ACCOMMODATION

There are many accommodation options available to you while you are studying in Birmingham. You can choose from University or private accommodation, with each having numerous options to suit all budgets.



LOCATION

With our own railway station on campus, you can be in the city centre in less than seven minutes. There is something for everyone in Birmingham and you are sure to receive a warm welcome in one of the most culturally diverse cities in Britain.



RETAIL

The city centre offers a first-class retail experience; from famous brands to independent stores, Birmingham has something for everyone. You will find a wealth of choices, from large shopping centres like Bullring, Selfridges, Mailbox and Grand Central, to diverse vintage clothing stores and artisan workshops in the world-famous Jewellery Quarter.



CULTURE

Birmingham has an exciting culture and history. From our world-leading museums and art galleries to the historic industrial district of Digbeth, there is so much to explore at the heart of our city. Birmingham is also proud to host many annual urban festivals such as MADE, Pride and the Mostly Jazz, Funk & Soul Festival.

FOOD

Birmingham is filled with foodies, which means new restaurants and food festivals are always popping up across the city. The multi-award-winning Digbeth Dining Club hosts independent food stalls, while our very own monthly farmers market on campus offers locally sourced and environmentally friendly produce.

Independent Birmingham also hosts regular events across the city, promoting new places and helping you to discover new favourites.

UNIVERSITY ACCOMMODATION

Our dedicated postgraduate accommodation is located across our three student villages: The Vale Village, Selly Oak Village and Pritchatts Park Village; all of which are within walking distance of the Edgbaston campus.

SELLY OAK VILLAGE

A five-minute walk from campus, with the vibrant Selly Oak high street on your doorstep. Our postgraduates are located together in Jarrett Hall, which offers en-suite rooms with shared kitchens. Prices range from £147–151 per week. This is the perfect environment to make new friends while allowing you to concentrate on your studies.



To secure your place in University-owned halls you will need to make a pre-payment of £550 at the time of booking your accommodation. This is deducted from your remaining balance.

THE VALE VILLAGE

Just a 15-minute walk from campus, The Vale is set in a tranquil conservation area surrounded by trees and a lake. Our postgraduates live in Shackleton, Mason and Chamberlain residences. Prices range from £206–257 per week. A bar, restaurant, café, convenience store and laundrette contribute to a community atmosphere so you feel right at home.





We have more than 30 places to eat and drink across our campus and accommodation.



Pritchatts Park Village

Close to campus, Harborne and University station, Pritchatts Park provides self-catering accommodation for postgraduates in a lovely landscaped setting. The Park's design creates a sense of community, with shared facilities such as meeting rooms, an airy lounge, a licensed bar and a games room offering the perfect environment to get to know your fellow postgraduates. Prices range from £108–254 per week.



If you are studying at the Shakespeare Institute, there are many sources of accommodation in Stratford-upon-Avon and we will give you as much assistance as we can to help you to find somewhere to live nearby.

TRAVELLING TO AND FROM CAMPUS

There are several ways to travel to our campus. From bike lanes to canal paths, we are well connected to many areas of our city.

Birmingham Cycle Revolution is making cycling easier. A 4km fully segregated cycleway will link Selly Oak and the University with the city centre. Due for completion in January 2019, the cycleway will provide a safe, healthy and green method of travelling around the city.

Our campus is also well served by bus routes. From the city centre, the 61, 63 and X64 run frequently to our campus. From Moseley, the 1A stops right outside the University and from Harborne, the 48 and 244 provide services which drop you close to the University.

As we have our own railway station, University, you can get regular trains travelling from Birmingham New Street to campus in just seven minutes, making trips to and from the city centre quick and easy.

COMMUNITY



PRIVATE ACCOMMODATION

Many of our students choose to find housing in the private sector. A variety of housing options, including single flats, shared houses and properties for families, can be found in the local area. Selly Oak is the closest residential area, just a five-minute walk from the University campus. The weekly cost of rent ranges from £55–120, averaging at £75, usually excluding utilities.


BIRMINGHAM STUDENTPAD


GUILD LETTINGS

CITY LIVING

Some of our postgraduates prefer to live in the heart of the city. The commute is an easy seven-minute train journey from New Street to University station, making city living an appealing choice. We work with private accommodation providers to offer a fantastic range of options to suit your individual needs.

