A global village

Southampton is a lively and cosmopolitan hub of culture, entertainment, nightlife and shopping. Just over an hour from London and a short distance from Bournemouth, Portsmouth and Winchester, it's easy to travel to Europe and beyond, either by ferry or from the city's airport.

Culture and entertainment

Solent's School of Art, Design and Fashion complements the Solent Showcase Gallery, which is at the centre of Southampton's impressive new cultural quarter. Just minutes from the main campus, the city has state-of-the-art auditoriums, studios, art galleries, restaurants, two major theatres and three cinemas. There's plenty going on all year round in this lively area, including numerous concerts, festivals, workshops, shows and events.

Nightlife and restaurants

The city has a great choice of restaurants. The Bedford Place area, popular with students, is a buzz of activity and offers a wide selection of boutiques, pubs, bars and restaurants.

Fantastic shops

Southampton has a great choice of shops. With the popular WestQuay and Marlands shopping centres and other city outlets, it's one of the top 20 retail destinations in the UK.

Green space on the doorstep

Southampton's many parks and 300-acre common make it one of the greenest cities in southern England. With city-centre parks right on the doorstep, Southampton Solent students have plenty of opportunities to relax, revise in the summer sun or have a kick-about with friends.

First port of call

The city has a strong maritime heritage. *The Mayflower* set sail from here for the New World in 1620. Medieval walls nestle among modern developments to create a unique waterfront environment. Southampton's port is renowned worldwide for its container ships and prestigious cruise liners, while the city's SeaCity Museum celebrates the importance of the sea to Southampton's past and present.



Economic hub

The city was the birthplace of the Hovercraft and fibre optics, and continues to be at the forefront of commercial innovation. Its diverse economy includes the head offices or regional centres of B&Q, Carnival, Old Mutual Wealth and Ordnance Survey. With more than 7,000 businesses operating here, there are plenty of career opportunities for Solent students and graduates.

Safety first

Southampton Solent has dedicated support teams who work closely with students to ensure that their time here is as safe and enjoyable as it can be. Along with the council's safer neighbourhoods team and Hampshire Police, community spirit, volunteering and personal safety are encouraged.

Sporting chance

Mad about sport? You can indulge your passion at a variety of spectacular sporting venues that play host to professional football, major sailing events, and county and test match cricket. The Ageas Bowl is home to Hampshire County Cricket Club, while successful Southampton Football Club plays at nearby St Mary's Stadium.

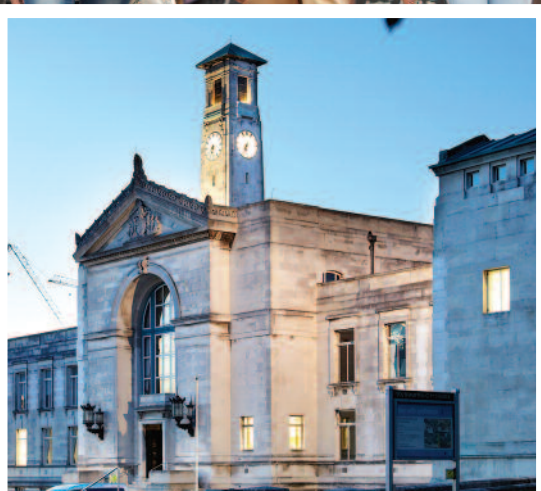
The big outdoors

When you want a change from city-centre life, it's only a short trip to the golden beaches of Bournemouth or the miles of stunning Hampshire coastline. The New Forest is close by and offers acres of open woodland to explore on foot, bike or horseback.



City facts

- Population of city – 236,900
Student population – around 42,000
- Only 75 miles and 75 minutes from London, Southampton is highly accessible by train, bus, ferry, road and air.
- The city centre occupies 350 hectares between the rivers Itchen and Test, with the major development quarter located on the west side of the centre.
- The city is one of the greenest in the country, with over 21 hectares of parkland in five historic central parks. Just over 20 per cent of the city is covered by council-managed green space.
- The region boasts around 75,000 businesses in sectors ranging from marine and tourism to engineering and finance, and is an area of major economic activity.
- With a turnover of £37 billion per year and employing more than a quarter of a million people, the UK has the largest marine sector in Europe. Nearly half that sector lies within the south east of England, with significant clusters around the Solent.
- The Port of Southampton is one of the country's busiest and most successful deep-water ports, with facilities to handle virtually any type of cargo. Known as the 'cruise capital of northern Europe', Southampton is home to the UK fleets of P&O Cruises and Cunard Line. The cruise industry is worth more than £350 million a year to the local economy.
- Following on from the development of Southampton's cultural quarter in the city centre, a new development, Watermark WestQuay, will include flagship restaurants, a luxury cinema, shops and a landscaped plaza set against the city's historic medieval walls.
- Over 15,000 rail passengers use Southampton Central Station each day, and the University is only a ten-minute walk away.
- Southampton is a leader in sustainability, with an award-winning district energy scheme serving over 30 of the largest energy users in the city centre and saving over 11,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions every year.





Thinking of studying with us?

