



Masters Stage Award / MSc

This Masters Stage Award is ideal if you already hold graduate membership (postgraduate diploma equivalent) from the Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development (CIPD) or have demonstrated that you meet the knowledge requirements, typically a postgraduate diploma in HR, HRM or HRD. In most cases this allows you direct entry to this award.

The focus is on strategic integration of human resource management through application via the dissertation and supporting research methods workshops.

If you already have a strong interest in human resource management and its various aspects, then you might be interested in this course. Potential applicants will mainly fall into two groups. The first group includes those who have worked in HR for a number of years and now feel it is time to provide some academic coherence and theoretical underpinning to work they have been undertaking for some time; they believe a masters qualification will further enhance their progression to more senior positions within organisations. The second group are those people who are relatively new to working in HR in a professional context and who believe that they have reached the juncture where a masters degree in human resource management will improve their prospects in the labour market.

While the masters stage award is typically undertaken on a parttime basis, a full-time option may be available for suitably qualified applicants.



Postgraduate Certificate / Postgraduate Diploma / MSc

This course is designed for practising managers wishing to develop their careers in the field of risk management. It will equip you with the skills and knowledge demanded by employers and gives you a competitive edge in your career. If you hold a relevant degree, or equivalent qualification, it is a chance to explore advances in risk management. While financial risk has always been a key area, international trade, cyber security, reputational risk, risk of terrorism, and natural disaster have all led to the need for risk to be considered in a wider context than the previous financial risk focus.



The Postgraduate Certificate in Academic Practice (PGCAP) has been designed to support you in developing your higher education teaching practice, and provides an opportunity to reflect upon your role in higher education in the company of others facing similar challenges.

The PGCAP will provide you with the opportunity to explore the latest teaching practices in higher education and how these are applicable in your own context. The PGCAP will not 'transmit' to you a model of teaching that is considered to be effective, but rather will actively support you to develop your own philosophical position and establish your own style that is honed by the demands of the subject, the learning needs of your students and the constraints of the learning environment.

The course will also support you in developing your ability to reflect critically on your practice, including drawing on theory as well as feedback from others, including your students. The emphasis of the course is on the ongoing development of your practice.

Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) / **School Direct PGCE**

Our Primary BEd and Primary PGCE Teacher Education courses were inspected by the Office for Standards in Education (OFSTED) and both courses were judged to be Outstanding (Grade 1) in 2015.

Teaching is a challenging, rewarding and fascinating career. Our PGCE Primary Teacher Education course aims to prepare you for entry into the teaching profession, developing your expertise in teaching children aged either three to seven years or five to 11 years. There are two awards: Postgraduate Certificate in Education or Professional Graduate Certificate in Education, depending on attainment in the academic aspects of the course. Both awards include Qualified Teacher Status (QTS).

This course gives a high priority to school-based learning and to developing your abilities of analysis. evaluation and autonomous learning and development. The PGCE course is planned and taught in partnership with a range of primary schools and early years settings. You will be placed in at least two different schools and will engage in taught lectures and seminars. In school placements, you will work alongside experienced teachers to develop your understanding of how to promote learning and a love of learning with your class.

In preparation to meet the teachers' standards, and therefore be recommended for Qualified Teacher Status, you will develop your knowledge, skills and professionalism in a supportive learning environment.

Develop your critical thinking skills in order to enrich vour practice as a Special Educational Needs (SEN) Co-ordinator on this government-approved course for part-time learners. Research-active staff and students from a wide variety of educational settings enrich the learning experience.

Gain the National Award for SEN Co-ordination (a statutory requirement for new SENCOs in post since 2009) on this government-approved course. You will be supported by highly experienced and research-active teaching staff, who are attuned to the needs of part-time students. From content delivery to the way in which staff and students communicate, the course is designed to suit those who are currently working. Students come from a wide range of settings, from early years to higher education, and are encouraged to bring their own professional experiences into the learning environment. Current research underpins the teaching on this dynamic course, which combines theory with practical exercises. Students also benefit from guest speakers, both the university's own alumni and professionals from different areas of education.

