WE'VE BEEN GOING A LONG TIME

LJMU can trace its roots back to 1823 and the foundation of Liverpool Mechanics' and Apprentices' Library. We've come a long way since then, becoming a university in 1992 and we are now ranked as 59th in the UK*.

Liverpool Mechanics' and Apprentices' Library:

With their mantra of 'knowledge is power', it's not surprising that some critics thought the mechanics institutes were dangerous, revolutionary establishments.

Liverpool Mechanics' Institute and School of Arts:

Classes were initially restricted to men but within a decade of opening women began to attend lectures too. In the 1880s it became one of the first art schools to let female students draw life models, both male and female.

Liverpool School of Pharmacy:

The First World War brought an influx of female students who, according to the School's Principal 'Humph' Jones (pictured below), were easier to teach (and much tidier) than their male counterparts.

School of Science (1861) and the Colleges of Technology (1892-1969):

The founder of the first science college in Liverpool studied alongside the inventor of the Oxo cube in Germany.

Florence Nightingale called Fanny Calder (pictured below) the 'patron saint of laundry, cooking and health'.

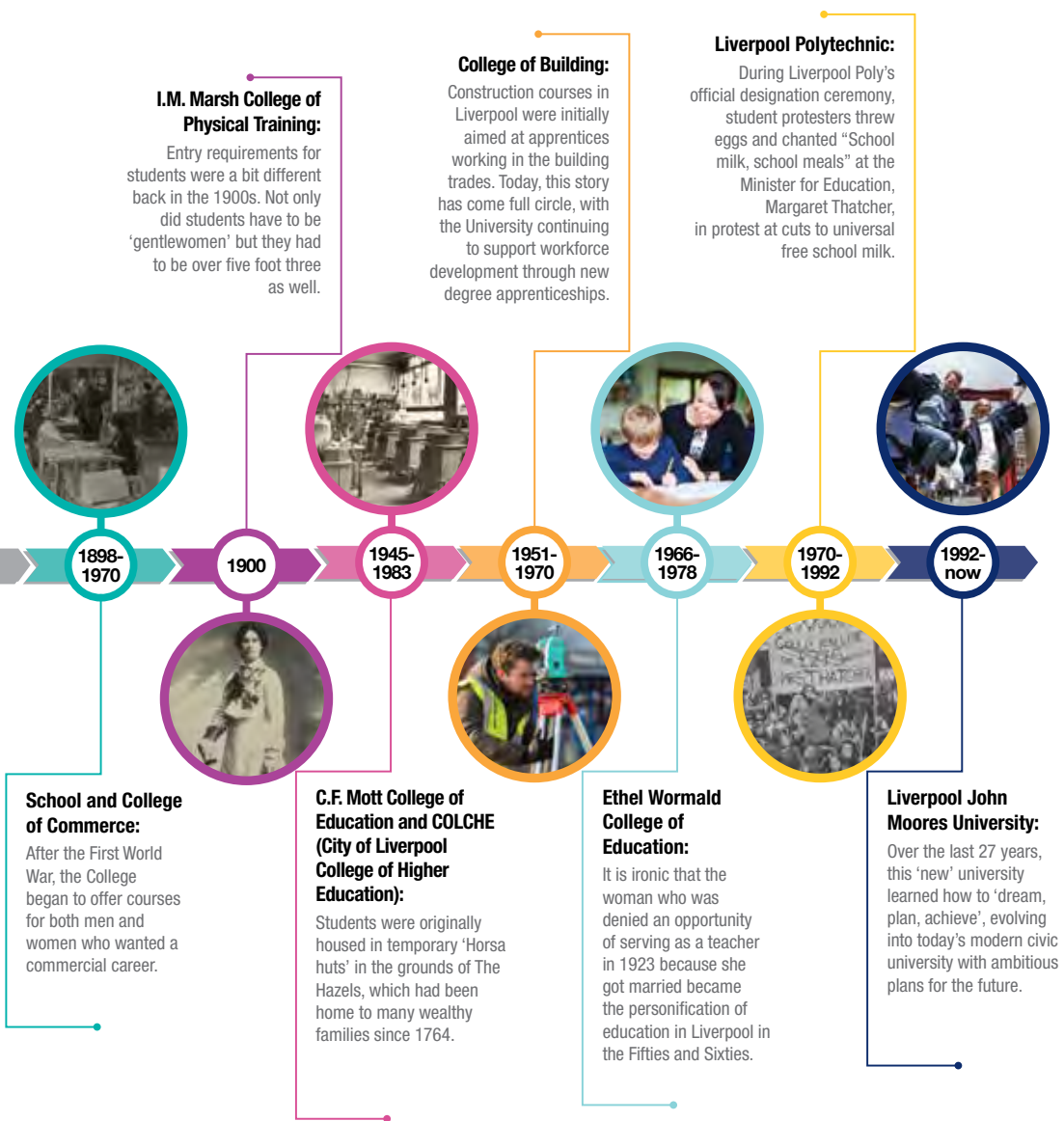

CITY CAMPUS

Home to the Faculty of Engineering and Technology, Faculty of Science, School of Nursing and Allied Health and Public Health Institute.

The City Campus, situated in the heart of Liverpool, is close to some of the city's most impressive attractions, comprising of the Walker Art Gallery, Central Library, World Museum and St George's Hall. Teaching buildings include the James Parsons Building, Henry Cotton Building, Tom Reilly Building and Avril Roberts Library.



MOUNT PLEASANT CAMPUS

Home to the Liverpool Business School, Liverpool School of Art and Design, School of Humanities and Social Science, Liverpool Centre for Advanced Policing Studies and School of Education.



FOOD AND DRINK

You are what you eat and Liverpool has it all. From specialist shops selling halal and kosher foods, to the oldest Chinatown in Europe, with stops available for Greek, Japanese, Russian and everything in between, a journey around the city is a mouth-watering trip. There are cool cafés, well-stocked supermarkets, reasonably-priced restaurants and excellent eateries to suit every taste and budget. The city also has a huge choice of pubs, nightclubs, alcohol-free bars and coffee shops where you can enjoy great conversation, music and much, much more.

MUSIC

Liverpool artists have enjoyed over 50 UK number one singles! As the 'world capital of pop', it will come as no surprise that a great music scene exists in the city. What are you into? Our annual festivals include Liverpool Psych Fest, Africa Oyé, Sound City, Homotopia,

Brazilica and Liverpool International Music Festival (LIMF). You can listen to live music in a host of venues and pop-up spaces in town too, from subterranean clubs to the world-class M&S Bank Arena.

SHOPPING

We are all shopping on a budget, but no matter if yours is large or small, you'll find what you are looking for in Liverpool. From the high street stores and designer outlets in Liverpool One and Met Quarter, to the independent boutiques on Bold Street or markets in the Baltic Triangle, Liverpool is the place to go shopping. ART AND CULTURE

The city celebrates the diversity of its artistic community each and every year with Liverpool Arabic Arts Fest, Liverpool Irish Festival and Brouhaha (our very own carnival); just three examples to

give you a taste of what's to come. Liverpool's creative past, present and future is equally as diverse and celebrated, with the world-renowned collections of the Walker Art Gallery and Tate Liverpool, to the works on display at the Open Eye Gallery, FACT, Bluecoat and Biennial.

GREEN SPACES

We love our parks and green spaces and you will too once you start to explore the likes of Sefton Park (home of Africa Oyé and LIMF) and Crosby Beach (look up Anthony Gormley's 'Another Place'.) 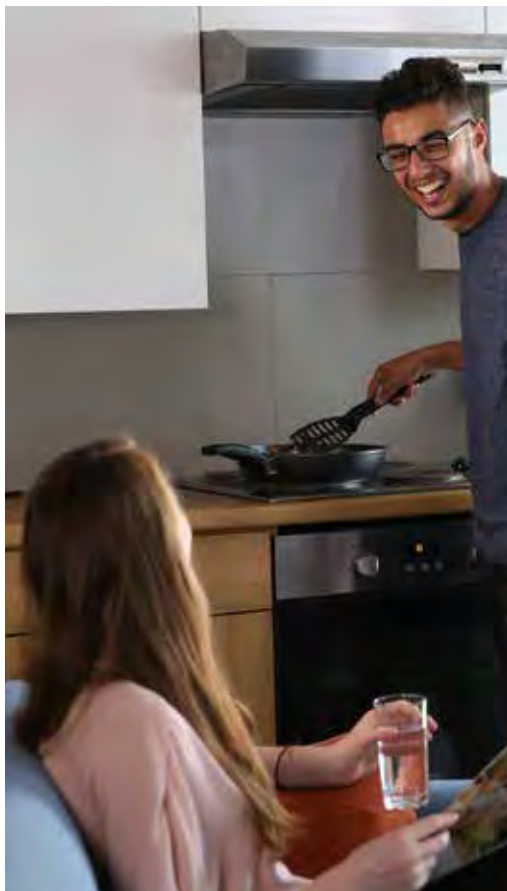

