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

At Bath we will help you make the transition from an undergraduate to a postgraduate course; your degree will now be more academically challenging and specialised.



The postgraduate degree you choose will depend on your subject interest and career ambitions. We offer a range of master's degrees, including full-time, part-time and new online courses to suit your lifestyle and career aims.

You will be able to study subjects in the following areas:

We offer different types of master's degrees and the following table gives you an overview of the possible routes:

MA MSc	Master of Arts Master of Science	 The taught courses will either: Build on your undergraduate studies, exploring your subject in more depth. You will be expected to work more independently and think more critically. Complement your undergraduate degree with knowledge, tools and skills in a different subject area - for example by taking an MSc in Computer Science or an MSc in Management.
МВА	Master of Business Administration	 A postgraduate course for those with at least three years of full-time, post-graduation professional or managerial work experience. An Executive MBA requires 5 years' work experience. An MBA can prepare you for a senior management role, can accelerate your career and help you become a better leader. It is a great option if you want to start your own business.
MRes	Master of Research	 A taught course that combines the academic study of a particular subject with a comprehensive exploration of research methods. It is a qualification in its own right, but can be used as a preparation for a PhD- '1+3' (MRes +PhD) pathway.
PG Dip PG Cert	Postgraduate Diploma Postgraduate Certificate	 Qualifications at the same level of study as master's degrees, but they do not include a written dissertation. A PG Dip takes longer and is worth more credits than a PG Cert.

The University of Bath is recognised for its impactful research, ranked in the top 15 of British universities for research quality (The Complete University Guide 2019).

Postgraduate students work alongside some of the leading researchers in their field from across the globe. Strong links with industry, government, NGOs and policymakers provide unique opportunities for collaborations ensuring Bath postgraduate students' research has an impact far beyond academia.

87% of our research was ranked as world leading or internationally excellent according to the Research Excellence Framework (REF) exercise carried out in 2014. While at Bath, your studies will be informed by some of the most exciting and innovative ideas around, whether you are working to develop new drugs to cure breast cancer, collaborating with industry leaders such as Ford to develop fuel-efficient engines, or are involved in our Queen's Anniversary Prize-winning research into child poverty.

Enthusing and nurturing new research talent is one of our highest priorities. We have 17 dedicated training centres for doctoral research students and around 2,000 current postgraduate research students.

- Our scientists have created a patch which allows for bloodless testing in diabetes monitoring



Our city

Bath is a Unesco World heritage city and studying at the University of Bath means that you will benefit from both a historic and bustling city and a beautiful and thriving campus.

If you like exploring new cities and places, there are plenty of ways to transport yourself into the hub of Bath, and beyond.

A taxi of friends can cost as little as $\mathfrak{L}2$ each from the campus to the city.

The University of Bath bus runs every 6 minutes during the day and takes 10-15 minutes from the campus to city.

Catch the train from Bath Spa station and be in Bristol in 12 minutes.

If you fancy taking in the beautiful countryside, you can take a canal boat along the river Avon, which runs through the city.

If you want to plan a day trip to a city further afield, you can catch a train to London in 94 minutes or be in Cardiff in 63 minutes.

The surrounding countryside is perfect for walking, running and cycling, and can be easily accessed from the city. University managed accommodation

We offer accommodation both on campus and in the city specifically for postgraduate students. Living in a university managed building means that everything is included in your rent and your accommodation is looked after by our experienced housekeeping team. Therefore you have more time to really focus on your studies.

Polden is our newest building, completed in 2018. It has been designed with postgraduates in mind so that you can meet, live and work alongside students who understand the demands of postgraduate study. Polden is located on the quiet, far west side of our campus, just a few minutes away from the library.

We also have off campus accommodation around the city. The main shops, restaurants, bars and cafés are all located within a short distance. All our accommodation is just a few minutes' walk from the bus stop, so you can get to campus quickly and easily.

We understand that every student is individual so our accommodation needs to be flexible to suit you.

To make you feel safe and at home our accommodation can only be accessed using swipe cards and we have dedicated Accommodation Security Officers available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Our campus is also an accredited Secured Environment, giving you complete peace of mind.


All our rents include your bills, insurance cover for your belongings and high-speed Wi-Fi.



Support for international students

The Bath community is made up of staff and students from all over the world. Over 100 nationalities are represented among our 3,500 international students and we embrace the diversity and multi-culturalism that our international students bring to Bath.

We recognise that to study in the UK and to move far away from home is a big decision for you. That's why we provide a range of services to ensure your move to Bath is as straight forward as possible. Our International Student Recruitment team makes regular visits to universities and fairs across the world and offers application support and advice. We can also help you connect with our former students around the world to find out how it is like to study at Bath.

Your application

We have a dedicated team to help you with any questions you may have when applying for a postgraduate course.



Tier 4 visas

Many of our international students live outside the EEA and so will require a Tier 4 visa to study in the UK. We currently have around 2,800 Tier 4 students at the University of Bath. Our Student Immigration Service is here to advise on all aspects of your visa application and to support you when you are here. We also offer 'check and send' appointments for visa applications.

Accommodation

You will need to submit an online application for accommodation once you have accepted an offer to study at the University. As an international student (not including EU students) you are guaranteed university accommodation if you apply for it. You will be housed with other postgraduate students and more than likely with other international students. There are several accommodation options to suit different needs and budgets, and more information can be found on pages 24 and 25.

Extra support when you arrive


All our international students can expect a helping hand on arrival: we can collect you by bus from London Heathrow Airport and get you settled into your new accommodation. We organise a welcome programme of events for our international students, including information sessions, tours of the campus, city and social events. You can also speak to an adviser in person at one of our daily drop-in advice sessions in the Student Services Centre.

