First-class facilities

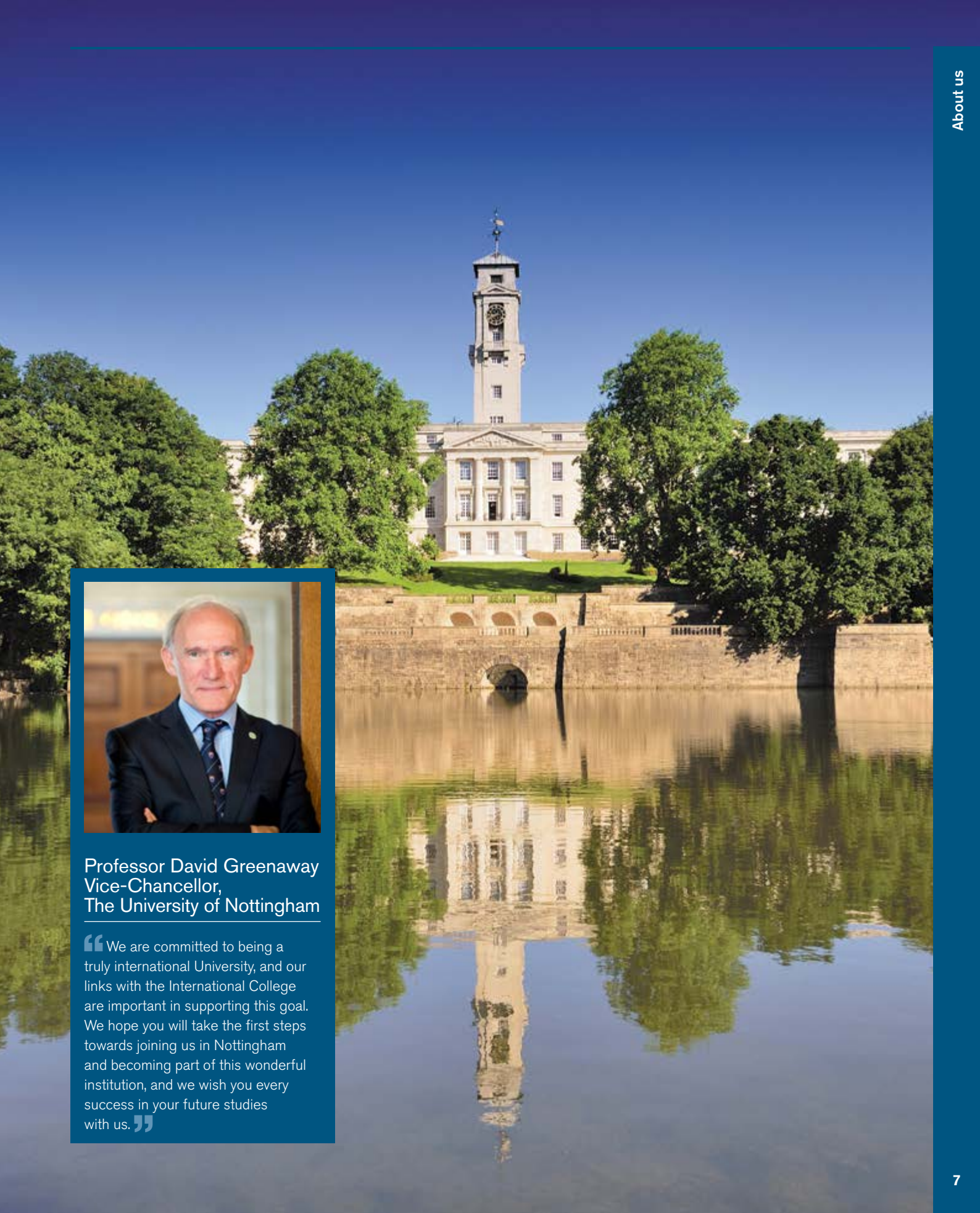

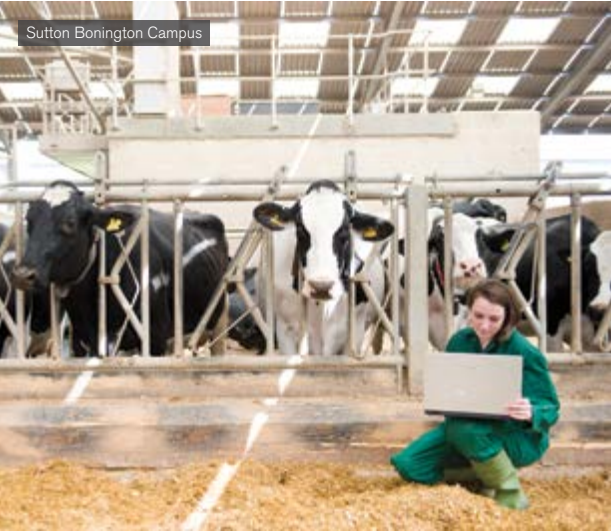

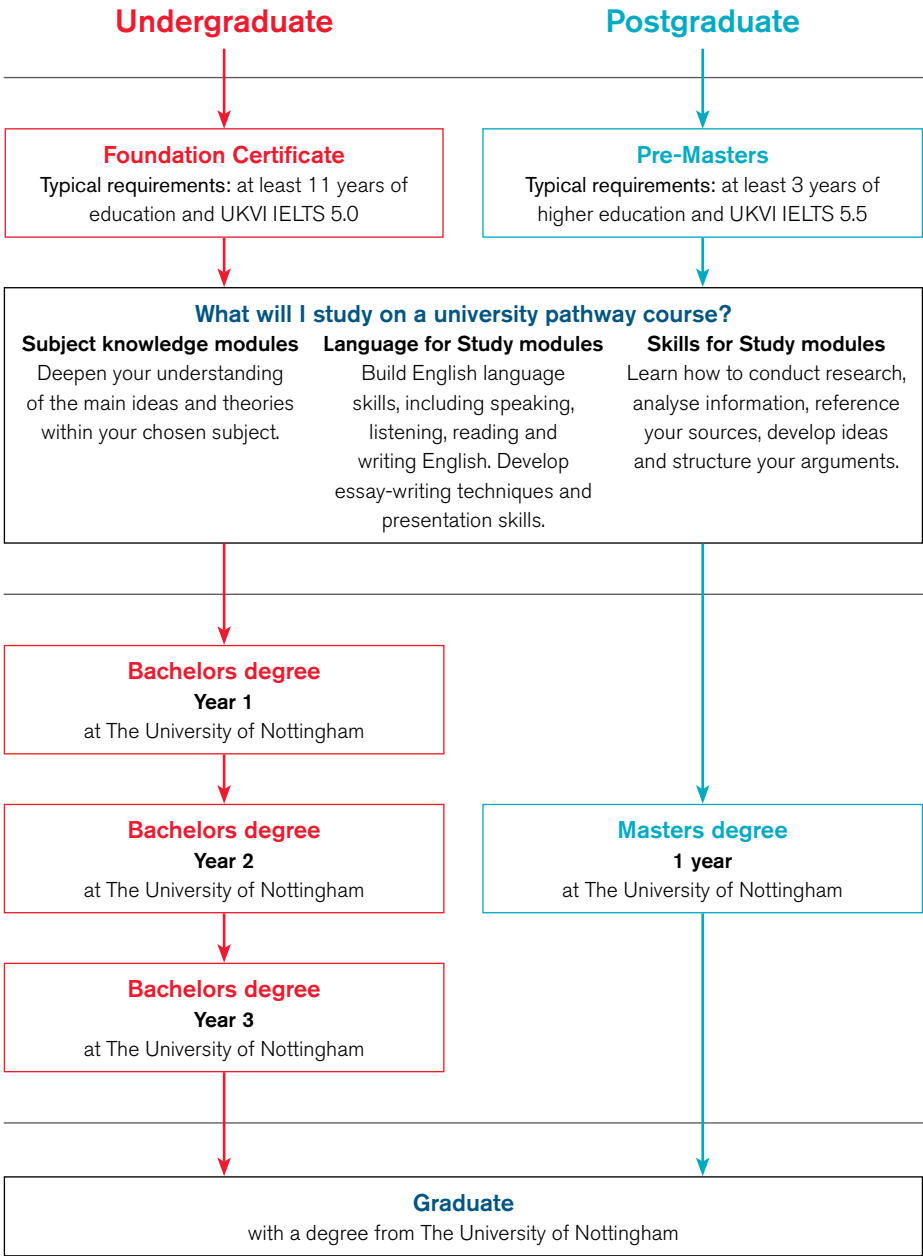
The UK education system

In the UK, students normally take A levels before starting their bachelors (or undergraduate) degree, which usually lasts 3 or 4 years. Our Foundation Certificate courses are a recognised qualification for entry to a bachelors degree, and are specially designed for international students.

Some graduates then study a masters (or postgraduate) degree, which usually lasts 1 year. Our Pre-Masters courses bridge the gap between your existing university credit and the level needed for entry to a postgraduate degree.

Lower IELTS?

If you do not meet the English language entry level for the courses listed to the right, but have at least UKVI IELTS 4.0 in all skills, we can in many cases offer you a course that includes Extended English and Skills (EES). Contact us for more details about EES.

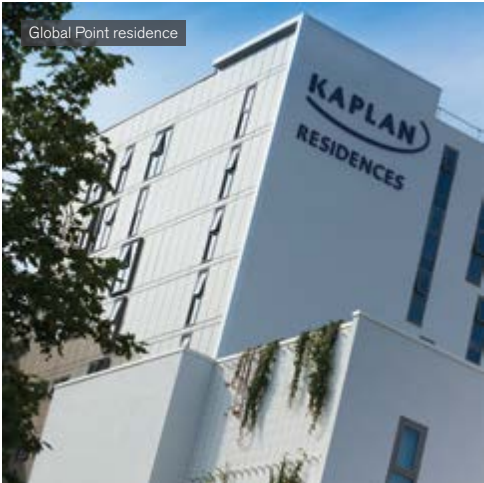