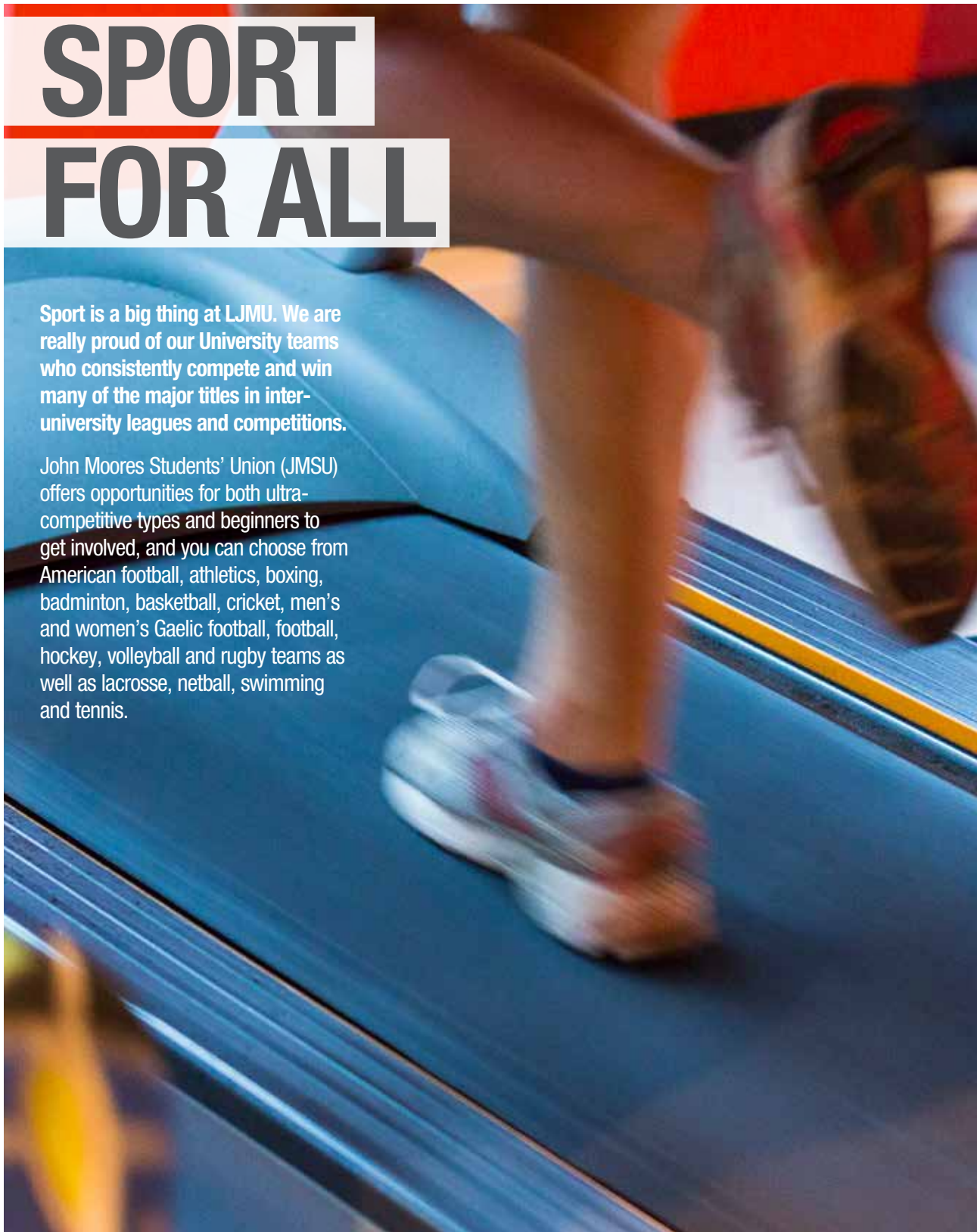
WHERE WE ARE

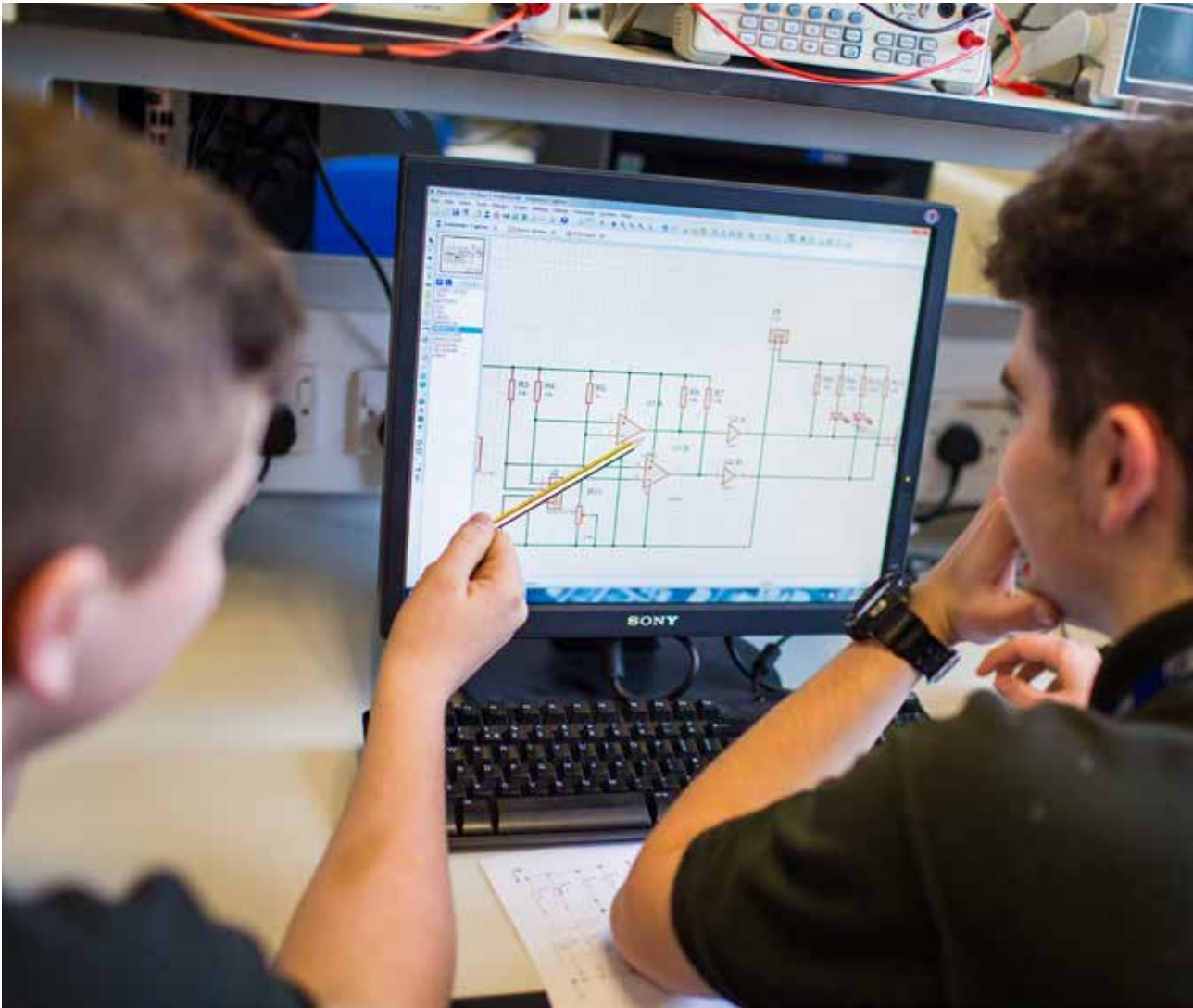

You will face two main expenses when embarking upon a university education – **tuition fees** and your **living expenses**. The good news is that you can receive help for both in the form of loans, bursaries and scholarships.

THE **FACTS** ABOUT WHAT YOUR UNIVERSITY EDUCATION WILL COST AND HOW YOU CAN PAY

- You will be charged a tuition fee for every year of your course. In 2019 LJMU will charge a tuition fee of £9,250* for all full-time undergraduate degree programmes.
- You don't have to pay tuition fees up front – subject to eligibility, you can take out a tuition fee loan for each year of your course. This is paid direct to the University.
- You can also take out a maintenance loan to cover your living expenses such as rent and food. This loan is paid direct to you in three instalments.
- Dependent upon where you live in the UK, you may also qualify for grants for living costs too.
- You don't start paying back your student loan until you have left university and are earning over the threshold. The current threshold is £25,000 for students from England and Wales, £18,330 for students from Northern Ireland and Scotland.
- Your monthly repayments will be a percentage of your earnings and are not based on how much you borrowed from the Student Loans Company.
- You may also be eligible for additional funding that doesn't have to be paid back, but this depends on your household income.
- LJMU offers a fantastic range of targeted support for students from lower income households plus scholarships for talented and academically gifted students.
- Targeted support is also available for students with disabilities, students with children or students who have been in care or are estranged from their families.

Funding figures relate to students normally resident in England. Different funding arrangements will apply if you are from Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland or the EU. For further information visit the following websites:

The University reserves the right to increase fees up to the maximum permitted by law or Government policy in the second and subsequent years of your course. Generally, these fee increases are linked to RPIX inflation (Retail Price Index excluding mortgage interest payments.)

STUDENT FUNDING

TUITION FEE LOAN

You will be charged a tuition fee for each year of your course.

In 2019/20 the University will charge full time, home, undergraduate students a tuition fee of £9,250. This fee is subject to an annual inflationary increase.

There is no need to pay your tuition fees up front as eligible students can apply for a tuition fee loan for each year of their course. This loan is not means tested which means your household income will not affect your eligibility.

Your tuition fee loan will cover all of your tuition fee costs and will be paid direct to LJMU.

IF YOUR INCOME FALLS BELOW £25,000* (e.g. IF YOU GO BACKPACKING) YOUR LOAN REPAYMENTS WILL AUTOMATICALLY STOP



MAINTENANCE LOAN

In addition to a tuition fee loan, full time undergraduate students can also apply for a maintenance loan to cover their living costs. If you're eligible, you can take out a loan for each year of your course. The amount you receive will depend on your household income. This money will be paid into your bank account in three instalments and it's up to you how you budget for your living costs.

REPAYING YOUR STUDENT LOAN

You start paying back your student loans the April after you graduate or leave university, and start earning £25,000* or above. Repayments are based on a percentage of your salary, not how much you have borrowed from the Student Loans Company.

COST OF STUDYING

LJMU is committed to ensuring that students understand the full cost of studying at the University. Your tuition fee will cover or contribute to, as appropriate, expenses associated with your core modules, including:

- Safety equipment, such as lab coats and goggles
- Uniforms for nurses, paramedics and other professional placements
- UK field trips and other educational visits
- Student exchanges
- DBS checks (Disclosure and Barring Service, formally CRB)
- Professional sector regulatory body membership

DISABLED STUDENT ALLOWANCE

If you declare a disability or medical condition to LJMU, you can access specialist support and guidance to assist you during your studies. This can be anything from exam and study support to mobility and library support.

The Disabled Student Allowance (DSA) is designed to help meet the extra course costs students can face as a direct result of a disability, ongoing health condition, mental health condition or Specific Learning Difficulty. DSA is paid on top of the standard student finance package and does not have to be paid back.

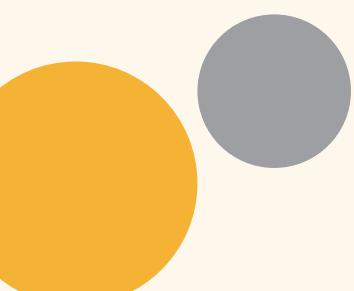
Eligible students receive a cash bursary of up to £1,500 per year of their course, in addition to funding awarded by social services for looked after children (LAC) if applicable.

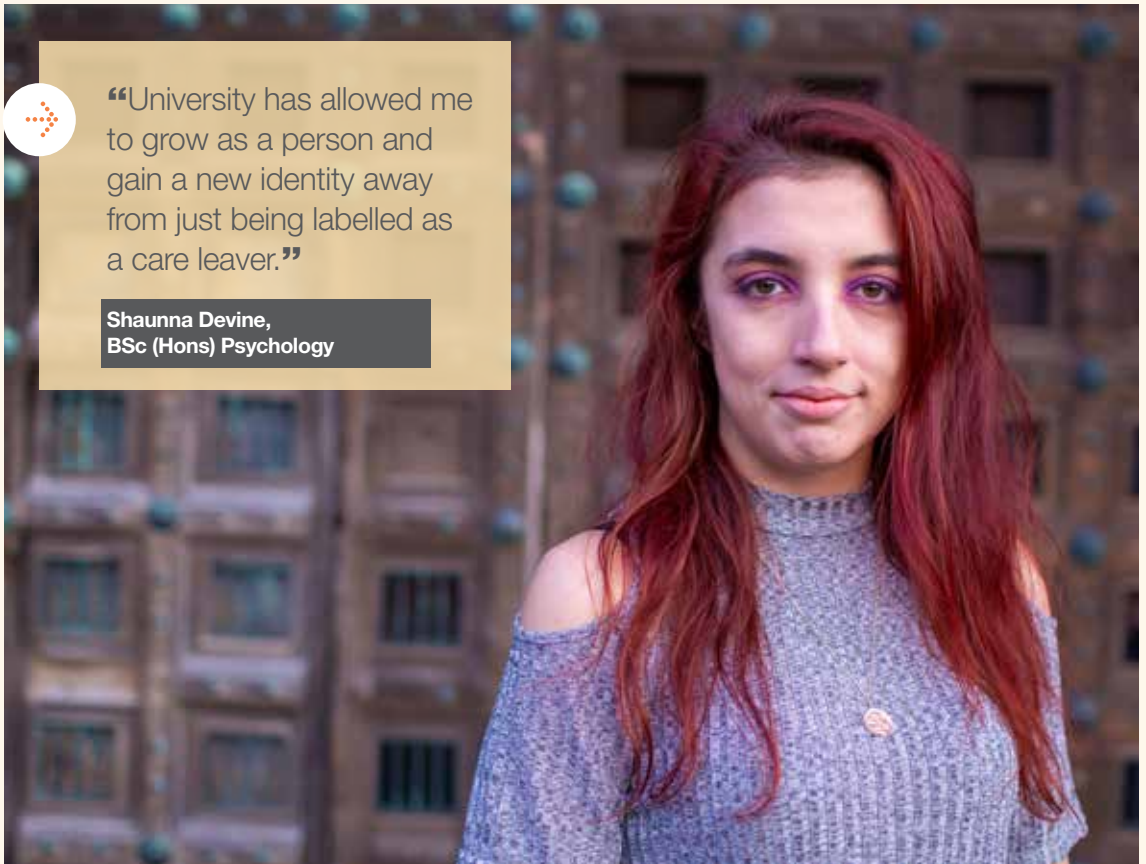

REWARDING STUDENT SUCCESS

The best thing about LJMU scholarships is that they are awarded for more than getting great exam results. They are also awarded in recognition of personal achievement, through voluntary and charity work, extra-curricular school and college activities and attainment in sport, music and much more.

