,500 worth of support) or \pounds 1,500 (consisting of \pounds 750 cash and \pounds 750 worth of support).

Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) is a current form of evidence-based psychological therapy recommended by NICE as a first line intervention for many psychological disorders.

This MSc in Cognitive Behavioural Therapy aims to increase students' knowledge base of theory and research in CBT, and to promote a critical approach to the subject. The course also provides practical, intensive and detailed skills training to facilitate skills development to a defined standard of competence. The course is a Level 2 course in CBT and as such "provides all the necessary training so that on graduation from Level 2 courses, individuals will have received the training required to fulfil BABCP's Minimum Training Standards".

The training aims to help students to achieve the level of theoretical knowledge, reflective abilities and clinical skills to work as psychological therapists, using evidence based cognitive behaviour therapy methods in their work.

The MA in Diplomacy, Law and Global Change is a longstanding course that critically examines aspects of the changing international environment, drawing on the insights afforded by the disciplines of International Relations, International Law, Politics and History.

One of the core issues presented by the international system as it has evolved over the last few hundred years is the establishment and maintenance of order and the reconciliation of this goal with that of the achievement of justice for the competing claims of groups, both territorial and non-territorial, and individuals operating within this system.

Both Diplomacy – understood as a major mode of communication and process for the peaceful resolution of conflict – and International Law – the creation and maintenance of legal norms and rules within International Relations – are central to these issues.

But, as indicated above, rapid change at both the domestic and international levels, often encapsulated in the term 'globalisation', is transforming the policy environment and, therefore, the context in which both diplomacy and International Law are constrained to operate. We are living through a period of rapid change and the study of these aspects of change is both fascinating and important.

Drawing on theories and practice from: political science, history, sociology, law, economics and cultural studies, International Relations (IR) remains distinct with its own theoretical skeleton and terms of reference.

Themes as varied as the evolution of the discipline, globalisation, international law, diplomacy, security, war and peace are investigated as part of the course. Content and structure are designed to enable newcomers to engage readily with the discipline, while offering those who already have a background in IR an opportunity to deepen their exploration of its scope and complexities.

The course has been designed to explore the changing nature of International Relations in the twenty-first century. It aims to provide students with an informed understanding of key threats to security across the globe, as well as an opportunity to reflect on how these threats have evolved and how these challenges can be combated.
