
MA DESIGN

Pursue your passion for particular areas of design at an advanced level and with professional support. Contextualise your chosen areas within the broader field of design with theoretical elements. Join our graduates in exciting jobs throughout the design industry and around the world.

This course is built around your personal design interests and aspirations. It allows you to push the boundaries of creativity, within a framework of academic rigour and contextual research. You can choose to study any of the following areas: advertising, animation, calligraphy and lettering, creative computational design, design thinking, innovation and ideation, fashion design and promotion, graphic communication, graphic design, illustration, interactive media, motion graphics, typographic design. Other specialised disciplines will also be considered.

Our specialist tutors will work with you as you create a portfolio of creative designs that will excite and impress potential employers. By the end of the course, you will have completed a major project that has evolved from your practice and research. The project will be supported by a critical evaluation report.

Pursue your passion for fine art at an advanced level and with professional support. Push the boundaries of creativity, within a framework of academic rigour and contextual research. Tackle issues that face fine art professionals and boost your employability.

This course is built around your personal interests and aspirations and aims to stretch your creativity. We will encourage you to develop your personal practice through research, critiques, analysis and questioning.

At Masters level, the specialisms of tutors are an important factor. Sunderland's research expertise includes painting, printmaking, studio-based drawing and collage, sculpture, collaborative practice, art in architecture, video and digital art. MA GLASS AND CERAMICS

Duration: 1 Year Full-Time, 2 Years Part-Time Location: National Glass Centre, Sir Tom Cowie Campus

Develop a specialism in glass or ceramics using the outstanding facilities at National Glass Centre. Establish yourself as a professional artist.

This course is for individuals who wish to develop both their practice and critical understanding with regards to glass and ceramics. The subject is explored and contextualised in its widest sense through both practical and theoretical investigation and application. We do not have a 'house style', instead you will be encouraged and supported to develop your own focus, independent creativity, improve your technical skills through expert support, and develop academic skills in research and communication.

During the course we encourage you to gain industry experience which will enhance your skills, build up a valuable network of contacts and boost your employability. This experience can take the form of working on live commissions, entering competitions and exhibiting work in public exhibitions.





MA PHOTOGRAPHY

CID Code: CID179 Full-Time. CID380 Part-Time **Duration: 1 Year Full-Time, 2 Years Part-Time** Location: Northern Centre of Photography, City Campus

Develop your individual style and explore photography as a means of creative expression. Implement, research and extend vour practical and intellectual skills across the spectrum of photography, digital imaging and video. Create an impressive portfolio of work and explore different possibilities for public presentation of your work including online and gallery exhibition.

The course is tailored to your individual interests and allows you to develop a professional base for your future career. By the end of the course, you will have prepared a substantial portfolio of creative and written work and participated in a public exhibition.

You will study at the Northern Centre of Photography, an international hub for photographic practice and theory, where you will be supported by tutors who are all research active photographers, writers and curators.

You will have the opportunity to meet established practitioners and hear about their work and careers and you will be encouraged to join the North East Photography Network (NEPN). NEPN works with international photographic partners, artists and curators to provide fresh perspectives, lively debate and professional opportunities.

You will focus on financial control, financial statements and financial markets, cross cultural management, global corporate strategy, and training in leadership. Your Masters dissertation will focus on a topic that will be agreed between yourself and your tutor, based on your career aspirations.

MA Marketing is recognised by The Chartered Institute of Marketing (CIM) – the world's largest association of marketing professionals. You will become an Associate Member of the CIM during the course, with guest lectures linked to career development.

This degree course assumes no initial knowledge of marketing, and is therefore ideal for you if you want to convert from another subject area, or if you have some knowledge of marketing or relevant work experience and want to develop this further.

MSC DIGITAL MARKETING AND DATA ANALYTICS

CID Code: CID1287

Duration: 1 Year Full-Time

MSc Digital Marketing and Data Analytics introduces you to contemporary marketing theory and practice, emphasising digital marketing as central to marketing practice today. The course assumes no previous knowledge of marketing but does require knowledge of computer programming. You will have the opportunity to study digital marketing and data analytics theory and practice in-depth. The course draws on the latest marketing research to provide you with a highly-practical postgraduate degree. You will also have the option to study topics such as social media, data visualisation, consumer research, and global marketing.

This degree is ideal for computing or marketing graduates who wish to specialise in digital marketing or for professionals in other fields who want to further their careers as highly-qualified digital marketers.

PART-TIME AND DISTANCE LEARNING STUDY

Here at Sunderland we understand that studying a postgraduate course is a big step and combining your studies with family or work commitments is an impressive balancing act! That's why we offer a range of flexible learning opportunities to fit in with you and your life.

Many of our taught postgraduate courses are available on a part-time basis, allowing you to work towards your masters qualification whilst working full-time or managing family commitments. Usually, this means a fulltime course that would take one year to complete would take two years to complete if studied part-time. You would study alongside full-time students and receive the same level of teaching and use of the facilities meaning you get the full student experience, with all of the advantages of part-time study.