All you have to do to be considered is complete LJMU's scholarship application form. If your application is successful, you will receive a scholarship worth either £1,000 or £10,000 per year*. The money you receive doesn't have to be paid back and you get to choose how you spend it.



VICE-CHANCELLOR'S SCHOLARSHIP

A highly prestigious award for outstanding students; a maximum of 5 awards of £10,000 per year.

SIR BERT MASSEY SCHOLARSHIP

Recognising Sir Bert Massey, national disability rights champion and alumnus of LJMU. We are looking to award £10,000 to an outstanding disabled student who has campaigned for or championed inclusion in some way.

COMMUNITY EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIPS

For excellence in areas such as volunteering, sports, the arts or citizenship; a maximum of 100 awards of £1,000 per year.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Rewards academic excellence (at least 3 A grades at A2 or equivalent – 144 UCAS points); 100 awards available, £1,000 per year for the duration of your course.

CATHEDRAL SCHOLARSHIP

A number of music scholarships involving the organ and piano are available as part of the University's partnership with Liverpool Anglican Cathedral. These outstanding opportunities will consist of one to one tuition with nationally acclaimed music staff from the Cathedral. In addition to music tuition discretionary payments will be made to cover any out of pocket expenses. Awards will be offered on an annual basis in the first instance.

LJMU BURSARY

The LJMU bursary is automatically paid to eligible students every year of your course – you do not need to apply. The annual LJMU bursary is currently £500.

LJMU bursaries are additional funding that you don't have to pay back. How you spend it is up to you, though this money is intended to help you meet some of the costs of being a student.

To qualify you must meet the residence requirements for student funding (grants and loans) and have a household income of £25,000/year or less. You must also be paying the annual maximum university tuition fee.

STUDENT SUPPORT FUND

Sometimes despite your best efforts you can find yourself in financial difficulty. This could be due to a delay in funding or unforeseen circumstances. LJMU's Student Support Fund is available to students who find themselves in such a position.

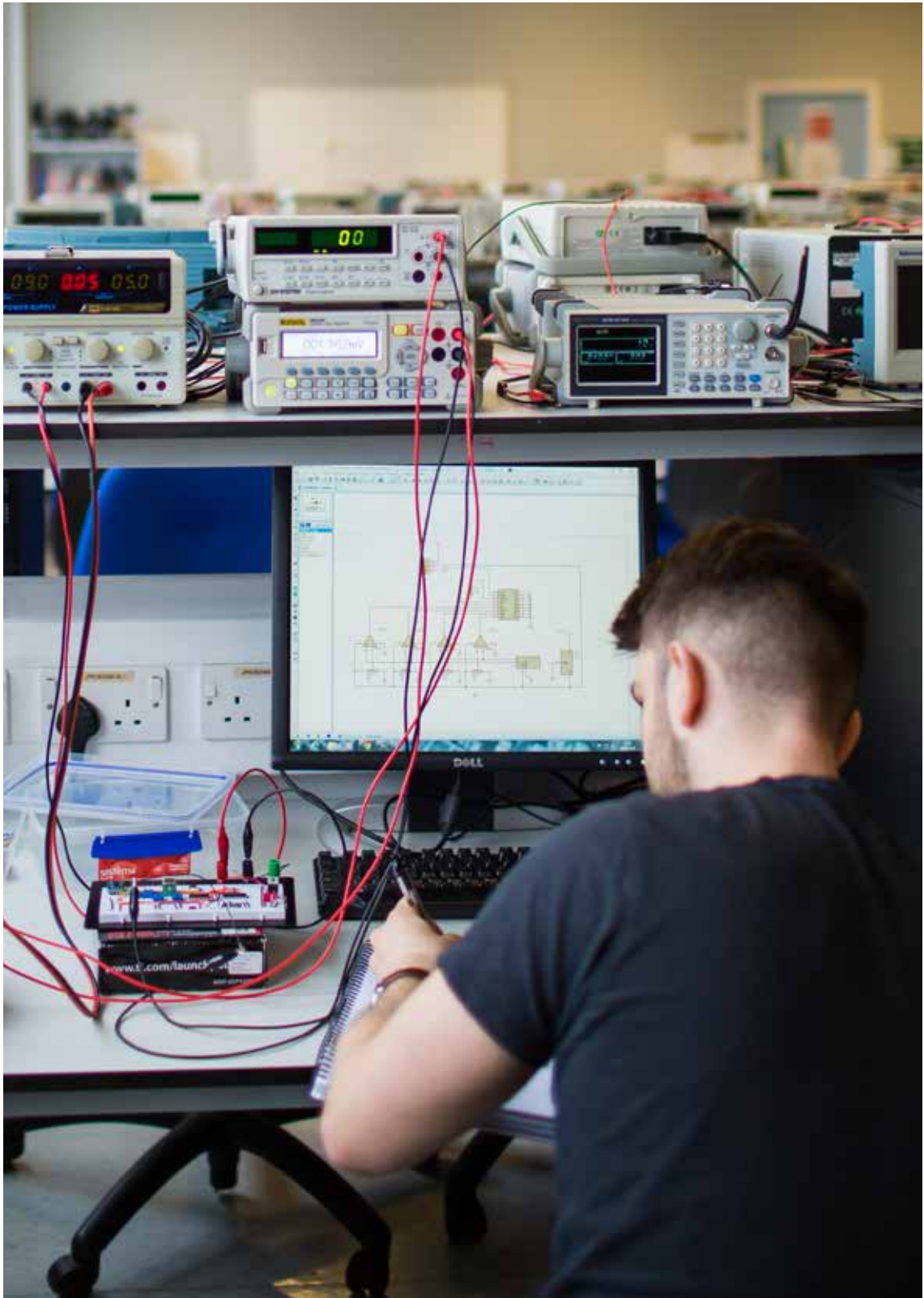

If you'd like to go to university but would also like the opportunity to gain skills in the workplace, a degree apprenticeship could be just what you're looking for.

Under the apprenticeship scheme, an employer will sponsor you through university so you can carry on working and gaining relevant skills and experience while studying towards your qualification.

Why should you study towards a degree apprenticeship?

- You'll gain a Bachelors degree (Level 6) or a Masters (Level 7)
- You'll work with experienced professionals who can provide insight into the sector
- You'll earn a wage and complete your studies without having to pay tuition fees
- You'll develop practical skills and knowledge – the kind of skills and knowledge you can only gain while working with professionals in your field.

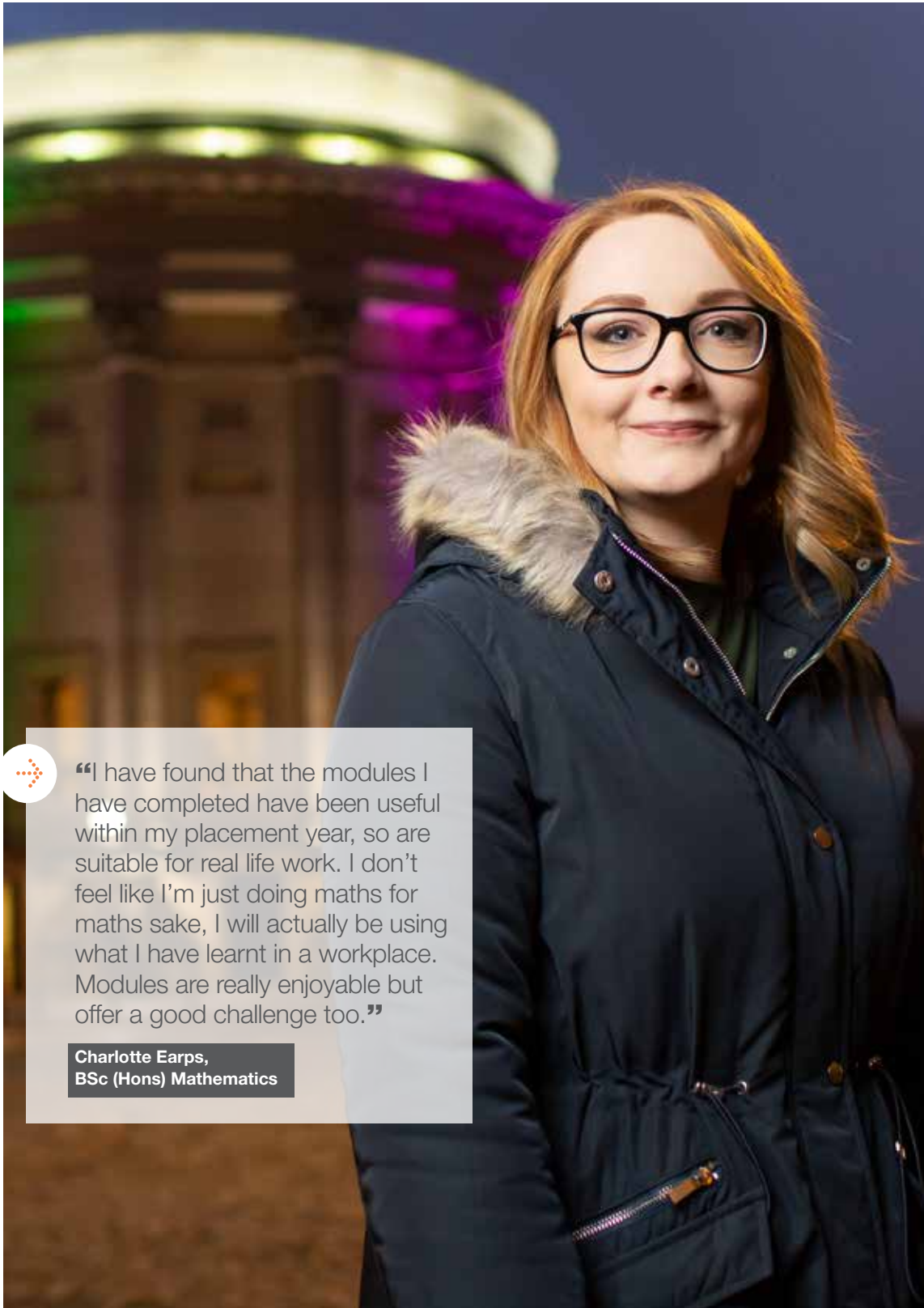
As a degree apprentice you will study at LJMU on a part-time basis and your studies will take between four and five years to complete. The degree apprenticeship programme combines academic study with LJMU - supervised work experience with your employer and a relevant professional body assessment.

FOUNDATION YEAR DEGREES

DO YOU HAVE THE ABILITY TO STUDY FOR A DEGREE, BUT NOT THE QUALIFICATIONS?

If you are full of drive and ambition but don't have the qualifications to enter directly onto the programme of your choosing, then one of our foundation year degrees might be the ideal option for you.