The curriculum consists of direct teaching plus guided independent study. It is aimed at qualified teachers, teaching assistants and SENCOs as well as disability advisers and those in student support settings. The key focus is dyslexia, although the curriculum will also touch on disorders such as autism, ADHD and dyspraxia.

Learning is tailored to students who are concurrently in employment, and staff are empathetic to the needs of part-time learners, an ethos that has moulded the content delivery as well as modes of staff-student communication. The curriculum is delivered by experienced teaching staff with specialisms. The School of Education is research-active, which means your learning will be underpinned by the latest research and analysis. There is a great emphasis on critical thinking and you will be encouraged to question and think independently in order to come up with solutions to support students with specific learning difficulties. Youwill be encouraged to bring your

own professional experiences to discussions, to enrich the learning experience for all students.



Certificate in Professional Studies (NMC Award) Level 7

On this flexible course you will gain a Nursing and Midwifery Council-approved qualification that enables you to supervise students at a higher level within your employing organisation. Study is underpinned by opportunities to implement your learning in your own practice.

On this flexible, part-time NMC-approved course you will combine study with practical learning to gain the Practice Teacher Award. Supported by a team of teaching staff with strong professional backgrounds, you will study a double module that reflects the current developments in benchmarking for practice teaching.

During the course, students are required to attend the university on four separate study days. The NMC stipulates that students complete 30 days in total. therefore there are also four designated independent study days to provide you with time to reflect, read and consolidate your learning. The remaining 22 days will be spent engaging in teaching and learning activities in practice (including two observed teaching sessions), which might include preparation, lesson planning, one-toone tutorials, mentoring and informal teaching in the workplace. These hours will be logged. In addition to the support you receive from your practice mentor, you will be supported by a specific member of our experienced teaching team.

The part-time programme allows for a flexible approach to study and gives you the opportunity to implement your learning in your practice while you gain knowledge.

This intensive course is a fast track to becoming a Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC)* registered social worker. The programme balances an interactive study programme with practical work experience in a social care setting to complement theory with practice.

This programme will enable you to become qualified as a generic social work practitioner, allowing you to practise in your chosen field of children and families or adults, and across a range of areas including statutory, voluntary, private and independent sector.

The course has been designed in partnership with agencies and service users, to allow students to gain the skills and experience required to qualify as a social worker. It is delivered in blocks of teaching followed by periods of practical work experience, allowing students to consolidate their study in a real-life setting. You will be supported by a team of committed teaching staff, who are registered social workers with experience in a range of professional settings. On the course, the learning experience is dynamic, interactive and experiential. You will learn about all areas of social work practice with adults and children, acquiring your knowledge with a variety of learning styles. With emphasis on experiential learning, your study will include working in small tutorial groups, simulations, role play and groupwork.

The placements you undertake must be in different service areas, to broaden your perspective and experience. The university has good connections and there is a wide scope of opportunity for placements within Gloucestershire and beyond. On graduating, you will have a clear understanding of social work and will have demonstrated your skills and values in social care settings.

On completion of the programme you will be eligible to apply for registration with the HCPC as a Social Worker.

» Applied Ecology

Postgraduate Certificate / Postgraduate Diploma / MSc

Our course provides students with the advanced knowledge and skills required for employment in all areas of practical ecology and conservation.

Students follow a curriculum with a highly practical emphasis and undertake hands-on exercises in field and laboratory settings.

In the field, you will cover identification skills for a wide range of species as well as industry-standard survey techniques such as phase 1 habitat surveying, habitat condition assessments, national vegetation classification and bird territory mapping. Laboratory sessions will include use of microscopes in taxonomy and analysis of environmental parameters, such as water oxygen levels and soil nutrient status, to enable better understanding of species-environment interactions.

There will be numerous opportunities to work on projects with linked organisations, including wildlife trusts, nature reserve managers, charities and public authorities, with the expectation that assignments, and especially dissertation work, will have direct impact on the understanding and management of species and habitats. There is the option to take a residential field trip; this currently takes place on a wildlife reserve in South Africa.