You can take your pick from around 150 undergraduate degrees and almost 40 higher national diplomas and foundation degrees, together with a wide variety of taught and research postgraduate degrees, professional education and short courses.

Undergraduate level

Foundation programmes – 1 year, leading to a bachelor's degree

Higher National Diplomas (HND) – 2 years, leading to a bachelor's degree or a bachelor's top-up degree

Bachelor's degrees – 3 or 4 years; Bachelor of Arts (BA), Bachelor of Science (BSc), Bachelor of Engineering (BEng) and Bachelor of Law (LLB)

Bachelor's top-up degrees – 1 year; final year of a bachelor's degree for students who have completed the equivalent of a British HND

Research postgraduate level

Master of Philosophy degrees – 2 years

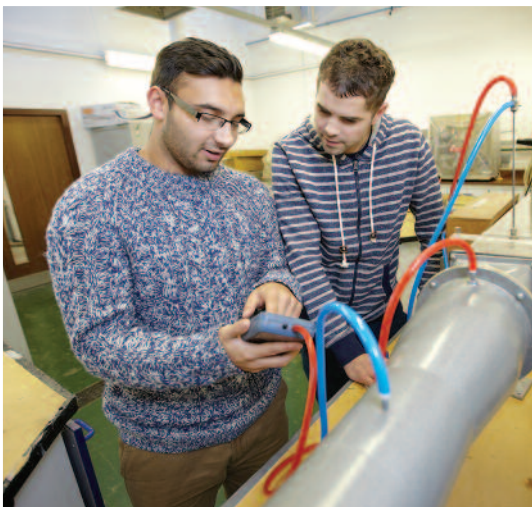

Study Abroad programme

Southampton Solent University's Study Abroad programme allows international students who are enrolled at a university outside the UK, at which there is no bilateral exchange agreement in place, to study with us for a semester or an academic year. You will need to have a learning agreement signed by both your home institution and Southampton Solent University. On completion of your studies with us, you will be able to transfer the credits you have obtained back to your home institution. Studying abroad will give you an international academic experience and help you to prepare to live and work in a more global society.

Exchange opportunities

Once you are a current student at Southampton Solent University, you may be eligible to spend a period of time studying or working in the EU through the Erasmus Mobility programme, depending on certain eligibility criteria. The length of the exchange must be for a minimum of three months and a maximum of a full academic year.



The opportunity to take part in an exchange depends upon your degree programme. If the structure of your course means that you are unable to study abroad, you might wish to consider a work placement abroad – which is also possible under the Erasmus programme.

Current partner universities can be found in the following countries: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland and the Netherlands.

Entry requirements

English entry requirements

In order to join one of our programmes, we ask that you demonstrate an acceptable level of competence in both written and spoken English.

The normal examinations to demonstrate competence are:

Undergraduate level

IELTS minimum 6.0 (5.5 in each component), or
CAE minimum grade C, or
I/GCSE English grade C or equivalent
Password minimum 6.0 (5.5 in each component)

Postgraduate level

IELTS minimum 6.5 (6.0 in writing, 5.5 in reading, listening and speaking), or
CAE minimum grade B, or
CPE minimum grade C or equivalent
Password minimum 6.5 (6.0 in writing, 5.5 in reading, listening and speaking)

Note to all international students requiring a visa:

All international applicants need to be aware that the English language requirements to attend Southampton Solent University and the English language requirements to obtain a visa from the UK Home Office may be different. This means that if you meet the Southampton Solent University language requirements to gain a place on a course, you may have to meet additional requirements to be granted a visa by the UK Home Office.

Pre-sessional English Language Course

If you need to improve your English language skills before starting your course, we offer a five-and ten-week pre-sessional English language course. The course will help you improve your reading, writing, listening and speaking skills to the level required for your chosen undergraduate or postgraduate course.



Academic entry requirements

Undergraduate first degrees

The normal minimum entry requirements for an honours degree course are:

- A-levels or high school leaving examinations equivalent to A-levels
- International or European Baccalaureate
- International Foundation Year/Certificate
- Or any recognised equivalent of the above qualifications.

Taught postgraduate master's degrees

The normal minimum entry requirements for a master's degree course are:

- British bachelor's degree with a minimum of 2:2
- Or any recognised equivalent of the above qualification.

Application procedures

Undergraduate students

Undergraduate students must complete an online UCAS application form via the UCAS website (www.ucas.ac.uk) with the appropriate fee.

Overseas students have until the end of June to apply to UK institutions. EU students are advised to apply by the official UCAS January deadline, although you can still apply afterwards while there are places left.

Postgraduate students

Postgraduate students apply directly to the University. You must complete an application form, which you can find on our website or obtain upon request. Please make sure that you enclose a copy of your official transcripts and two references along with your application form.



Fees and scholarships

Tuition fees, scholarships and EU funding

Cost of living

You will need to pay for your living expenses in addition to the course fees. These include your accommodation, food, socialising, books and other general expenses. Your living cost is estimated at approximately £820 per month.