The way they work is simple - once you pass the foundation year you progress directly onto the first year of the honours degree. This means that you will be studying for a minimum of four years, which may increase to five if your course of choice has a sandwich year as part of the degree.

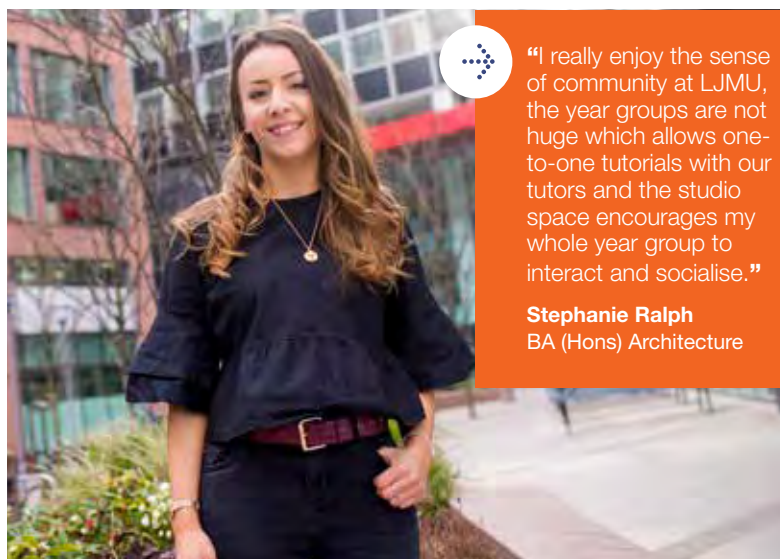

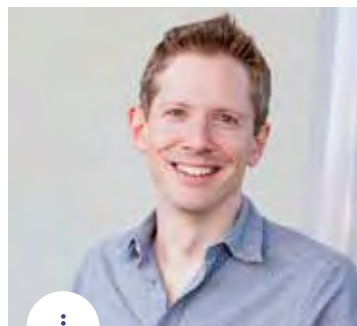

Our Astrophysics (MPhys) and Physics with Astronomy (BSc Hons) courses are taught jointly with the University of Liverpool, meaning that you will have access to the expertise and facilities of both institutions and will be learning from world-leading academics. CHEMISTRY

Chemistry is the study of matter, its properties and reactions and the use of such reactions to form new substances.

On the BSc (Hons) Chemistry course you will investigate how chemistry can be applied creatively to everyday life and the problems of 21st-century society. You will study the core topics of inorganic, organic and physical chemistry, with an additional focus on analytical chemistry. You are therefore provided with a traditional education in chemistry alongside modern high-technology applications.

The study of biochemistry bridges chemistry and biology and will appeal to you if you are interested in the biochemical workings of living organisms, cellular metabolism, genomics and proteomics and the biochemical nature of disease. The BSc (Hons) Biochemistry course draws on the different disciplines of cellular biology, physiology, genetics, microbiology, molecular biology and medical biochemistry. On the BSc (Hons) Biotechnology course you will explore the manipulation of biomolecular processes to develop technologies and products that address global challenges in health, food and the environment.

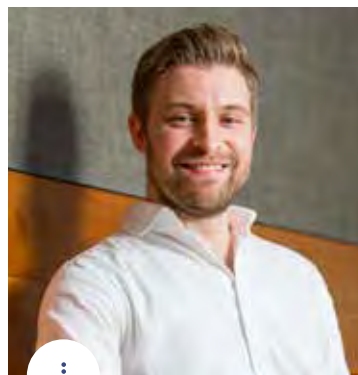
Forensic science is all about using the power of scientific analysis to resolve legal disputes. It requires a sound knowledge of the analytical methods of biology and chemistry combined with training in crime scene investigation, as well as a basic knowledge of law and how to assess the value of evidence.

On these highly-practical degrees you will gain experience in using industry standard equipment in state-of-the-art laboratories, to ensure you have those all-important skills that employers are looking for. You will also have the option to complete a year out in industry and will undertake a final year project.

CAREERS

As a chemistry graduate, you will be able to work in a wealth of different fields, including: chemical and related industries – fine chemical, pharmaceutical, polymer, petrochemical, energy/power, biotech, food/fragrance, cosmetic and healthcare; patenting, accounting and the financial sector; and academic research and teaching. Career prospects for biochemistry graduates are diverse and you will have the opportunity to pursue a career working for pharmaceutical companies and the food, cosmetics and toiletries industries. Studying Biotechnology offers an excellent springboard into careers as diverse as biopharmaceutical manufacturing, drug discovery and development, food technology and biofuel production.

Forensic Science graduates are qualified to work in forensic analysis, such as police scientific laboratories, independent forensic science providers, pharmaceutical companies, the chemical industry and hospital laboratories.

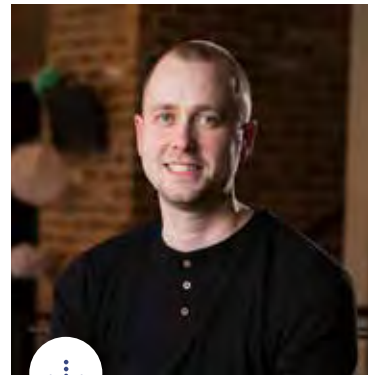

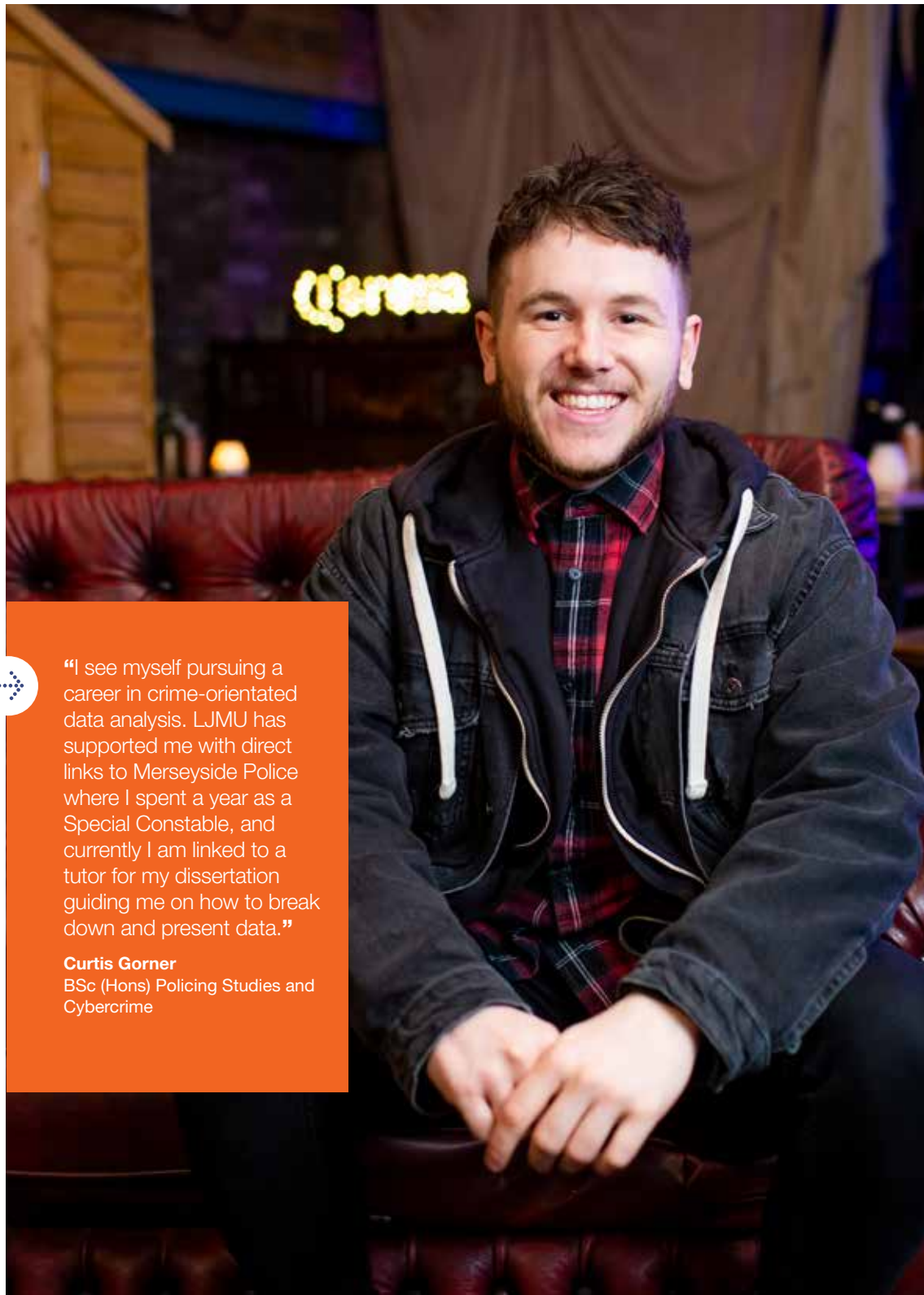

Understand the causes of crime, its impact on society and what makes society tick.

What do we mean by the terms 'crime', 'criminals', 'punishment' and 'justice'? How do social variables such as age, class, disability, gender, beliefs and ideologies impact on social life? The two disciplines share many similar themes and through them you can explore contemporary issues, controversies and current debates in the field, with a local, national and international outlook.

Studying criminology or criminal justice will allow you to understand how crime occurs, who commits it, how it is measured and how it impacts on the lives of different social groups. You will look at crime and related issues and examine society's responses to crime and justice.

Studying sociology allows you to delve into the makeup of society; exploring the history and legacy of sociology while developing insights into current and emerging problems, such as social division and inequality, social policy, culture and globalisation.

Depending on your course, you may have the opportunity to undertake local or international fieldwork, complete a work-based placement with a local organisation, employer or agency or experience 'out of classroom' learning activities, including educational field visits.