Host

Host offers two choices for our students: Host Student Apartments and The Metalworks. Offering en-suite rooms and premium studios, Host Student Apartments are located just a few minutes' walk from campus, with prices starting from £175 per week. The Metalworks sits right on the edge of campus and offers a variety of rooms, with prices starting from £152 per week.

CRM students

With a choice of rooms, including en-suites and access to on-site gyms, CRM students provide quality accommodation in central locations, with prices starting from £120 per week.

Liberty Living

If you're looking for a place in the city, Liberty Living offers city centre accommodation, less than a mile from New Street station. They also provide residences just five minutes' walk from campus. Prices start from £110 per week.

Also popular...

If you're looking to immerse yourself in suburban Birmingham life, the villages of Moseley and Harborne are popular with our students. With many bars, cafés and restaurants, these cosmopolitan areas are perfect for young professionals and students, with many privately rented properties available. For a slightly cheaper – but by no means less desirable – option, Kings Heath neighbours Moseley and is a lively, popular area to live.

OUR CAMPUS

The main campus in Edgbaston is set in 250 acres of parkland with spacious lawns, trees, a lake and significant works of sculpture enhancing its landscape. With its domed red-brick buildings, the campus is rich in heritage and beauty. We have all the amenities of a small town, including shops, bars, cafés, banks, medical and dental surgeries, sports facilities, and even our own railway station.

Away from our main campus...

Our Selly Oak campus, two miles from Edgbaston, is a green 80-acre site with a village atmosphere. We also have a satellite campus in the historic town of Stratford-upon-Avon (the Shakespeare Institute).

The School of Dentistry is located at the new Birmingham Dental Hospital at Pebble Mill, which is less than a mile from the main campus. It is the first stand-alone, integrated dental hospital and dental school to be built in the UK for almost 40 years.



With magnificent architecture and a green, leafy site, our campus provides an inspirational environment for your studies.



CAMPUS FACILITIES

Our campus is currently undergoing a huge transformation, with over £600 million invested in redeveloping the campus and facilities. From outstanding new accommodation to a state-of-the-art library, students at Birmingham benefit daily from our new developments.

Our newly developed Green Heart offers lush new parkland in the centre of campus. Measuring over 12 acres, it will provide a unique space for performances, socialising, meeting and studying.

Our main library houses state-of-the-art facilities for students, staff and researchers. It is a modern space providing informal seating, group study spaces and individual desks alongside a wealth of new technology including wireless mobile charging, media rooms and video editing booths. Whether you are working in groups or independently studying, our library has the perfect facilities for learning.

Alongside our main library, you can find further facilities throughout our Colleges. Supporting the Arts, Shakespeare Studies, and the Dental and Medical Schools, our libraries offer additional study spaces and resources to further your development.

The Guild of Students plays an important role in our students' lives. With over 250 student groups, societies and associations, the Guild helps our students develop skills, have fun and get the most out of their time at Birmingham. The building is a hub of activity, with shops, a bar, food and drink outlets and support services hosted here.

SPORT

Our Sport & Fitness club on campus is a facility for staff, students and the community in the heart of Edgbaston. The club provides world-class opportunities for everyone in the region and offers an unrivalled fitness experience.

We offer over 100 sports scholarships, 55 student sports clubs, over 150 fitness classes a week and flexible membership options.

Our new squash courts and hockey pitches will become competition venues during Birmingham 2022, following the city's successful bid to host the Commonwealth Games, meaning our staff and students can look forward to welcoming world-class athletes to campus once again.

Off campus, the Raymond Priestley Centre in the Lake District provides the opportunity to try a host of outdoor activities including sailing, windsurfing, mountaineering, rock climbing, kayaking and canoeing. We also have access to the nearby Edgbaston Reservoir and a boathouse in Worcester (on the River Severn).

There are over 55 different sports clubs to choose from. From badminton to volleyball, there's something for everyone to get stuck into. Whether you're a beginner or already playing sport at a national level, joining one of our sports clubs is the perfect opportunity to discover your sporting passion.