Further study

Southampton Solent University alumni can receive up to a 15 per cent discount on the first year of their course fees if they go on to further study at the University. For example, this could be applied to a postgraduate course after graduating from an undergraduate or top-up course.

The Solent Sport Scholarship

The Solent Sport Scholarship is for students with great potential as basketball or cricket players. For each successful applicant, academic fees are

covered by Southampton Solent University at 100 per cent for the first academic year and then at 50 per cent for the second and third years.

High Performance Academy

The High Performance Academy programme offers different levels of support to students based on their sporting talent and potential.

There are three categories:

- High Performance Squad
- Development Squad
- Performance Squad

Support packages for successful applicants are up to the value of £2,500.

Student accommodation

Applying for a student visa

Tier 4 Student Visa

If you are an international student coming to study a course of more than six months' duration or a pre-sessional course to prepare you for further study in the UK, you will need to obtain a Tier 4 Student Visa in your country of residence before travelling to the UK. You cannot apply for a visa at the airport when you arrive.

The Tier 4 General Student Visa allows you to:

- study a course of more than six months' duration or a pre-sessional course to prepare you for further study in the UK
- work part-time in term time and full-time in official university holidays. Part-time means:
 - 20 hours per week for courses which are at degree level and above
 - ten hours per week for courses which are below degree level (foundation/IFP/pre-sessional/HND)
 - **You may also undertake a work placement without obtaining additional permission if it is an assessed part of your course.**
- extend your Leave (permission) to Remain in the UK, providing that you meet the requirements of the Tier 4 Policy Guidance.

Please note that in order to study in the UK on a Tier 4 Student Visa; the course must be full-time.

Five-year Tier 4 limit

Any new Tier 4 application must lead to you spending no more than five years in total on courses at degree level (NQF 6/7). Any time you have already studied in the UK with a Tier 4 or Student Visa at this level will be included in the five years, although exceptions exist. **PhD courses are exempt from the cap.**

What do I need in order to apply?

In order to make a successful application you will need to meet all the requirements of Tier 4.

You will need to have accepted an offer at Southampton Solent University and received a certificate of acceptance for study (CAS) from the University to show that we will be acting as your Tier 4 sponsor. You will also need to show evidence that you meet the English language requirements for your course and that you have enough money to meet the Tier 4 Maintenance Requirement (tuition fees and living expenses).

Working in the UK

If you are a European Economic Area (EEA) or Swiss national, or the dependant of one, you are permitted to work in the UK without any restrictions on the number of hours or type of work. You will need to show an employer your passport or identity card as proof that you are a national of an EEA country/dependant of one.

Croatian nationals

While studying in the UK, Croatian nationals are entitled to work 20 hours a week during term time and full-time during holidays. However, you must first obtain a yellow registration certificate confirming that you are a student by completing a CR1 form.



Non-EEA nationals and work

If you are a non-EU/EEA/Swiss national, you should check the conditions on your visa or Biometric Residence Permit to check that you have been given the correct work entitlement for the level of your course, as above.

How to find us

From London Heathrow

By rail – take the Heathrow Express train from Heathrow Airport to central London. Services to Southampton Central operate from Waterloo station. The total journey time from Heathrow to Southampton is approximately two hours. The Railair service runs every 30 minutes and picks up from all four terminals. By coach – the National Express coach service operates from the bus station at Heathrow Airport to Southampton coach station. On direct services, the average journey time is one hour and 50 minutes. From London Gatwick

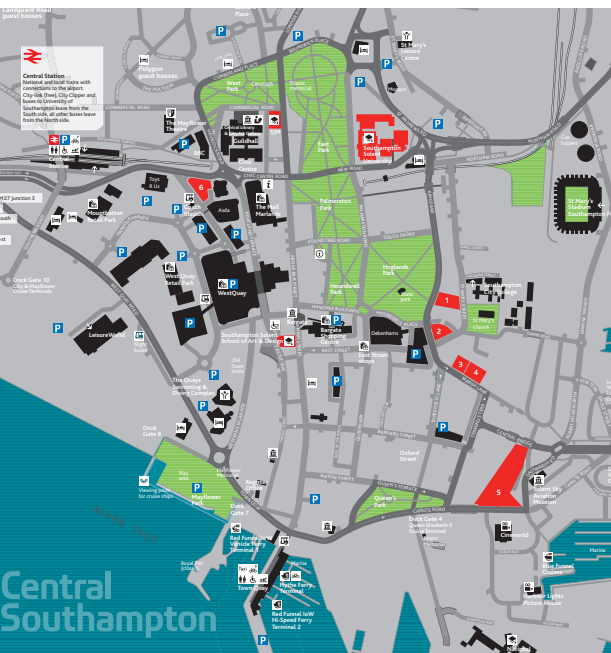
By rail – train services operate between Gatwick Airport and Southampton Central. The average journey time is two hours.

By coach – National Express coach services operate from Gatwick to Southampton coach station, via Heathrow (coach changeover). The average journey time is four hours.

Southampton Airport

There is a train station located at Southampton Airport with a direct service to Southampton Central station, taking just under ten minutes. Alternatively there are taxis available at the airport that can take you to the city centre.