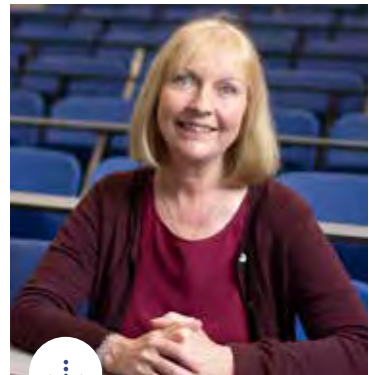

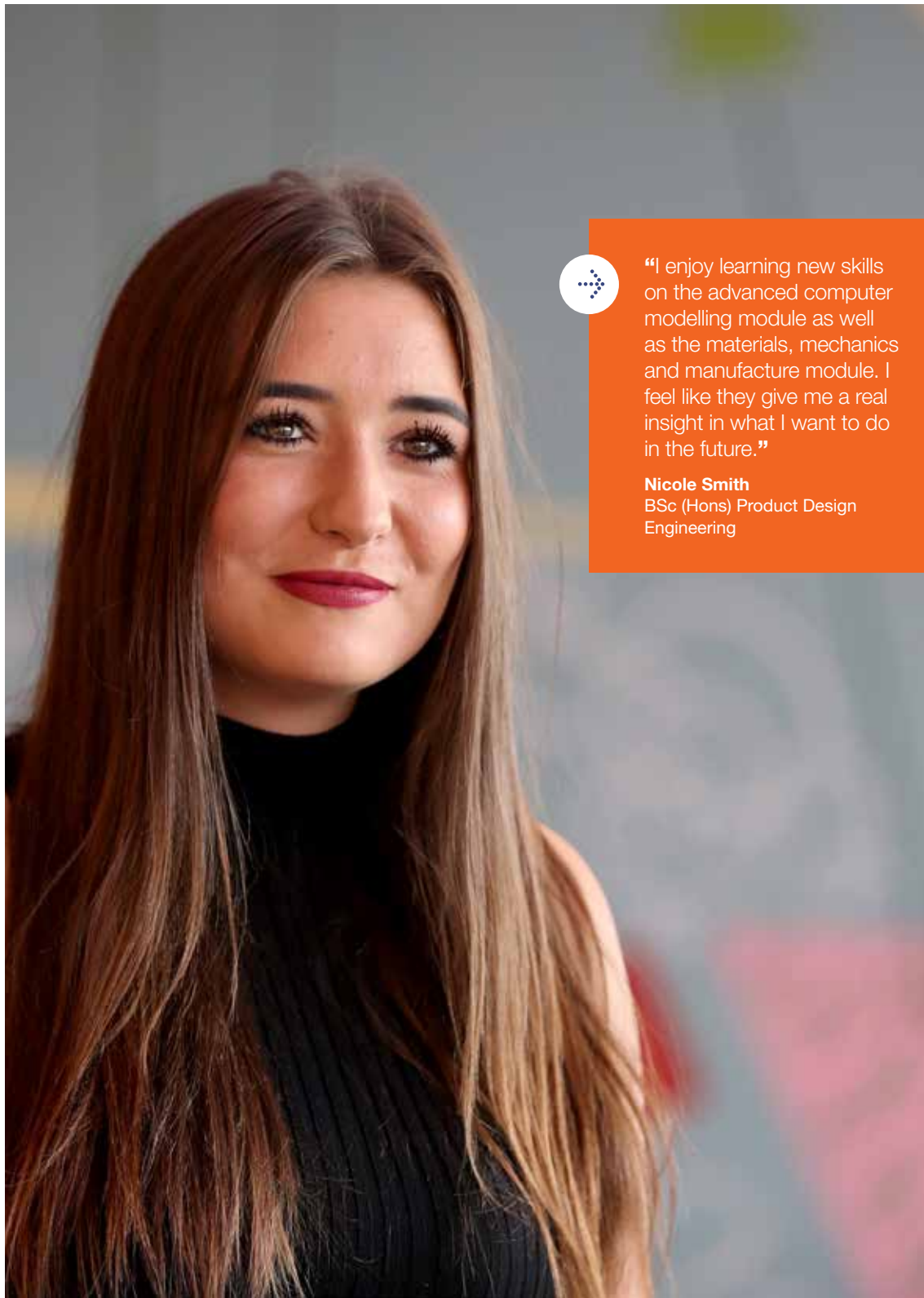

Use the power of science to help solve crimes, resolve legal disputes and uncover the secrets of the past.

Forensics is a wide and diverse area of science, which intersects with a number of disciplines to provide graduates with a variety of career options.

Forensic scientists spend a large proportion of their time in the lab, carrying out drug spot tests, analysing fingerprints, processing crime scenes and analysing DNA. If you are interested in applying forensics in a specific setting, our Policing Studies and Forensics degree will develop your knowledge in modern day UK law enforcement, while working in the forensic science labs to understand the forensic techniques used by police forces to solve crimes.

Forensic anthropologists are involved in the recovery and identification of human remains for repatriation and legal purposes. You will take part in extensive hands-on fieldwork and laboratory work, including the excavation of medieval human burial sites in Cheshire and analysing human skeletal remains in our state-of-the-art labs.

Whichever route you take, you will receive an excellent learning experience, which prepares you for a variety of fascinating and rewarding careers.

CAREERS

Forensic companies, police departments, universities, museums, industry and government laboratories all recruit forensic science graduates, while secondary science teaching is also a popular route.

Forensic science graduates are qualified to work in independent forensic analysis for police scientific laboratories, independent forensic science providers, pharmaceutical companies, the chemical industry and hospital laboratories. You could be based in a variety of locations, such as a laboratory, office, in the field or on crime scenes.

There are also many opportunities for students who graduate in computer forensics. The wide variety of fields includes data mining, forensics applications development, the police, intelligence, security or computer forensics initiatives, network security management or education.

GEOGRAPHY AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Geography is the study of where we all live, the surface of the earth; it examines the development of climate, soil, water and landforms and how we as humans affect these natural processes and interact with and influence the world around us.

Environmental science encompasses wildlife conservation, which is the study of ecology, genetics, evolution, animal behaviour and environmental sustainability and how to apply these to conservation practice.

At the heart of these courses is the chance to apply your knowledge in a practical context, meaning that you don't just study in a classroom but outside where it really matters. Fieldwork is integral to your experience with us and that is why trips to Spain, the Lake District, Snowdonia, Peak District and the North West coast are included in the cost of the Geography programmes. There are also additional opportunities for international field trips to places such as Crete, Santorini and Iceland*.

On the Wildlife Conservation course an overseas field skills trip (currently to Tenerife*) is included in the fees and there is also the opportunity for a self-funded overseas field expedition (currently to Costa Rica). Once in the laboratory, you will have access to the latest GIS software and state-of-the-art field and analytical equipment.

These courses are designed to ensure that you are work-ready once you graduate. We arrange regular geography careers events so that you can network with employers and there is also the option to undertake work placements.

Liverpool is the perfect base to study geography and wildlife conservation as we have a range of fantastic locations on our doorstep; if you want to study vocational degrees that allow you to grab your backpack and get outside, then come and join us.

CAREERS

The BSc (Hons) Geography course will equip you with a range of skills that are in demand in industry, local and national government, environmental consultancy, utilities, planning and regeneration. Recent geography graduates have found employment with the Environment Agency and local authorities and in the water industry as flood risk consultants and water supply and distribution advisers. Others have entered the geoscience industry working overseas in oil, gas and mining.

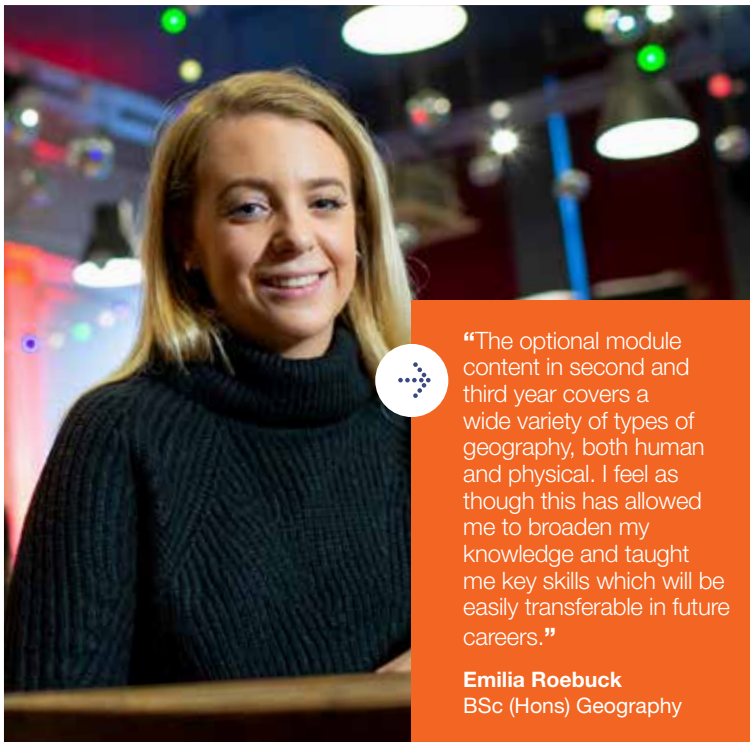

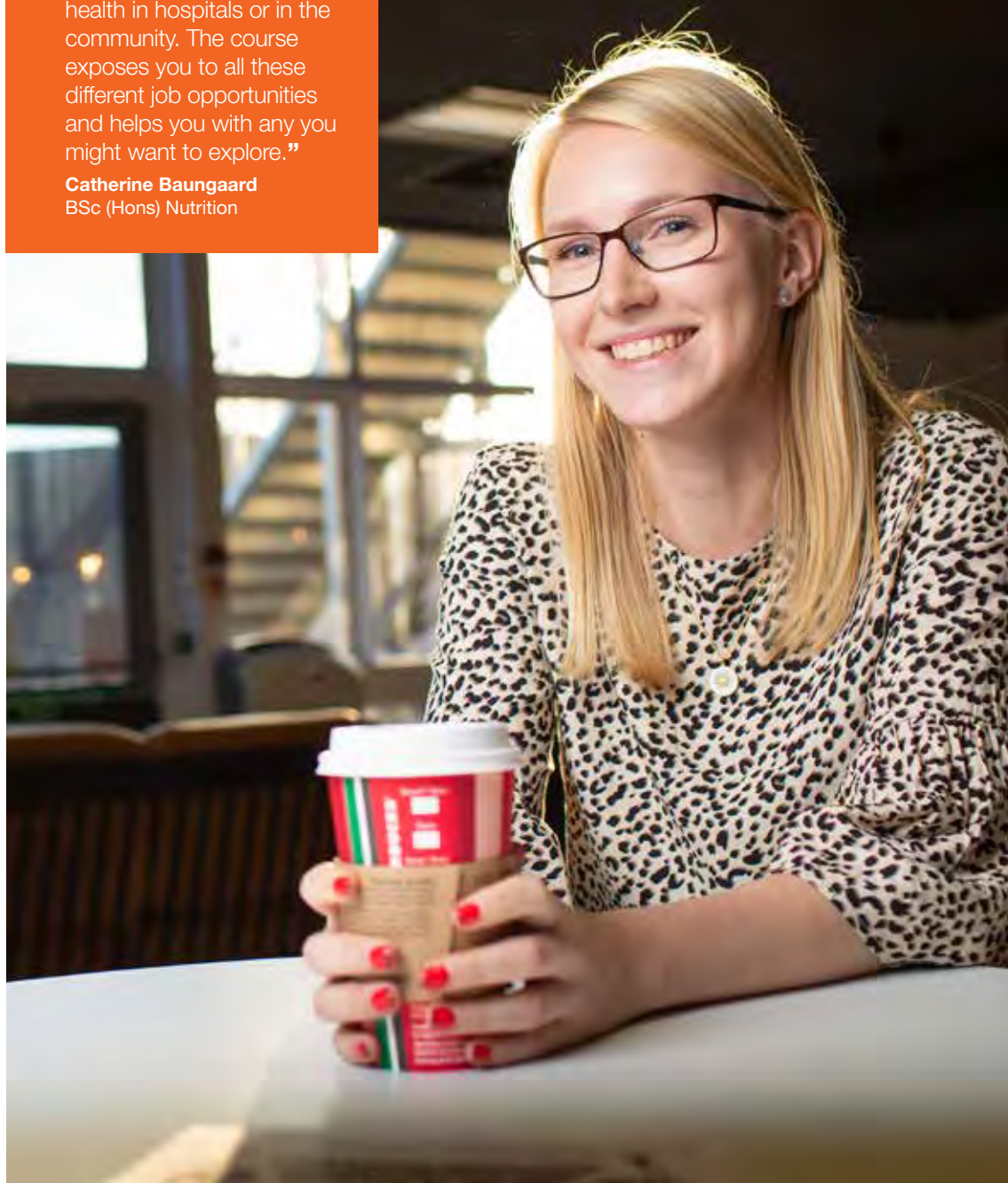

HISTORY

Are you brave, intrepid and willing to challenge preconceptions? If so, taking a degree in history will help you to discover the wonders of the past, compare different arguments and find your own version of events.