The course is underpinned by the applied research expertise of the teaching team in applied ecology, including conservation of species, biotic responses to climate change, bird and mammal biology, insect behaviour and evolution, non-native species introductions, population and community ecology, and environmental biology.

An additional theme of citizen science develops awareness of the role of public engagement in surveying and conserving species in the wider environment



Postgraduate Certificate / Postgraduate Diploma / MSc

Throughout this programme we emphasise the real-life application of your criminological knowledge.

Modules on specialist academic themes explore issues at the forefront of contemporary criminology.

You will engage with tasks such as Rapid Evidence Assessment, or analysing historical case file materials on sexual offences, thus developing valuable skills for working in relevant areas of the public sector or third sector organisations.

You will also undertake a work-based research project. This will normally be focused on current concerns and needs of a host organisation, and will collect and examine evidence that can be used to shape effective professional practice. This work benefits from our strong links with a wide range of bodies offering opportunities for collaboration including: Gloucestershire Constabulary; the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Gloucestershire: Restorative Gloucestershire; and charities providing support and training around domestic violence, homicide. stalking and sexual offences; and community organisations active in crime prevention and reduction initiatives.

You will be encouraged and supported to enrich your learning beyond the formal curriculum, helping you to explore ideas for your dissertation and opportunities for your future career. You are invited to participate in the work of the Centre for Learning and Innovation in Public Protection including the Homicide Research Group and the Sexual Violence Research Group; to attend field visits to criminal justice or community institutions including prisons; and to volunteer with partner organisations.

There will be the opportunity to attend a residential field trip to explore a specialist theme such as community policing or restorative justice – recent trips have included Belfast, Cornwall and Toronto, Canada.*

The MSc in Criminology is suitable for students wishing to extend their knowledge and skills gained in an undergraduate degree in criminology or other social sciences discipline. The Postgraduate Certificate in Public Protection is also available (see page 105).

»Forensic Psychology

Postgraduate Certificate / Postgraduate Diploma / MSc

On this course you start to build the skills required to make the transition from psychology graduate to forensic psychology professional.

As you develop your understanding of the practitioner's role in the investigative and legal processes and in the assessment and treatment of offenders, you will also learn how to engage in the reflective practice that is essential to maintaining professional competence and integrity. You will build up a portfolio of materials based on practical activities undertaken in seminars and on field visits to locations such as courts and prisons. The course benefits from a programme of guest lecturers, who contribute specialist insight from their work in different forensic settings.

Assignments are designed to replicate typical tasks undertaken by professional forensic psychologists, such as undertaking an offence analysis, identifying treatment targets, and developing a case formulation for proposed interventions. You will be expected to be able to communicate complex material for different audiences. As your final project, you will undertake research and present your findings in the format of an academic journal article.

A particular focus is on issues surrounding the commission, detection and prosecution of sexual offences, and the management and treatment of sex offenders. You will examine the research evidence on topics such as multiple perpetrator sexual offending,

sexually motivated murder, and male victims, considering how this underpins a sound approach to assessing risk and formulating treatment plans



» Public Protection

Postgraduate Certificate

This course is designed to meet the needs of professionals currently working in this field, or those intending to do so.

The focus is on enhancing practitioners' understanding of current issues in public protection, and developing their capacity to undertake their own research to underpin evidence-based practice.

Topics typically covered include domestic abuse and homicide, stalking, sexual violence, child abuse, child sexual exploitation, honour-based violence, trafficking and modern slavery, hate crime, elder abuse and missing persons. By reviewing the current understanding of best practice in multi-agency working, risk assessment and threat assessment, the programme offers valuable professional development opportunities for those working in the criminal justice sector, victim organisations, advocacy roles, and a range of public services careers.

Participants develop their research skills, by conducting a live project to explore key issues relevant to their own employer or another organisation, generating new knowledge that can be applied directly to practice. Examples of recent projects include examination of the barriers faced by women with learning disabilities in recognising and reporting sexual violence, scoping the value of a panagency stalking clinic in the county, effectiveness of the MARAC process in safeguarding high-risk domestic abuse victims, and the prevalence of autistic spectrum disorders within child sexual exploitation offenders.