Language support

If you are not a native English speaker, you will be offered English language support to help you continue to build your language skills while you study. You can attend an intensive summer pre-sessional course to prepare you to succeed here at Bath. Successful completion of the course means that you meet the English language requirements for your postgraduate degree programme and that you will not need to take another IELTS test.

Get involved

We encourage all our students to get involved with activities outside of their lectures. Joining a society, a sports club or becoming a community volunteer are great ways to meet new friends, familiarise yourself with UK culture, develop your skills, and improve your conversational English.

The qualification appears on your degree transcript, and provides potential employers with the evidence of the transferable skills you have developed in your time at university.

Fees, funding and scholarships


Studying for a master's degree is a great investment in your future. We also understand that it is expensive. That's why we aim to provide you with all the latest information regarding fees, loans and scholarships in order for you to make an informed choice.

Tuition fees

Tuition fees will vary depending on your course and whether you are a UK/EU or an overseas student. Fees for the academic year 2019/20 for individual taught courses are detailed in the course index in this prospectus (47 to 51 or at **go.bath.ac.uk/pgt-tuition-fees**). If you are an EU student you will pay the same fees as a UK student for our 2019/20 courses.

Postgraduate taught loans

Getting a postgraduate loan could significantly reduce the burden of paying for your studies. Eligible UK and EU master's students can currently borrow up to £10,609 (2018-19 academic year) to support their postgraduate studies. Part-time students can also apply. Loan repayments will begin after you have completed your master's degree and you have an annual income over £21,000. Students from Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland have access to different loans for their postgraduate study and more information can be found when you visit www.gov.uk/masters-loan.



Scholarships and bursaries

We want you to have the means to pursue your postgraduate study so we provide a number of scholarships and bursaries to help you invest in your future:

Faculty scholarships

The faculties of Engineering & Design, Humanities & Social Sciences and Science offer the following scholarships:

- Dean's Award for Academic Excellence: each faculty is offering eight scholarships worth £5,000. These scholarships reward academic excellence. Offer holders will be invited to apply.
- Global Leaders Scholarships:
 the faculties are funding forty-five postgraduate scholarships, each worth £5,000. You can apply for the Global Leaders Scholarship once you have received an offer.

Business and management scholarships

The School of Management runs a number of scholarship schemes both for MSc and MBA students.

• MSc Scholarships: You could be considered for a scholarship to help you study at Bath. You do not have to pay it back. If you are eligible the money is applied as a discount fee waiver on your tuition fee. The School of Management currently has more than thirty scholarships worth £5,000 each. • MBA Scholarships: the School of Management offers a number of scholarships across both the Full-time and Executive MBA programmes, ranging from £3,000 up to 30% of the tuition fee. These are awarded on a rolling basis from point of application by submission of a separate essay statement. Awards funded by alumni, industry and key partners are also available to support the best talent from around the world.

Bath students and Alumni bursaries

The University of Bath offers bursaries to its graduate students and alumni:

- Bath Alumni: if you have graduated with an honours degree or equivalent from the University of Bath and are self-financing, you may qualify for a 10% discount on tuition fees for a postgraduate course here at Bath. Your fees will be automatically discounted if you receive an offer.
- Taught Postgraduate Master's Bursaries: we offer ten bursaries, each worth £6,000, to students with home (UK) status who have an undergraduate honours degree from the University of Bath. Preference will be given to those who meet a widening participation criteria. Applications for 2019 entry will open in May 2019.

Part-time work

Working part-time during your studies is a great way to contribute towards your costs while studying and can be really useful for future employment, so it is worth exploring the options available in Bath. If you already have a job with a large organisation, you could see if it is possible to transfer to a local branch. The Students' Union also advertises part-time work opportunities, both on and off campus, to students.

Review the entry requirements Entry requirements vary by course and are there to make sure that you have the necessary skills to succeed. We will consider your whole application when assessing your suitability for your chosen course and may recommend an alternative when appropriate.

Check the application deadline Deadlines to apply may vary so please check when you need to submit your application for your specific course. We recommend that you apply as early as possible: the entry to many courses is competitive and you need to allow enough time to apply for funding, accommodation and visas if required.

Apply online Register online and complete the online application at go.bath.ac.uk/ pgt-apply. You will be able to save and update your information before you submit your application. You will also need to

include a personal statement and upload supporting documents such as degree certificates, an academic reference and your CV.

Your offer

If you receive an offer, use our online portal called Application Tracker to accept or decline as soon as possible. For some courses you will need to pay a deposit when you accept the offer. You can receive an unconditional or a conditional offer. With an unconditional offer, you have met all the required academic conditions and we are offering you a place. If the offer is conditional you will need to work towards meeting the conditions of your offer. These requirements may include English language scores, degree results and satisfactory references.

There may be occasions where due to unforeseen or unavoidable circumstances it becomes necessary to make significant changes to a course or to withdraw it or part of it, for example a particular unit/module. Such action could become necessary if for example the following were to occur:

- a member of staff leaves the University and we are unable to find a suitable replacement (e.g. with the requisite academic knowledge/experience)
- a professional body or regulator/accreditor requires changes to be made to a course or withdraws their accreditation of a course
- changes have to be made to reflect legislative changes/requirements
- changes have to be made to reflect changes in standards set by relevant regulators and/or in keeping with best practice or developments related to the particular discipline/subject area
- student feedback clearly indicates that immediate changes be made to a course or unit
- unexpected low recruitment to a course or unit/ module means it is simply no longer viable or practical to run it.