Our options mean you can study history as a subject in its own right or combine it with a love of art or literature. History seeks to understand people, places and culture in their historical perspectives and you will use a variety of art forms and sources to do this.

Our International Relations and Politics degree will encourage you to develop your own political voice and examine the actions of international organisations, nation-states and non-state actors, while giving you an essential grounding in international relations theory.

There are more museums and galleries in Liverpool than in any UK city other than London. With all this culture on your doorstep, we will ensure you make the most of it. Depending on the course you choose, there will be opportunities to work closely with local and national archives, such as the National Archives in Kew; heritage organisations or schools; get involved with our gallery in the Exhibition Research Lab; attend regular events and workshops with practitioners and experts or visit historical sites in Merseyside. Studying on our History of Art and Museum Studies programmes, for example, will provide you with opportunities to spend time in Tate Liverpool getting to know the curators and collections.

We also think it is important to understand the role of museums and galleries in an international context, so if you are studying one of our history degrees there will be further opportunities to explore this through your modules or through either international field trips or study abroad. This experience is vital for a future career in a range of diverse industries, from heritage organisations to galleries, archives to the media, administration to teaching.

History is a series of shifting interpretations; only by examining and debating the evidence left behind can we try to discover what really happened and how it links to the present. This is where you come in.

Our graduates can be found in a variety of roles and occupations ranging from advertising, marketing, museums, arts administration and publishing to industrial, retail, leisure and charitable organisation management, educational administration, accountancy, law, the social and Civil Services and teaching. 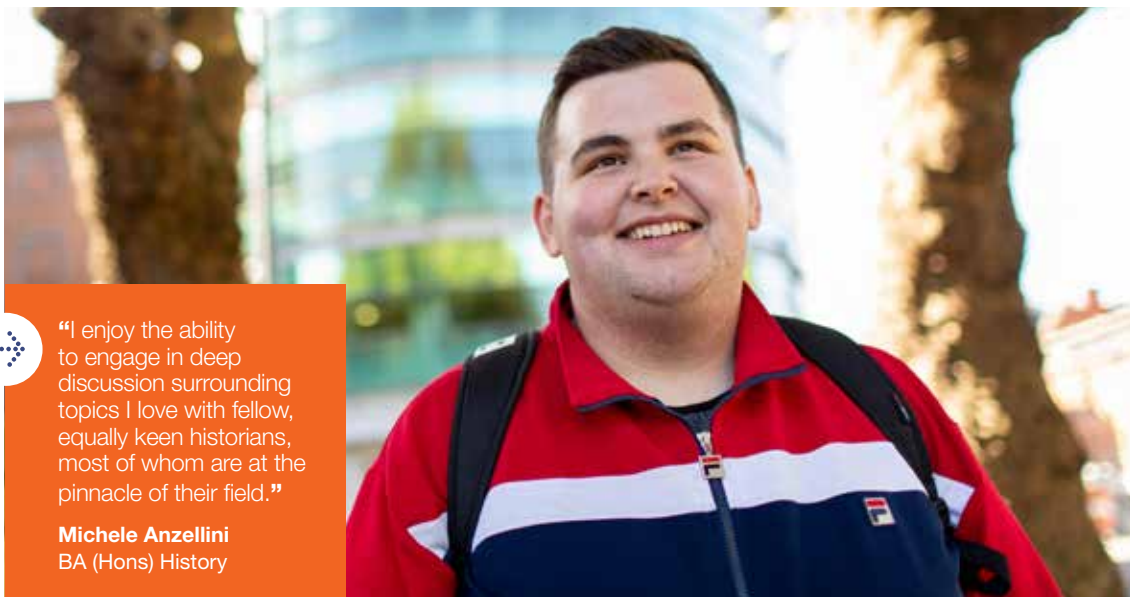

Learn the practical skills to succeed in these creative and competitive industries, from research-active staff and industry professionals.

Traditional skills now need to be matched by an understanding of all types of media and how it is produced and consumed. Technical media skills need to be complemented with an understanding of the business of journalism, media and film. 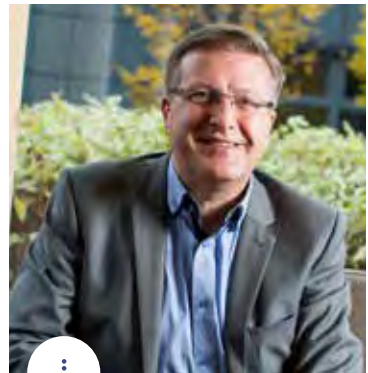

Midwifery students have the opportunity to follow a woman throughout her pregnancy, labour, birth and postnatal period.

If you're already practising in the UK as a paramedic or nurse, or you're an internationally-qualified nurse, our top-up degrees provide you with the opportunity to enhance your professional knowledge and existing qualifications, in order to provide effective, evidence-based care.

Whether your passion is for helping adults or children in acute or long-term care; providing mental health nursing support, or delivering essential physical, emotional, and psychological care to pregnant women and their families, our degree programmes will help you achieve your career goals.

With all of the real-world placement experience you'll have gained throughout your degree, and as our courses are approved by the professional governing bodies, you will graduate in a fantastic position to secure a job in your chosen field; whether that's nursing, paramedic practice or midwifery.

Our heritage and reputation speaks for itself; since 1849 we have been providing pharmacy education and delivering industry-relevant courses.

Pharmacy is about the design, production, testing and use of medicines and most pharmacists work with the public, providing medication and advice out in the community, in hospital ward clinics or in GP practices. Our MPharm Pharmacy course is accredited by the General Pharmaceutical Council and we have a status as a Royal Pharmaceutical Society Foundation Training School.

On the MPharm programme you will learn how new drugs are discovered, how they produce their effects and how they are manufactured. There is also a strong clinical strand in which you will learn how to examine and interact with patients and make sure that the right patients get the right medicines. We have excellent links with leading local hospitals that provide excellent pre-registration training and work placement opportunities.

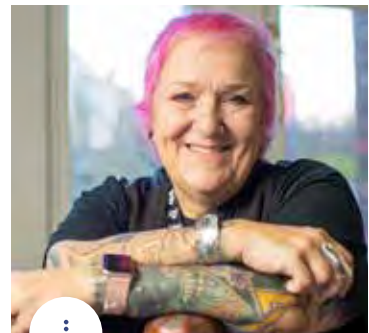
On these courses we will challenge you to critically explore contemporary policing issues and prepare for professional practice; learn technical, analytical and evaluative skills to be able to carry out computer crime investigations; carry out drug spot tests, analyse fingerprints, process crime scenes and analyse DNA; gather vital insights into the criminal mind, criminal justice system and British legal system; use the power of scientific analysis to resolve legal disputes or understand and develop key strategies for effective crime scene management.

We have a range of specialist facilities to help you to do this. Policing students will be taught in the Liverpool Centre for Advanced Policing Studies, a leading centre for research and learning which is devoted to supporting the needs of 21st century policing. Those policing students who want to know how to deal with emergencies and crowd disturbances will visit the Emergency Services Training Centre in Birkenhead, where they will be thrown in at the deep end in order to learn key policing and recovery techniques. Forensic science students will have access to specialist geophysics equipment for exploring burial contexts, plus forensic analysis and scene-of-crime labs. Our computing facilities are state-of-the-art and we have specialist forensics software, including FTK, EnCase and XRY.

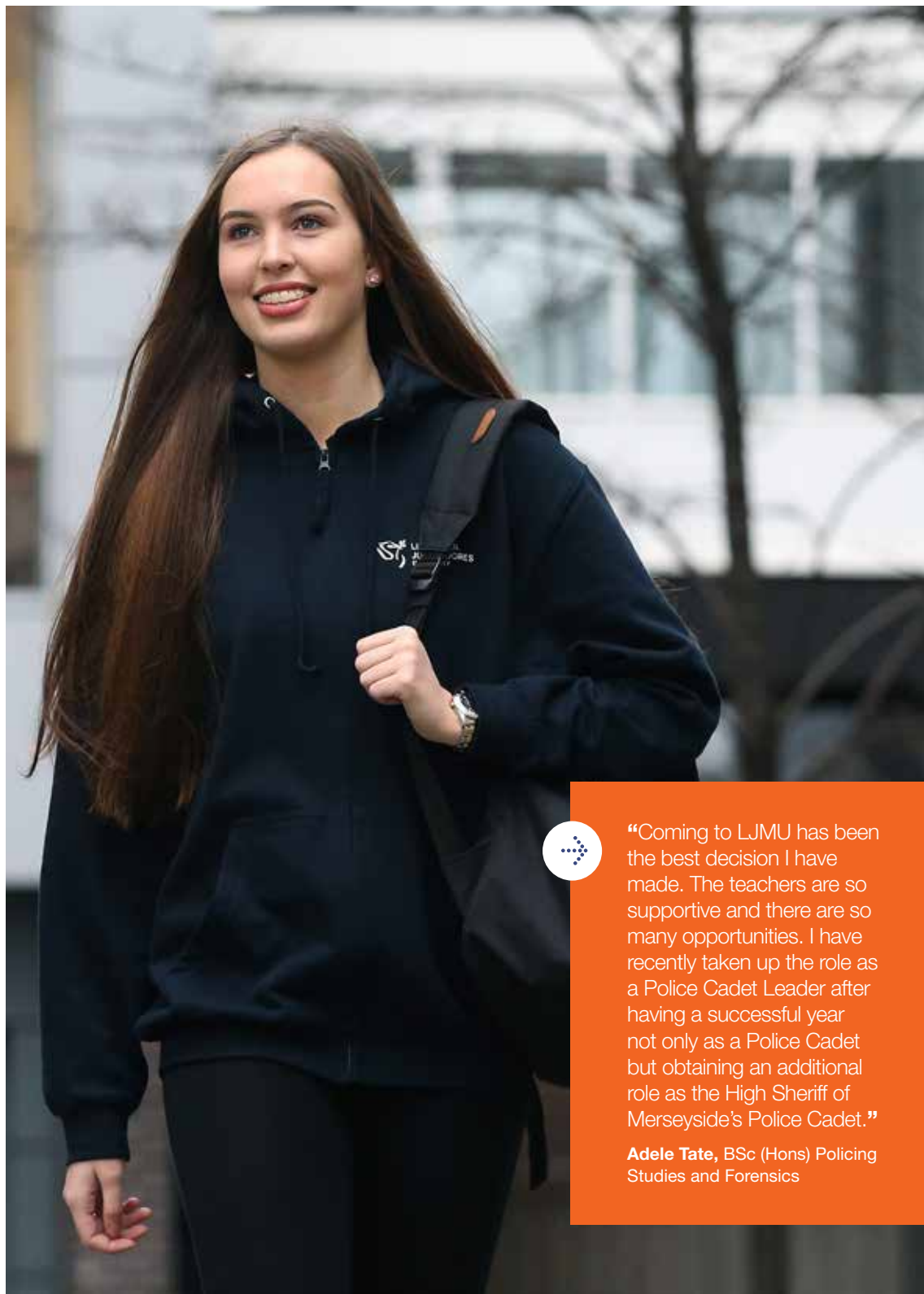

PSYCHOLOGY

Delve into the mind to unearth the patterns behind behaviour or learn how to help elite athletes to remove psychological barriers.

Understand the mental processes and behaviour of individuals and social groups, by looking at concepts such as thinking, memory, problem solving, emotion, development, communication and relationships. You will use a scientific approach to apply core psychological principles to a range of areas and – depending on the focus of your course – gain vital insights into the criminal mind, criminal justice system, sport, education, exercise, health, the British legal system or contemporary policing. You will be challenged to not only develop your knowledge and skills, but also your self-awareness, self-management and self-expression.