WELCOMING WORLD-CLASS ATHLETES

Birmingham is one of the UK's leading sporting universities. We have a reputation for providing a world-class training environment on our Edgbaston campus, not only for our own international student-athletes, but also for Team Jamaica who trained here ahead of the London 2012 Olympic Games and the IAAF World Championships in 2017.



Our facilities and services include:

- A range of pitches for a variety of sports, including floodlit water-based, 3G synthetic, natural-turf and rubber-crumb pitches

- Performance and Wellbeing Centre
- Performance gym
- Six glass-backed squash courts
- Specialist Human Performance Lab offering training assistance, nutritional advice and performance monitoring
- Steam room and sauna
- Ten-metre climbing wall


The arts and culture scene is constantly evolving. From the Barber Institute of Fine Arts to the Bramall music building, there's something for everyone to immerse themselves in.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS AND ARCHIVES

Built up over a period of 120 years, our Special Collections and Archives consist of approximately 120,000 pre-1850 books dating from 1471 and some 3 million manuscripts, all of which distinguishes us as a major UK research library.

THE LAPWORTH MUSEUM OF GEOLOGY

The Lapworth Museum dates back to 1880, and is one of the oldest specialist geological museums in the UK. The Lapworth Museum provides a valuable resource for students, schools and colleges, research workers, enthusiasts and anyone with a desire to learn about geology.

THE RESEARCH AND CULTURAL COLLECTIONS

The Research and Cultural Collections include extraordinary artefacts, from West African masks in the Danford Collection, to important 20th-century paintings such as Peter Lanyon's mural in the Arts Building.



WINTERBOURNE HOUSE AND GARDENS

Winterbourne is a stunning Arts and Crafts house and garden that is free to enter for all Birmingham students. You can relax in the flourishing gardens, or attend an event, such as special interest tours, exhibitions and lectures.

THE BRAMALL

The Bramall is home to our Department of Music, which boasts two symphony orchestras, a jazz orchestra, new music ensemble, choirs and many other groups that regularly perform at the Bramall. Seating 450 and featuring world-class acoustics, the main auditorium provides an intimate environment for enjoying everything from comedy nights to classical music evenings.



AND THAT'S NOT ALL!

Many of our facilities on campus offer the opportunity for classes, workshops and tours, making the campus a hub for learning and exploring.

We offer our postgraduate students the opportunity to develop their language skills, either for personal development or to support their studies, via our open access language courses, all of which are taught on campus with convenient day or evening sessions.

We also host several large events each year, such as our Birmingham Prom and Community festival, alongside graduation balls, alumni events and international conferences. These events also give you the opportunity to engage the public in your studies and research; vital to illustrating your research impact.

How is beauty transforming the self?

The demand to be beautiful is increasingly important in today's visual and virtual culture. Rightly or wrongly, perfection has, for some, become an ethical ideal by which to live and judge ourselves as successes or failures.

HEATHER WIDDOWS, Professor of Global Ethics, Department of Philosophy

Heather's research on beauty is currently formed of two main strands: *Perfect Me*, her latest book, and the Beauty Demands Project and Network.

Perfect Me explores how looking beautiful has become a moral imperative in today's visual and virtual world. It examines the changing nature of the beauty ideal, showing how it is more dominant, more demanding and more global than ever before.

The Beauty Demands Project has, over the last two years, brought together cultural theorists, historians, lawyers, doctors, philosophers, sociologists and psychologists with medical and nurse practitioners, artists and journalists to consider the changing requirements of beauty. Together they have explored the psychological, ethical, regulatory and legal issues of beauty demands.

Women's role in policy

In 2018, International Women's Day was celebrated amid scandals around the abuse of vulnerable women across many sectors, including aid, multi-national companies and the film industry. Women's rights, responsibilities and gender equality are a focus of many of our researchers' work.

FIONA DE LONDRA, Professor of Global Legal Studies, Birmingham Law School

Professor Fiona de Londras is a regular media commentator on legal, political and constitutional affairs, and her research concerns constitutionalism, human rights and transnationalism. Fiona was heavily involved with abortion law reform, educating the public before the referendum on the *8th Amendment* (Article 40.3.3 of the *Constitution*) in Ireland.

Alongside Máiréad Enright (Senior Lecturer in Birmingham Law School), Fiona ran the website www.aboutthe8th.com, working to inform and empower the electorate to engage with the legal arguments for and implications of the repeal of the *8th Amendment*.