The programme benefits from the innovative work undertaken within the Centre for Learning and Innovation in Public Protection at the university, including the application of research findings to the design of training and tools for frontline service delivery and development. We invite a wide range of guest lecturers to speak on their own professional practice, drawing on our strong links with police forces, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Gloucestershire, public sector organisations and charities providing support and training around domestic violence,

The modules on this award are also available to students studying the MSc in Criminology. On completion of the Postgraduate Certificate, you could choose to progress to the Postgraduate Diploma or MSc in Criminology (see page 98). There is also the option of taking an individual module as continuing professional development (CPD).

Postgraduate Diploma / MSc







BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES

MA or MSc by Research / MPhil / PhD

The university offers a broad range of research opportunities in biological sciences, encompassing theoretical and experimental science in both field and laboratory settings. Projects generally use a range of field, laboratory and analytical methods, providing excellent training and preparation for future careers.

RESEARCH AREAS

Ecology and Environment

Biotic responses to environmental change; impacts of non-native species; environmental biology; conservation ecology. Recent research projects include: modelling the effects of climate change on bird distribution; assessing plant responses to elevated carbon dioxide; investigating the prevalence of parasites in small mammals; use of thermal imaging to improve surveying of antelope; devising optimal survey methods for bats

Biology of Taxonomic Groups

Social insect behaviour and evolution; avian biology; mammalian biology (including equine). Recent research projects include: the thermal biology of leafcutting ants; the effect of worming treatments on horses; the incidence of disease in seabirds.

Microbial and Molecular Biology

Disease biology and microbe-host interactions in animals; parasite biology; microbial ecology bioinformatics. Recent research projects include: the bacterial communities of penguin feathers; bird nests and their effect on breeding success; waste and disease management in leafcutter ants; molecular profiling of natural killer cells; avian immunogenetics; epigenetic inheritance.

Citizen Science and Public Engagement

The use of volunteer 'citizen science' data in ecology and zoology; the public understanding of science. Recent research projects include: nationwide flying ant survey to map distribution of swarms; documentation of occurrence of house spiders through "spider in da house" app; and an international survey of starling murmuration behaviour (all in collaboration with the Royal Society of Biology); the accuracy of the public in recording animal behaviour (in collaboration with the Wildfowl and Wetlands Trust).

With around 200 participants working across five continents, the Doctorate in Business Administration (DBA) programme is one of the largest of its kind in Europe. It is also recognised by the European Doctoral Association in Management and Business Administration (EDAMBA).

This programme is for executives able to engage in major projects inside their employing organisations. It benefits you, makes a contribution to knowledge, and can significantly develop your organisation.

You can address a wide range of research topics, from consumer behaviour to management accounting, or leadership to production control. The key is that you are able to develop doctoral work that has relevance to theory and practice.

The DBA is a structured route to doctoral-level achievement. The initial pre-thesis modular element lasts 18 months, after which you present your formal research plan. You then enter the thesis phase, which lasts a minimum of a further 18 months. At its conclusion, you present and defend a thesis in a viva voce exam. You achieve an understanding and perception of managerial work that is difficult to obtain by other means. The DBA provides a vocational and professional doctorate that is better suited to your needs, and that of your industry, than a more traditional PhD.

DBA classes are limited to a maximum of 20 participants who benefit from a collaborative learning environment.

The University of Gloucestershire's EdD attracts a diverse range of educational professionals. Students work across a range of education sectors including higher education, local authorities, schools and colleges, and early years settings.

The EdD enables students to both challenge and enhance their practice through engagement with relevant theory, policy and empirical research. There are taught sessions in groups and individual one-to-one supervisions in addition to visiting international professors and fellows, who enhance provision.