You could learn to improve performance in a wide range of people involved in sport; develop an understanding of the individual and what makes them tick; examine society's responses to crime and justice; understand how the human mind works in relation to criminal activity; develop a deep knowledge of the principles and best practice driving 21st century policing or explore the complex relationships involved in the criminal justice and penal systems.

All of our courses are accredited and on most you will have the opportunity to either undertake work placements or practical experiences with a variety of professional organisations and clubs or access state-of-the-art laboratories and facilities. This will give you the opportunity to develop transferable skills that are essential in the workplace.

Our courses provide you with an excellent springboard into a career as a sport, criminal or forensic psychologist, or in areas as diverse as teaching, the police, counselling, criminal justice and victim and witness support.

CAREERS

Psychology graduates can pursue a range of career opportunities and the course is an excellent stepping stone into many areas of psychology, from health and the caring professions to education, forensics and clinical and occupational practice. How do common laws govern our way of life? Who is more at risk of facing discrimination when going about their day-to-day activities? Why does literature and language affect the way we use social media when the meaning and intent are stripped away by distance?

Studying a social sciences degree at LJMU will help you make sense of our increasingly complex and multi-layered lives, while allowing you to apply your learning and transferable skills to the work place. It will also broaden your horizons and develop your thinking. Whether it is the study of law and your first steps on the legal career ladder; understanding how criminology intersects with the science of psychology to help us discern why crimes are committed; developing your own political voice and examining the actions of international organisations, nation-states and non-state actors; or the study of sociology and the way music, poverty and the rights of individuals are interlinked with our understanding of 'society'.

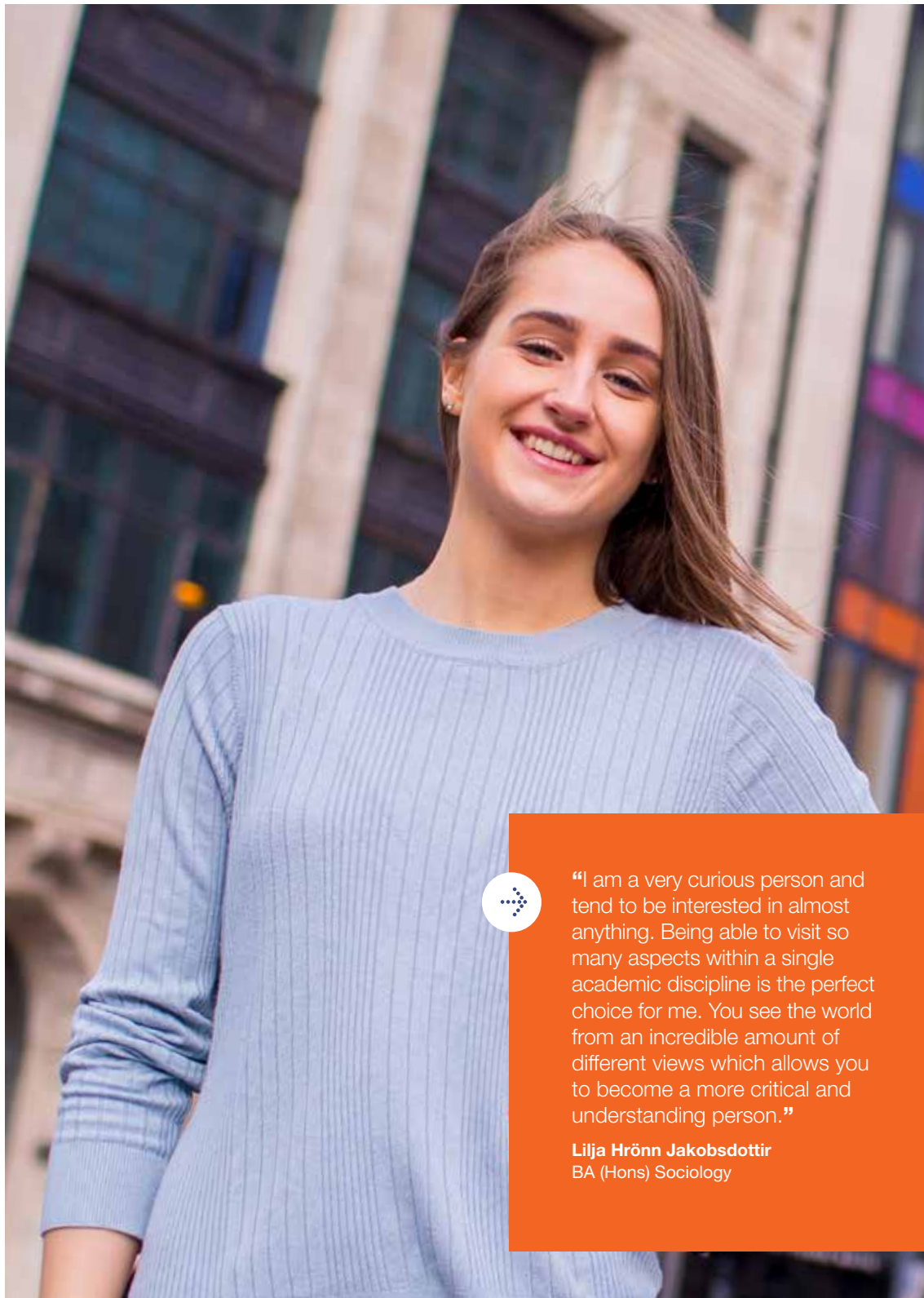

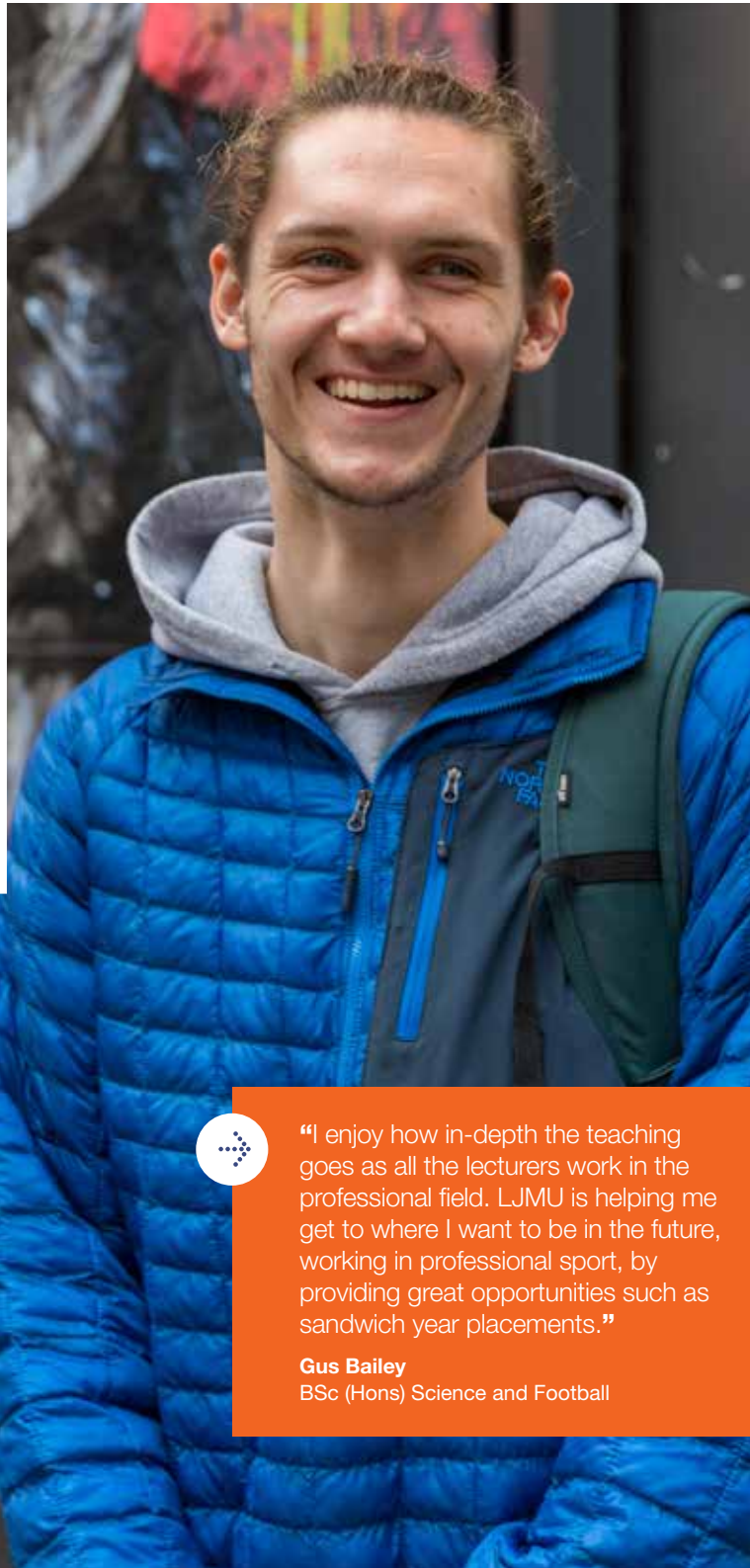

Applications for full-time undergraduate courses

To apply to study on a full-time undergraduate course at LJMU you will need to submit an online application through UCAS. The 'Apply' service at **ucas.com** allows you to fill in your application anytime, anywhere (please note: there is an application fee for this service and deadlines apply).

You have the option of choosing five courses on your UCAS application. You can apply for just one course or use all five choices; you can also apply for more than one course at any institution.

Filling in your UCAS application form

When we consider your UCAS application, your ability to achieve the entry criteria is just one of the areas we take into account. An important part of the application form is your personal statement, which is your opportunity to tell us more about yourself. You should include your skills, relevant interests and hobbies, along with why you want to study the course. Any work experience or voluntary work should be mentioned here, but don't just state where and when, tell us about what you have learnt and what you enjoyed. We are looking for motivation, commitment and enthusiasm. This is your opportunity to convince us why you would like to study at LJMU.

Occasionally courses listed here may change throughout the year; new courses may become available or courses may be changed. So please check the UCAS website **ucas.com** and the LJMU website **ljmu.ac.uk/courses** which contain the most up-to-date listings.

Universities receive applications throughout the year and applications may be considered outside the formal UCAS deadlines through UCAS Extra.

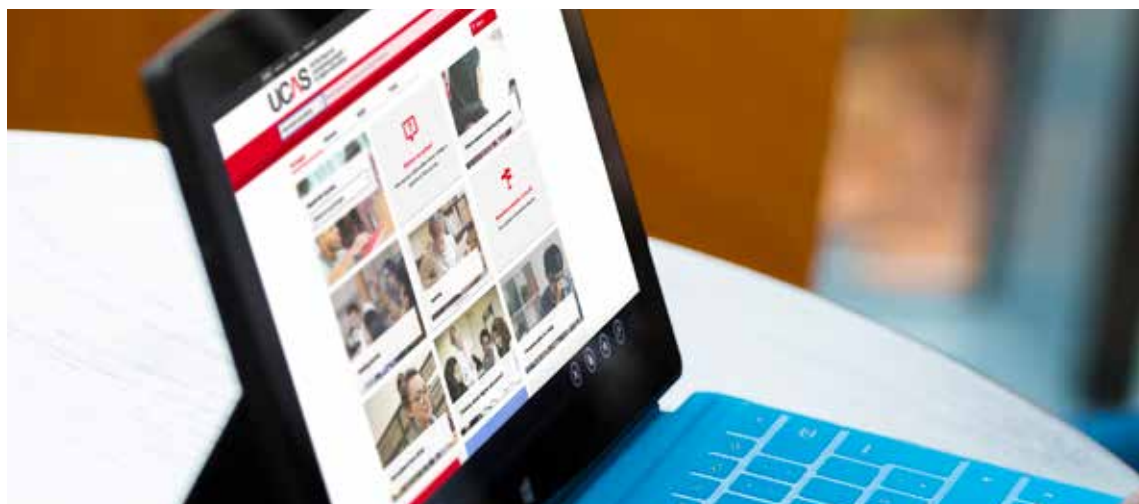

Mature and non-standard applicants, such as care leavers or applicants returning to education, will be considered on an individual basis and may be asked to submit an essay and/or attend an interview – contact the relevant admissions office for more information.