DR KATHERINE BROWN, Senior lecturer in Islamic Studies in the Department of Theology and Religion

In her work, Katherine researches how counter-terrorism and counter-radicalisation programmes impact on religious women's rights and Muslim communities. Recently she has given expert advice and testimony in the UK in a number of cases involving radicalisation.



Gender-mainstreaming ensures the different implications on men and women in any policy are considered and valued equally, and Katherine has worked for the UN on gender-mainstreaming in countering violent extremism. She has also given talks with the EU on violent extremism and radical beliefs, and provided academic oversight for think tanks.

How do regimes continue to rig elections and get away with it?

With electoral fraud in the media spotlight, both in the UK and internationally, it is important to explore how the electoral process can be undermined and exploited by those in power.

Nic's research into democracy, representation and electoral malpractice has attracted considerable academic, policy and media attention around the world, especially after the launch of his new book, *How to Rig an Election*. The book is based on his, and co-author Brian Klaas's first-hand experiences as election watchers and their hundreds of interviews with presidents, prime ministers, diplomats, election officials and conspirators.

Nic has commented on topics ranging from elections to gender inequality. He is the author of *Democracy in Africa: Successes, Failures and the Struggle for Political Reform*, and regularly provides analysis to the UK and US governments. He is an advisor to, and writer for, the late Kofi Annan's African Progress Panel, and also leads a new research programme on innovative ways to tackle gender inequality in health and wellbeing as part of the University's new Institute for Global Innovation.

Genomic sequencing at the heart of outbreak response

Genome sequencing in disease outbreaks is useful to understand how a virus evolves, but the information has to be available quickly in order to guide control efforts.

Portable DNA sequencing systems allow outbreak genome sequencing in real time, impacting directly on the response to a virus on the ground, as well as helping to build a picture of its evolution.

Nick Loman and his team first saw success during their 'lab in a suitcase' genomic surveillance of the Ebola outbreak, before shifting their focus towards Brazil, and the spread of Zika.

They worked with health partners in Brazil to combat Zika by deploying a pair of mobile DNA sequencing laboratories on a medical 'road trip' through the worst-hit areas of the country.

Using portable, USB-powered genome sequencing equipment to analyse virus samples, the team used data gathered to track the spread of the virus and spot its emergence in large towns and cities; a crucial tool in the fight against these outbreaks.

Companies who urgently need more employees with coding skills sponsor the School's boot camps, so they can offer the courses free of charge – removing barriers and getting more and different types of people into technology.

The 16-week course takes new learners from zero to coding professional; then helps them into jobs. The School has applicants from many backgrounds, including a baker, a school leaver, a musician, a chemist and a stay-at-home mum. Now 60% of the class are already in coding jobs.



WHICH PROGRAMME SHOULD YOU CHOOSE?

We recognise that in an increasingly fast-paced world, flexibility in terms of how and where you undertake your studies is important. Our portfolio of programmes offers a modern solution for today's postgraduate students.

From part-time and distance learning options through to degree programmes taught by our faculty overseas, we offer a range of opportunities to suit your personal or professional needs. Learn more about your options in this section and find out how to apply.

MASTERS-LEVEL PROGRAMMES

These are usually one year in length (and a minimum of two years if taken part time). Comprising a number of modules, they are assessed by a combination of coursework, examination and dissertation, and lead to the award of a Masters qualification.

Our **taught Masters** programmes are the next step after undergraduate study and can be pursued to further your knowledge and expertise, to prepare for a research degree, to gain a vocational qualification or even to change careers.

A **combined research and taught Masters**, such as the MRes, is often taken as a stepping stone to doctoral study. These combined programmes will provide you with taught modules to increase your knowledge of a subject, and the opportunity to complete an extended research thesis with the appropriate training and supervision.

A **research Masters**, such as the MSc by Research, is a good way to investigate a topic in greater depth, to prove your capacity for undertaking research and/or to demonstrate your suitability to progress to a doctoral degree.

My course provided such a great diversity of opportunity; from the courses and modules on offer, to the people that it attracted from around the world. It was a great eye-opener about how diverse our world is and how interesting a place it can be.