We're even flexible with our full-time courses; some are taught during the evening, so you can work during the day and study at night. This option is hard work, but may suit some students who wish to complete their course in a year. Our supportive tutors will ensure you can manage your workload and you can even choose to switch to part-time study later on, if you find this suits you better.

Alternatively, you may choose to join our online community and study a distance learning course. This option allows you to study anywhere in the world and while in employment. Our distance learning teaching methods include web-based reading materials (which are also printable), e-books, e-journals, multimedia and e-discussions. Our tutors are experienced in delivering distance learning provision, so you can always be sure that you are supported throughout your studies.

GRADUATE RESEARCH AND PHDS

Our research has been classified as 'worldleading' and 'internationally excellent' in ten academic areas by the latest Research Excellence Framework (REF). Research degrees are the highest level of degree awarded by UK universities. If you want to research an area of interest and make an original contribution to existing knowledge, then a research degree provides the ideal framework to pursue your aims.

All of our research degrees are designed to develop a deeper understanding through original investigation and to generate new knowledge, and each degree is unique, as it is built around your personal research on a topic of your choice. We offer the following:

- Master of Philosophy (MPhil). This research degree is well-regarded and is excellent preparation for a PhD.
- Doctor of Philosophy (PhD). A PhD is the 'ultimate' academic qualification for those committed to research and discovering new knowledge.
- Professional Doctorate (DProf) is a work based degree and is centred around major practice development. If you follow a business or education route you could be awarded the Doctorate of Business Administration (DBA) or Doctorate of Education (EdD). This degree includes an 18 month taught element.
- PhD by Existing Published or Creative Work. This route is open to academics whose articles have been published.
- Higher Doctorate Doctor of Science (DSc), Doctor of Letters (DLitt), Doctor of Technology (DTech) and Doctor of Law (LLD) are for people who are leading authorities in their field of study.



RESEARCH SUPPORT

You will work closely with a supervisory team consisting of a Director of Studies (lead supervisor) and at least one additional co-supervisor based at the University. Your supervisor will play a vital role in advising and supporting you. In addition, each faculty has a Research Student Manager (RSM) who is responsible for all matters relating to your needs. Your RSM will support you with everything from registration to graduation.

A postgraduate degree increases your earning power and enhances your career prospects, but we understand that postgraduate study can be expensive. We're here to support you as you make an investment in your future, and we offer generous fee discounts to make your postgraduate study all the more affordable.

HOW MUCH DOES MY COURSE COST?

Course tuition fees vary, depending on whether you are a home/EU or international student, and are tiered, based on the course you are studying. It also depends if you are studying a course full-time, part-time, or by distance learning. Home/EU fees can range from £6,000 up to £11,500 for full-time taught courses, while part-time courses are priced per 10 credits.

CAN I GET A STUDENT LOAN FOR POSTGRADUATE STUDY?

If you're starting a Masters or PhD course you may be entitled to a government-backed loan from the Student Loans Company. If you've lived in England or the EU for at least three years prior to starting your course, and are under 60 years of age, you could benefit from the postgraduate loan of up to £10,609. You know how the old saying goes - "There's no such thing as a silly question". Here at Sunderland we believe these questions are key, after all, what is important to you is important to us. To ease any concerns you might have about studying as a postgraduate student, here are a few commonly asked questions:

AM I TOO OLD? I BET I'M THE OLDEST PERSON ON MY COURSE!

I bet you're not! Education doesn't end at 21- we have students of all ages studying together and sharing experiences. In 2017, of the students who enrolled on a postgraduate course at the University of Sunderland, over a quarter were aged 30 or over. And did you know the oldest person to receive a masters degree was in their 90's? You're never too old to learn something new this is your moment!

I'VE BEEN OUT OF EDUCATION A LONG TIME. HOW WILL I COPE WITH MY WORKLOAD AND ASSIGNMENTS?

Plus, with our flexible learning opportunities, some courses will allow you to swap to another mode of study, if you find this suits you better.

CAN I STILL APPLY FOR STUDENT ACCOMMODATION, OR IS THIS JUST FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS?

I WANT A COMPLETE CAREER CHANGE. WHAT OPTIONS ARE THERE FOR ME?

You may be interested in studying a conversion course; this is a particular type of Masters degree that is designed for students whose first degree is in a completely unrelated area. It's perfect for people who want to change their career or pick up skills in a new area. The entry requirements can vary, but usually we require a 2:2 honours degree in any discipline unrelated to the conversion course. We also consider applicants with other backgrounds and experience. Examples of conversion courses we offer are MSc Computing, MSc Psychology, and most of our business postgraduate degrees.

I WOULD LOVE TO DO A PHD, BUT I DON'T HAVE A MASTERS DEGREE. WILL THIS HOLD ME BACK?

You don't actually need a Masters degree to do a PhD. It is possible to progress straight from a bachelor honours degree (or equivalent qualification). We will also consider candidates with other qualifications, looking at evidence of academic ability, such as published work.