Minimum entry requirements

For all our courses there will be a minimum UCAS Tariff score requirement. In addition, many courses will ask for specific subjects and grades at GCSE and/or A level or equivalent. If a GCSE subject is required you will always need at least a grade C or Grade 4.

The offer process

There are a number of offers that we can make you.

- An unconditional offer - this will be made if you already satisfy the entrance criteria (i.e. you may be a mature student or already have the results of your examinations).
- A conditional offer - this will be made if you have yet to sit your examinations, and you will be advised of the grades and other criteria we would like you to fulfil.
- A changed course offer - if we have read through your application form and think that you would be best suited to a different course, we will contact you to offer you an alternative unconditional or conditional offer for another course. You do not have to accept this offer should you not wish to do so.

Applicant Day events

Once an offer has been made, we will invite you to a school-based Applicant Day, interview or audition where you will have an opportunity to meet current staff and students, see the facilities in more detail, and find out about our student accommodation.

Making your Firm and Insurance choices

Once you have received decisions back from all your choices, you will be asked to decide which two offers you wish to accept. You will have to choose which you wish to make 'Firm' (your first choice) and which you wish to make 'Insurance' (your second choice).

UCAS Extra

If you have applied for all your five choices through UCAS but are not successful in gaining a place or you have declined all the offers you received, you will be eligible for UCAS Extra. UCAS Extra runs from February to July.

Receiving your results

You will automatically be accepted if you meet the requirements of your Conditional Firm (CF) offer with LJMU. If you do not attain the required grades, we may still accept you on your chosen programme or offer you an alternative programme. If your application is unsuccessful you will then be considered by your 'Insurance' choice.

Clearing

Clearing is an additional opportunity to get a place at university, starting a course in September 2020. If you are late to apply, or do not fulfil the conditions of your conditional or unconditional choices, you can then enter the Clearing process. During Clearing you contact universities directly to establish if you can be accepted onto one of their courses. Clearing will take place during August, after exam results are released.

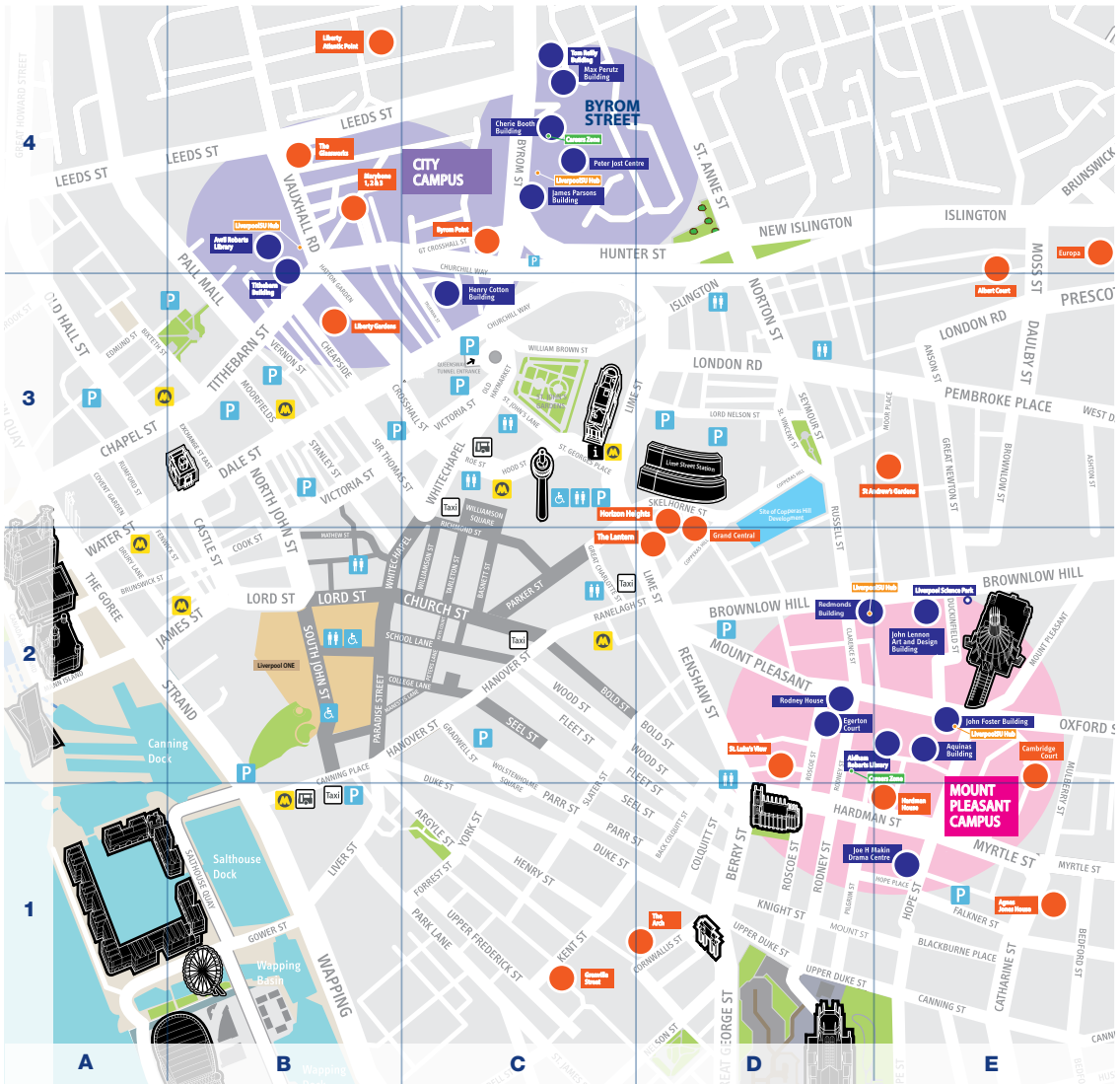

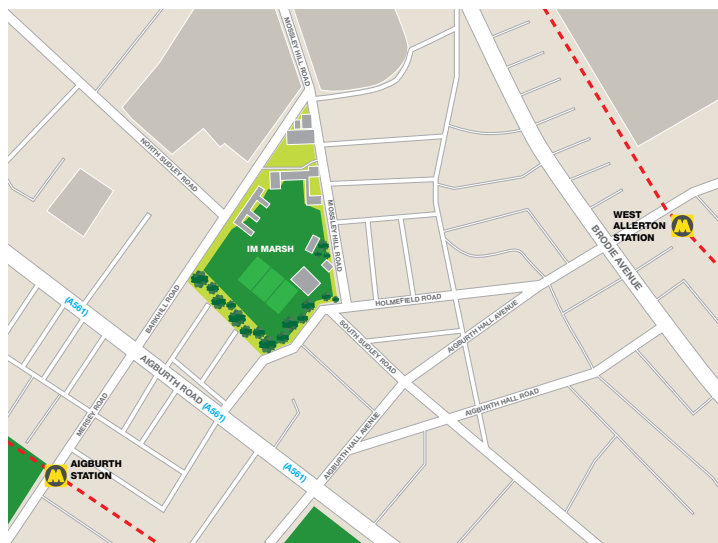

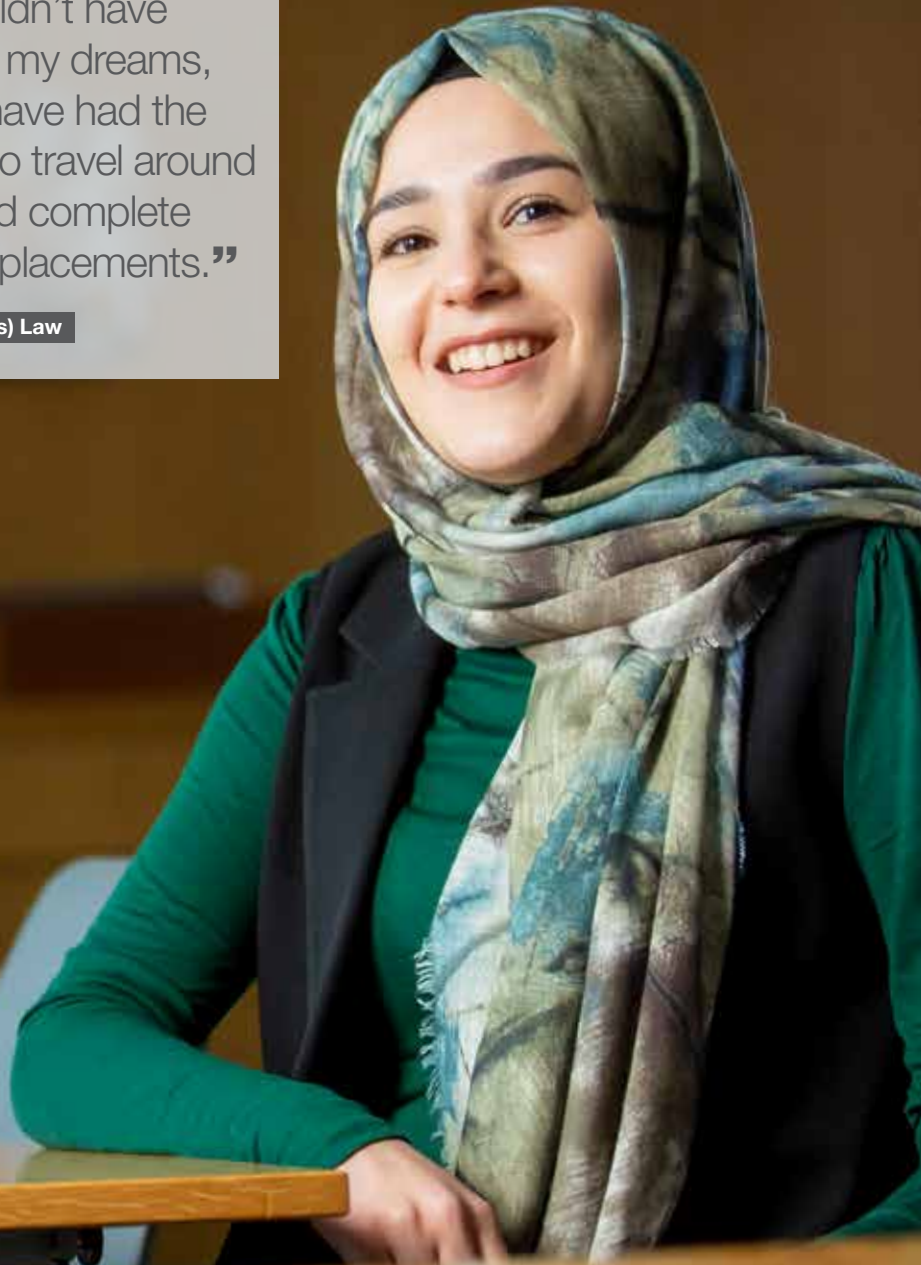