DOCTORAL RESEARCH PROGRAMMES

These involve the completion of original academic research. They also include research skills training that will equip you to become an independent researcher, capable of advancing knowledge in your field.

Doctoral degrees, such as the PhD, are the highest level of academic qualification, for which you will conduct original research and make a contribution to a field of knowledge. Doctoral researchers often teach undergraduate classes during their degree programme and you will usually contribute to the research life of your department by presenting papers at seminars and conferences.



We also offer programmes at our Dubai campus, as well as in Singapore, in partnership with the Singapore Institute of Management (SIM).

From part-time and distance learning options through to degree programmes taught by our faculty overseas, we offer a range of opportunities to suit your personal or professional needs.

DECIDE YOUR MODE OF STUDY

Flexibility in the mode of learning enables you to undertake learning and assessment through different methods and formats. On some of our courses, you can choose which mode of study you take; whether it is campus-based, block delivery, blended or distance learning. Some courses are offered by more than one mode and you may be able to transfer from one mode to another.

FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME?

Although full-time study is still the most common choice for our students, we know that many of our postgraduates, for professional, family or financial reasons, prefer to take their degree course on a part-time basis, either on campus or through distance (online) learning. Some of our programmes now offer these options. Please note that due to visa restrictions, international students (from non-EU/EEA countries) studying on campus are normally only eligible for full-time study.

DISTANCE LEARNING?

If you have commitments that don't allow you to study via the standard on-campus mode, or you prefer an online learning format, then you may like to consider applying for a distance learning programme (a mode of study that is sometimes also referred to as distance education). The main advantage of studying by distance learning is its flexibility. You can study at home, in your own time and at your own pace, so you can combine achieving a qualification with work or family commitments.

HOW ARE OUR TAUGHT PROGRAMMES COMPLETED AND ASSESSED?

All our degrees are set within a credit framework designed to measure your academic achievements. You acquire credits by taking a number of compulsory and optional modules.

MASTERS-LEVEL QUALIFICATIONS

We expect all students to accumulate 180 credits in each full year of study on a Masters-level course. Credits are acquired by taking compulsory and optional modules, which are part of each degree programme. These credits are equivalent to 40 hours' learning a week, through a combination of independent study and contact time in lectures and seminars. Modules may be based around a single subject or a small part of a much broader area.




HOW CAN CREDITS BE USED?

The European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) is a credit system designed to standardise degree programmes or training. You can show your credits to employers and other institutions to show the equivalency of your qualification.

ROUTES INTO RESEARCH AT BIRMINGHAM

There are, generally, two routes to a Birmingham research degree:

- You can apply to an 'advertised PhD', which means it is part of an established research project and is usually funded by the University or other funding body. Generally, advertised PhDs are associated with the physical and life sciences subjects. Some advertised PhDs will be pre-defined but some may require you to propose your own research.
- Apply to any of our PhD programmes and propose your own research that is 'self-funded' (by you, a sponsor, or other sources not explicitly attached to the PhD on application). Usually you submit a research proposal and identify your proposed supervisor. These are generally associated with the arts and social sciences.



POSTGRADUATE LOAN

The Postgraduate Masters Loan is available for home (UK/EU) students undertaking Masters study. Up to £10,609 is available for the 2018–19 academic year. It will be a contribution towards the cost of study, and whether you use the loan for fees, maintenance or other costs will be at your own discretion. The loan is available across all subject areas for full-time, part-time and distance learning Masters programmes, so long as you don't already have a Masters qualification (or equivalent).



POSTGRADUATE DOCTORAL LOAN

The Postgraduate Doctoral Loan is a new government loan for the 2018–19 academic year. You can use the loan to help with course fees and living costs. UK or EU nationals who normally reside in England can borrow up to £25,000 that will be divided equally across each year of your course. Your course can be full or part time and last between three and eight academic years.

There are seven government-funded research councils, known jointly as UKRI (United Kingdom Research and Innovation) that offer financial support to postgraduate students:

APPLYING FOR FUNDING

We offer scholarships to support research postgraduates to invest in their future, along with a number of funded studentships offering generous support.

Funding support for PhD study can be provided in different ways, with some covering the programme fees and including a stipend (maintenance costs), while others may simply be a one-off financial award.