The EdD is in two phases, the taught phase and the thesis phase. The taught phase comprises a range of modules that introduce students to methodical. political, philosophical, sociological and epistemological concepts that will underpin issues that emerge from the professional context. This taught phase immerses students in a supportive community. The taught phase comprises four modules - two with academic content, two focused on research methods. During the thesis phase students work on a subject area of their choice and are supported by two supervisors.

On successful completion, participants will be able to:

- demonstrate a critical awareness of the conceptual frameworks relevant to their chosen focus of study (eg inclusive education, educational leadership or other aspect of education), and show a critical review of alternative models
- develop strategic thinking and critical analytical thought to improve and guide their own, and others', practice



MSc by Research / MPhil / PhD

Research opportunities in psychological sciences are offered in a range of applied and theoretical fields. You will benefit from high-quality supervision and a diverse range of expertise in the subject area.

RESEARCH AREAS

Applied cognition, knowledge, learning and emotion

Assessing situational awareness using EEG; decision-making in fireground, medical and military contexts; nonconscious processes in decision-making and the influence of knowledge, emotion, attentional or response bias: self-regulatory focus and the effect of social values on experiences, emotion and wellbeing; neurological correlates of psychopathy; use of virtual reality technologies in experimental psychology; biological psychology including the role of hormones in behaviour and emotional experience.

Professional Doctorate DSE

»Sport and Exercise

The Professional Doctorate in Sport and Exercise has been designed for sport and exercise professionals who are interested in engaging with major projects within or beyond their organisation. It benefits you, makes a contribution to knowledge, and can significantly enhance your organisation and/or industry.

You will develop advanced skills in critical thinking and you can engage with a wide range of topics, for example those based on applied sport performance, clinical practice, health promotion, applied sports coaching and community engagement. The programme provides a focus for 'embedded scholarship' within a range of sport and exercise professions. You will attain the standards required of any doctorate and produce a substantial and original study that identifies you as an independent researcher.

The DSE is a structured route to doctorallevel achievement. The initial pre-thesis element comprises two taught modules over a period of 18 months, after which vou present vour formal research plan. Having completed your research project, you submit and defend a thesis in a viva voce. Linked to the real-world relevance and original nature of the project, the DSE provides an understanding of issues in the sport and exercise professions that it is difficult to attain through other means. Compared with a more traditional PhD, the DSE provides you with a vocational and professional doctorate, well suited to your needs and those of your industry.

DSE cohorts are limited to 8-20 participants, to preserve the quality of the taught experience in a collaborative and supportive learning environment.

MODULES IN THE TAUGHT PROGRAMME

Reviewing and Critiquing Literature

This module is a continuous development throughout the pre-thesis phase of the programme. You are guided to develop practices of deep ongoing reflection on your business experience, research topic and broader contexts, including communication skills. Through encouraging a systematic engagement with a substantial body of relevant literature, you will be able to critically analyse and evaluate previous research work using theoretical frameworks and literature review approaches.

Research Design, Analysis and Interpretation of Data

The role of methodology and review approaches, critique tools and techniques by which knowledge can be generated and applied is examined. You are guided to explore the methodological schools that characterise sport and exercise research, to establish their applicability to your work. You're introduced to theoretical frameworks and the many approaches to analysis and interpretation common to sport and exercise doctoral work. A range of analytical and interpretative approaches are considered that derive from both the natural and social sciences. You will use various data analysis packages to analyse and interpret data. The module provides you with opportunities to practise and reflect on the tensions that are likely to occur in engaging with a piece of professionally related research.



We have special interests in socio-scientific approaches to Biblical studies; New Testament theology; the Bible and the visual arts; and the Bible and spirituality. We welcome applications in these areas.

The research areas of theology, biblical studies and religious studies at the university attract research students from around the world. Recent students have come from the USA, Australia, Canada, India, South Africa, Japan, Germany and South Korea, as well as the UK. Our strengths in Biblical studies led to the development of the International Centre for Biblical Interpretation.

We offer opportunities for interdisciplinary research within humanities and also across the university. It is possible, under certain conditions, to do a research degree in Theology and Religious Studies by international distance learning (in your own country).