Your first consideration for funding should be our advertised PhDs, UKRI (United Kingdom Research and Innovation), or the many funding bodies listed on our Postgraduate Funding database.

There are two main ways to fund your PhD:

- 1 **Apply for a PhD that already has funding attached.** These are most common in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Medicine) subjects, but they can sometimes be available for pre-defined research projects in the arts, humanities or social sciences. These may be advertised as fully funded (with fees and a stipend) or competition funded, meaning the projects compete against other projects at each institution. - 2 **Self-fund, or search for funding or a studentship once you have an offer.** You devise your own PhD topic, find a supervisor, write a research proposal and apply to the relevant programme. If you're offered a place at Birmingham, you can then apply for studentships or funding from various sources.

DOCTORAL TRAINING PARTNERSHIPS AND CENTRES

DOCTORAL TRAINING PARTNERSHIPS AND CENTRES

A significant proportion of the UK research council's funding for postgraduate research studentships is now awarded to institutions via Centres for Doctoral Training (also known as DTCs or CDTs) and Doctoral Training Partnerships (DTPs), Industrial Doctorate Centres (IDCs) or Engineering Doctorate Centres (EDCs).

These are funded by UKRI (UK Research and Innovation), with each research council supporting academic excellence in its specific field through flagship doctoral training.

We are proud to continually secure this competitive funding for our centres and partnerships with other universities. These research council studentships are regarded as some of the most prestigious postgraduate awards available in academia and are highly sought after; competition is extremely fierce.

We host a number of centres, drawing upon the expertise and facilities of a broad range of collaborative partners and interdisciplinary networks, all of which offer full studentships to enable you to undertake and complete your doctoral degree at Birmingham.

As a Birmingham doctoral researcher, you will have the opportunity to work across disciplinary boundaries, both within the University and with a range of business, industry, higher education and research council partners. Some of our many UKRI-funded arrangements are listed here.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

Doctoral Training Partnerships (DTPs) support PhD studentships across all areas of a research council's subject remit. They may have specific areas of expertise, based on available supervisors and facilities, but the studentships they have available can be used for a broad range of projects.

Centres for Doctoral Training (CDTs) or Doctoral Training Centres (DTCs) have more specific goals. They recruit PhD students to build up research expertise in target areas.

Industrial Doctorate Centres and Engineering Doctorate Centres combine PhD-level research projects with taught courses, and students spend about 75% of their time working directly with a company.

YOUR DOCUMENTS

All documents must be in English or have a certified translation. If you provide documents by uploading them into the online postgraduate application system (found through Course finder) and are made an offer, you will be required to send certified copies or original documents as a condition of the offer.

We recommend you supply all of the following documents at the point of submitting your application to ensure that there are no delays:

- Your academic transcripts and any other supporting material
- If not submitted within the application form, a personal statement explaining why you are interested in studying your chosen programme
- If required, additional information to be submitted such as a CV or a sample of work (this will be stated within the application form)
- If English is not your first language, a certificate to show competency in the English language will be required (see page 62)
- Your research proposal (if required)



International students

If you require a visa to study in the United Kingdom, you will need to apply by 1 July 2019. We are not able to consider applications for 2019 made after this date.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To gain a place at Birmingham, you will need to meet the specific entry requirements for your chosen course.

Our postgraduate programmes usually require **a good Honours degree (normally a 2:1 or above)**, or an equivalent qualification if you were educated outside the UK. There may also be additional requirements, such as prior or practising work experience.

If you are applying for a PhD then you may also need to hold a good Masters qualification, however, for some programmes, this may not be a requirement.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE COURSES

If you do not have the required level of English, you can enrol on one of our pre-sessional English programmes before the start of the academic year, delivered by our Birmingham International Academy. Passing the appropriate programme means you will automatically meet the English language requirements of your offer and can progress to your academic studies here.

Certificates should be no more than two years old at the time of admission.

You will need to submit a research proposal to conduct a unique piece of research and identify your proposed supervisor. Funding can be found from other sources such as scholarships, charities, loans and self-finance. Generally, these PhDs are associated with the arts and social sciences.



WRITING YOUR RESEARCH PROPOSAL

A research proposal is a concise and coherent summary of your proposed research. It is a key part of your application, on which potential supervisors will decide if your research is something they can support.
